HOUSE RESOLUTION 763

Offered by Representative Mason:

WHEREAS, The Stranded Act of 2021, currently in the United States Senate, provides resources to communities that are challenged by stranded nuclear waste; and

WHEREAS, This act would require the Department of Energy (DOE) to establish competitive prize competitions for affected communities to carry out alternatives to nuclear facilities, generating sites, and waste sites; and

WHEREAS, The DOE must also establish the Stranded Nuclear Waste Task Force to study existing public and private resources and funding for affected communities and establish a grant program to assist localities near nuclear power plants to offset the impacts of stranded nuclear waste in affected communities; and

WHEREAS, The passage of this act would impact communities in Illinois that are dealing with the health and environmental risks caused by stranded nuclear material and would provide relief and compensation to communities such as Zion that are struggling to handle the stranded nuclear waste; and

WHEREAS, Highly radioactive waste, often called high-level waste, comes mainly in two forms, leftover fuels that were used in nuclear power plants to generate electricity and the waste made by facilities involved in nuclear weapons production or by facilities that reprocess and recycle used power plant fuel; and

WHEREAS, While these waste materials, which can be harmful to human health and the environment, wait for a more permanent home, their containers age; in some cases, the aging containers have already begun leaking their toxic contents; all of these wastes can remain dangerously radioactive for many thousands of years; for that reason, they must be disposed of permanently; and

WHEREAS, Approximately a dozen countries, including Finland, Switzerland, and other European nations, are planning deep geological repositories for their nuclear waste; in the U.S., government officials have proposed storing the country's waste in a repository beneath Yucca Mountain in Nevada; and

WHEREAS, The products of nuclear fission have long half lives, which means that they will continue to be radioactive and therefore hazardous for many thousands of years; and

WHEREAS, Many different storage methods have been discussed throughout history, with very few being implemented because of the problematic nature of storing such hazardous material that will remain radioactive for thousands of years; and

WHEREAS, Nuclear waste can have drastic effects on life, causing cancerous growths, for instance, or causing genetic problems for many generations of animal and plants; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE ONE HUNDRED SECOND GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we urge the passage of the Stranded Act of 2021, currently in the United States Senate, which provides resources to communities that are challenged by stranded nuclear waste; and be it further

RESOLVED, That suitable copies of this resolution be delivered to the President of the United States, the U.S. Senate Majority Leader, the U.S. Senate Minority Leader, the U.S. Speaker of the House, the U.S.

House of Representatives Minority Leader, and all members of the Illinois Congressional Delegation.

HOUSE RESOLUTION 771

Offered by Representative Didech:

WHEREAS, The members of the Illinois House of Representatives wish to congratulate OMNI Youth Services on the occasion of its 50th anniversary; and

WHEREAS, OMNI Youth Services was founded on June 29, 1972 by a concerned group of community members determined to provide a 24-hour hotline for Wheeling youth in mental health crisis; and

WHEREAS, To meet the needs of the Wheeling community and surrounding area, OMNI Youth Services rapidly expanded its mission to providing affordable and accessible mental health services and counseling to children and youth in need in the Northwest Chicago suburbs; and

WHEREAS, The dedication of the OMNI Youth Services team and partnerships with individuals, businesses, and community organizations have allowed OMNI Youth Services to continue to grow and serve its communities; and

WHEREAS, OMNI Youth Services has impacted the lives of over 750,000 Illinois residents during its 50 years of service and has served in over 85 different Illinois communities, working independently and at times in partnership with organizations such as DCFS, local municipalities, police departments, and juvenile justice systems; and

WHEREAS, America is in a youth mental health crisis so extensive and pervasive that the U.S. Surgeon General released an Advisory on the Status of Youth Mental Health to help educate and draw attention to the immense need America's youth have for mental health services; and

WHEREAS, The State of Illinois supports all residents and youth who are in need of mental health services and wants them to receive these services in an safe and accessible way, whether to treat a mental illness, keep a family intact, or start on the road of substance use recovery; and

WHEREAS, OMNI Youth Services has provided necessary and effective mental health services for 50 years and continues to do so; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE ONE HUNDRED SECOND GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we declare June 29, 2022 as "OMNI YOUTH SERVICES DAY" in the State of Illinois; and be it further

RESOLVED, That we congratulate OMNI Youth Services on its 50th anniversary; and be it further

RESOLVED, That a suitable copy of this resolution be presented to OMNI Youth Services as a symbol of our respect and esteem.

HOUSE RESOLUTION 773

Offered by Representative Moeller:

WHEREAS, The City of Elgin joins Bartlett, Bensenville, Hanover Park, Itasca, Roselle, Wood Dale, and DuPage County as a member of the "Coalition to Stop CPKC" to oppose the merger between the Canadian Pacific and Kansas City Southern freight railroads; and

WHEREAS, The Coalition to Stop CPKC has filed its objections to the merger with federal regulators; and

WHEREAS, The merger would almost triple the number of freight trains while also increasing the lengths of those trains on the Metra Milwaukee West Line running from Elgin to Chicago; these more frequent and longer trains would mean longer crossing delays for commuters, school buses, and emergency responders, in addition to more noise; and

WHEREAS, In order to mitigate these issues, local units of government would be responsible for levying billions of dollars in new taxes for infrastructure improvements; and

WHEREAS, The impacts of a merger to the area would not only hurt residential and commercial property owners by negatively affecting economic development and stability but would also have significant environmental and public safety implications; and

WHEREAS, The Fox River is the primary source of drinking water for 350,000 people, and with railroad tracks located less than 100 feet from the Fox River in several places, a train derailment has the potential to be a public safety and ecological disaster, especially if a train is filled with crude oil; an explosion of such could threaten the lives of those within half a mile; and

WHEREAS, A merger would create a Class I (one) railroad that would span from the tar sands in Canada to the Gulfport refineries in Mexico, which could place cities such as Elgin in the middle of tragedies like Lac-Mégantic in Quebec, Canada in 2013, which saw a rail disaster that killed 47 people; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE ONE HUNDRED SECOND GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we declare our support for the City of Elgin and the Coalition to Stop CPKC in their opposition to the merger of the Canadian Pacific and Kansas City Southern railroads; and be it further

RESOLVED, That we urge the Federal Surface Transportation Board to reject the CPKC merger application; and be it further

RESOLVED, That suitable copies of this resolution be delivered to the Governor, all members of the Illinois Congressional Delegation, the members of the Federal Surface Transportation Board, the Director of IDOT, the Director of Metra, the Director of the Regional Transit Authority, the mayors of Bartlett, Bensenville, Elgin, Hanover Park, Itasca, Roselle, and Wood Dale, and the members of the DuPage County Board in order to bring further awareness of the negative impacts that hundreds of thousands of Illinois residents will face should this merger be approved.
