HOUSE RESOLUTIONS

The following resolutions were offered and placed in the Committee on Rules.

HOUSE RESOLUTION 670

Offered by Representative Greenwood:

WHEREAS, Many public and private colleges and universities across the country have frozen or lowered tuition and fees in recent academic years in order to attract and retain students in the middle of a historic health crisis; and

WHEREAS, Tuition freezing has been important in light of the adverse impacts the coronavirus has had on students and their families; and

WHEREAS, During the pandemic, students have faced a host of devastating setbacks, including losing jobs that help them pay for school, dealing with feelings of isolation and loneliness, and experiencing the loss of family and friends to COVID-19; and

WHEREAS, Despite many major U.S. colleges and universities freezing tuition, the average tuition price has nonetheless increased across public and private, two-year and four-year institutions, as detailed in the College Board's Trends in College Pricing and Student Aid 2021 report; the nonprofit's annual report pulls from the latest available data on tuition and fees, net college costs, student federal aid, education borrowing and student loan debt, state and federal higher education funding, and more; and

WHEREAS, For the 2021-2022 school year, the average published tuition and fees for full-time undergraduate students for public four-year in-state was \$10,740, an increase of \$170 from 2020-2021 or 1.6% before adjusting for inflation; for public four-year out-of-state, it was \$27,560, an increase of \$410 or 1.5% before adjusting for inflation; for public two-year in-district, it was \$3,800, an increase of \$50 or 1.3% before adjusting for inflation; for private nonprofit four-year, it was \$38,070, an increase of \$800 or 2.1% before adjusting for inflation; and

WHEREAS, Increasing tuition costs as students grapple with the repercussions of a global pandemic may make higher education financially unfeasible for many; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE ONE HUNDRED SECOND GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we urge all public and private colleges and universities in Illinois to freeze tuition costs during the entire length of the COVID-19 pandemic; and be it further

RESOLVED, That suitable copies of this resolution be delivered to Governor JB Pritzker, House Speaker Emanuel "Chris" Welch, Senate President Don Harmon, and Chair John Atkinson of the Illinois Board of Higher Education.

HOUSE RESOLUTION 671

Offered by Representative Evans:

WHEREAS, A total of 37 states, four U.S. territories, and the District of Columbia have allowed for the medical use of cannabis products; 27 states and the District of Columbia have decriminalized small

amounts of marijuana; 18 states, two U.S. territories, and the District of Columbia have enacted legislation to regulate cannabis for nonmedical, adult use; and

WHEREAS, In the enactment of legislation allowing for the use of cannabis for medicinal or recreational purposes, states have provided for the regulation and taxation of the use of cannabis; and

WHEREAS, Cannabis remains a Schedule I drug under the federal Controlled Substances Act, classifying it among the most dangerous drugs in the Act; and

WHEREAS, Alcohol and tobacco remain outside the purview of the federal Controlled Substances Act and have significant negative impacts on individual and public health, including physical injuries, psychological and social harm, and the onset of chronic, often fatal illnesses related to regular use; and

WHEREAS, Continued scheduling of cannabis under the federal Controlled Substances Act hinders the ability of medical cannabis dispensaries and other cannabis-related businesses to operate without the prospect of federal seizures, forfeitures, arrests, and other enforcement and prosecutorial actions; and

WHEREAS, Such hindrance creates a problem for medical cannabis dispensaries and cannabis-related businesses that are operating legally pursuant to state law and presents difficulties for consumers or businesses that are authorized to grow, sell, or purchase cannabis products under state law; and

WHEREAS, Many financial institutions have been unable to do business with cannabis-related businesses because of existing federal law and policies; and

WHEREAS, Many cannabis-related businesses rely upon cash transactions, which increases the risk of various crimes and prohibits the collection of taxes by individual states and territories; and

WHEREAS, In the interest of promoting efficient business practices, financial institutions should be confident in serving businesses operating legally under state law so long as safety and soundness requirements are met; and

WHEREAS, Legislation has been introduced in Congress to provide for specific regulatory protection and immunity from federal prosecution for depository institutions providing financial services to cannabis-related businesses acting under applicable state law; and

