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[Adaptive Sports Programs for Disabled Veterans and Disabled Members of the Armed Forces](#)

Purpose: To plan, develop, manage, and implement programs to provide adaptive sports, training, and other opportunities for veterans and members of the armed forces with disabilities.

Eligibility: State, county, city, township or special district governments; nonprofits with or without 501(c)(3) status with the IRS (other than institutions of higher education); small businesses; for profit organizations other than small businesses; public, state-controlled and private institutions of higher education; individuals; and Native American tribal governments and organizations.

Funding: \$16 million; awards up to \$750,000.

[Competitive Funding Opportunity: All Stations Accessibility Program](#)

Purpose: To support capital and planning projects to upgrade the accessibility of legacy, rail-fixed guideway public transportation systems for people with disabilities.

Eligibility: State, county, city, or township governments.

Funding: \$686 million; award amounts unlisted.

[Educational Opportunity Centers Program \(EOC\)](#)

Purpose: To provide information regarding financial and academic assistance available for qualified individuals who want to enter or continue to pursue a program of postsecondary education; provide assistance to those individuals in applying for admission to institutions that offer programs of postsecondary education, and improve the financial and economic literacy of program participants.

Eligibility: State governments; nonprofits with 501(c)(3) status with the IRS (other than institutions of higher education); independent school districts; public, state-controlled and private institutions of higher education; and Native American tribal governments and organizations.

Funding: \$52,611,659; awards between \$238,000 and \$3 million.

[Grants for Transportation in Highly Rural Areas](#)

Purpose: To help veterans in highly rural areas travel to VA or VA-authorized healthcare facilities, and to provide transportation programs in counties with fewer than seven people per square mile.

Eligibility: VA accredited veterans service organizations and state veterans service agencies.

Funding: \$7 million; awards up to \$50,000.

[NIJ FY25 Research and Evaluation on Violence Against Women](#)

Purpose: To invest in high-quality evaluations focused on testing programs, practices, models, or interventions aimed at (1) enhancing engagement with the justice system for women and girls who have been victimized and (2) improving accountability within the criminal justice system from individuals who engage in or perpetrate violence against women and girls.

Eligibility: State, county, city, township or special district governments; nonprofits with or without 501(c)(3) status with the IRS (other than institutions of higher education); small businesses; for profit organizations other than small businesses; public, state-controlled and private institutions of higher education; and Native American tribal governments and organizations.

Funding: Total unlisted; awards up to \$3.7 million.

[Research on the Abuse, Neglect, and Financial Exploitation of Older Adults](#)

Purpose: To fund research in five topical areas: (1) evaluation of programs that seek to prevent, intervene in, or respond to the abuse, neglect, and financial exploitation of older adults; (2) financial fraud against older adults, including knowledge building around scam prevention messaging; (3) caregivers who abuse (either financially, physically, sexually, and/or emotionally) or neglect older adults, to inform intervention and prevention program development; (4) the development of radiographic evidence and bioinformatic approaches relevant to the physical abuse of older adults; and (5) the role of emerging technologies in fraud and exploitation.

Eligibility: State, county, city, township or special district governments; nonprofits with or without 501(c)(3) status with the IRS (other than institutions of higher education); small businesses; for profit organizations other than small businesses; public, state-controlled and private institutions of higher education; independent school districts; and Native American tribal governments and organizations.

Funding: Total unlisted; awards up to \$1.6 million.

[Second Chance Act Family-Based Substance Use Disorder Treatment Program](#)

Purpose: To deliver treatment and recovery support services for parents with substance use disorders (SUD), who have minor children or are pregnant, and are under correctional control in facility or community-based setting.

Eligibility: State, county, city, township or special district governments; nonprofits with or without 501(c)(3) status with the IRS (other than institutions of higher education); and federally recognized Native American tribal governments and organizations.

Funding: Total unlisted; awards up to \$1 million.

[Upholding the Rule of Law and Preventing Wrongful Convictions Program](#)

Purpose: To strengthen the capacity of conviction review entities and their criminal justice and victims' services partners to more effectively and efficiently identify, assess, and manage post-conviction claims of innocence.

Eligibility: State, county, city, township or special district governments; nonprofits with or without 501(c)(3) status with the IRS (other than institutions of higher education); private institutions of higher education; and federally recognized Native American tribal governments and organizations.

Funding: Total unlisted; awards up to \$600,000.