WHEREAS, Maintaining business relationships with financial institutions will allow for greater access to loans and debit and credit transactions for businesses serving the cannabis industry, for their employees, and for consumers purchasing cannabis legally under state law; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE ONE HUNDRED SECOND GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we urge the United States Congress to enact legislation removing cannabis from the federal Controlled Substances Act (CSA), exempting certain activities related to marijuana, facilitating the full spectrum of private banking services for cannabis-related business, and encouraging scientific research as related to cannabis products in the United States; and be it further

RESOLVED, That suitable copies of this resolution be delivered to the Cannabis Business Association of Illinois, Doctors For Cannabis Regulation, the Drug Policy Alliance, the National Cannabis Industry Association, and the Minority Cannabis Business Association.

HOUSE RESOLUTION 672

Offered by Representative Harper:

WHEREAS, Gentrification affects predominantly Black and Latino communities across the State of Illinois; and

WHEREAS, Gentrification involves the physical redevelopment of communities through investments in new housing, infrastructure, and businesses that lead to higher property values, rents, and property taxes, often replacing longstanding households and community institutions; and

WHEREAS, Gentrification also often involves cultural displacement, in which the norms and values of longtime, predominantly Black and Latino and working class residents are replaced by those of a newly-dominant, often whiter, and more middle class group of residents; and

WHEREAS, Gentrification has been exacerbated by the COVID-19 pandemic, with major losses of income and an estimated 320,000 Illinoisans facing eviction filings in January 2021; and

WHEREAS, Gentrification is driven by structural racism in the U.S. housing system, including race-based zoning, redlining, deed restrictions, contract selling, predatory lending, and other practices,

which has blocked Black home ownership and created stark and persistent inequalities in wealth and financial well-being between Black and white households in the State of Illinois; and

WHEREAS, Structural racism in the housing system reinforces wealth inequality between white and non-white households; the typical white family owns about \$184,000 in family wealth versus just \$38,000 for Latino families and \$23,000 for Black families; and

WHEREAS, This divide translates to massive differences in quality of life; owning a home or business in a neighborhood in which property values are appreciating is one of the primary ways of accumulating wealth in the United States, leaving Black and Latino families more reliant on home equity, reverse mortgages, and other sources to finance retirement than white families; and

WHEREAS, The racial wealth gap restricts the progress of this country and is estimated to cost as much as \$1.5 trillion in lost economic growth over the next decade; and

WHEREAS, The Illinois Legislative Black Caucus has called for legislation addressing housing, banking, and capital investment to eliminate barriers to economic opportunity in Black communities in its Economic Access, Equity and Opportunity Pillar; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE ONE HUNDRED SECOND GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we believe that investments in business, home ownership, and community development in Black and Latino communities are essential for creating shared prosperity in our communities; and be it further

RESOLVED, That we recognize the importance of property values that come from new development and investment as a source of wealth for native populations; and be it further

RESOLVED, That we commit to combating gentrification and displacement, to protect native populations as their communities change, and to support efforts to close the racial wealth gap in the State of Illinois; and be it further

RESOLVED, That we commit to studying the effects of gentrification and displacement in the State as well as studying solutions that will protect native populations and allow them to participate in the rebuilding of their communities, including but not limited to:

(1) Increasing investments in home repair for longtime Black and Latino residents, particularly for seniors in the community on fixed incomes, through the Illinois Housing Development Authority's Single Family Rehabilitation Program; and

(2) Increasing opportunities for home ownership for Black and Latino residents through Illinois Housing Development Authority mortgages and down payment assistance as well as financial institutions regulated under the Illinois Community Reinvestment Act; and

(3) Expanding use of the Long Time Occupancy Homestead Property Tax Exemption, the Senior Citizen Assessment Freeze Homestead Exemption, the Homestead Improvement Exemption, and the Senior Citizen Tax Deferment in predominantly Black and Latino neighborhoods; and

(4) Allowing communities to limit predatory rent increases for Black and Latino renters in gentrifying neighborhoods by repealing the Rent Control Preemption Act.
