Offered by Representative Ford:

WHEREAS, A trade school, also known as a technical school or vocational school, is a postsecondary educational institution designed to train students for a specific job in a skilled trade career; a trade school offers high quality industry-focused training to prepare students for actual work in their chosen field; trade school programs are entirely concentrated on relevant job training and developing students' technical abilities in skilled and mechanical trades; and

WHEREAS, For someone looking to enter the skilled mechanical trades, a technical school offers the practical training needed for a specific career; this means that every lesson and assignment prepares students to meet the basic qualifications for an entry-level job; and

WHEREAS, Approximately 412,000 students are enrolled currently in trade and career schools across the State of Illinois; and

WHEREAS, Programs that focus on trade support local communities, foster innovation, and drive economic growth by matching employability skills with workforce demand; and

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE ONE HUNDRED SECOND GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that the Task Force on Illinois Trade Schools is created and charged with studying the following:

- (1) The benefits of expanding trade schools throughout Illinois;
- (2) High school districts in Illinois and their level of trade curriculum/courses; and
- (3) The level of interest among students in Illinois high schools on attending a trade school or beginning work and not attending a four-year college or university; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Task Force will be comprised of the following members, who shall serve without compensation:

- (1) 4 members of the House of Representatives appointed by the Speaker of the House, one who shall serve as co-chair;
- (2) 4 members of the House of Representatives appointed by the House Minority Leader, one who shall serve as co-chair;
- (3) The Executive Director of the Illinois Community College Board (ICCB) or his or her designee;
 - (4) The State Superintendent of Education (ISBE) or his or her designee;
- (5) The Executive Director of the Illinois Board of Higher Education (IBHE) or his or her designee;
- (6) 2 members of the Illinois Association for Career and Technical Education, one each appointed by the Speaker of the House and the House Minority Leader;
- (7) 4 members from associations that represent industry trades, two each appointed by the Speaker of the House and the House Minority Leader;
- (8) 2 high school students who are planning on attending trade schools after graduation, one each appointed by the Speaker of the House and the House Minority Leader; and
- (9) 2 students who are currently enrolled in a trade school, one each appointed by the Speaker of the House and the House Minority Leader; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Illinois Board of Higher Education shall provide administrative support for the Task Force; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Task Force shall hold its meetings at the call of the co-chairs; and be it further RESOLVED, That the Task Force shall submit its final report to the General Assembly no later than December 31, 2022 and upon the filing of the report, is dissolved.

HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION 90

Offered by Representative Ammons:

WHEREAS, The State of Illinois is a state rich in culture and ethnic diversity and is home to people of every national origin, including a significant number of Ghanaians; and

WHEREAS, The City of Accra is a prominent African city, rich in tradition, the homeland of many Illinois residents, the capital of Ghana, and the first African nation to gain independence from colonial rule; and

WHEREAS, The City of Accra hosted the All African Peoples Conference in 1958, which proclaimed that colonialism, racism, and imperialism must cease and Africa should be free; it also hosted the 1964 Organization of African Unity Conference, which debated the necessity of a Continental Union Government for the whole continent of Africa; and

WHEREAS, The City of Chicago and the City of Acera were officially acknowledged by the Chicago City Council as Sister Cities on June 28, 1989; and

WHEREAS, It is fitting that the rich relationship between the City of Chicago and the City of Accra be expanded to the entire State of Illinois in order to enhance the exchange of ideas and promote further goodwill, harmony, commerce, and mutual development; and

WHEREAS, In order to further explore the mutual benefits to the State of Illinois, the Illinois General Assembly and members of the Illinois Legislative Black Caucus seek to engage with the City of Accra, Ghana for the reciprocal benefit of strengthening relations and exchanges involving the identification of opportunities for economic development, education policy, judicial policy, environmental policy, and the improvement of health and human services for African Americans and African citizens in the country of Ghana; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE ONE HUNDRED SECOND GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, THE SENATE CONCURRING HEREIN, that we seek to initiate a delegation from among the members of the Illinois General Assembly and of the Illinois Legislative Black Caucus to visit the City of Accra, Ghana for the purpose of acknowledging and expanding the mutually beneficial relationship between the State of Illinois and Ghana; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the purpose of this delegation would be to exchange knowledge, expertise, and good relations with the City of Accra's Social Welfare & Community Development Department, Metro Public Health Department, Department of Education, Legal Department, Food & Agriculture Department, Urban Roads Department, and Waste Management Department; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the State of Illinois and the City of Accra, on the basis of friendly cooperation, equality, and mutual benefit, are encouraged to promote and broaden economic cooperation and trade relations between the two bodies and carry out exchanges in fields such as science and technology, culture and education, sports and health, and others to promote their prosperity and contribute towards further developing friendly relations between the people of the two countries; and be it further

RESOLVED, That we hereby declare, on behalf of the citizens of Illinois, our esteem and friendship to the City of Accra, Ghana and its citizens and express a request for an invitation from the parliament of Ghana for an official visit, December 10-20, 2022; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the State of Illinois promises its continued goodwill and cooperation with Accra; and be it further

RESOLVED, That a suitable copy of this resolution be delivered to the Honorable Elizabeth Sackey, Mayor of Accra, Ghana, for presentation to the governing body of Accra as a token of our esteem and a request for a official invitation from the parliament of Ghana for a visit from a delegation of members from the Illinois General Assembly and from the Illinois Legislative Black Caucus.

HOUSE RESOLUTION 806

Offered by Representative Collins:

WHEREAS, Prescription drugs are an essential part of good health care and a critical component of our health care system; and

WHEREAS, For people with Type 1 diabetes, near-constant self-management of glucose levels is essential to prevent life-threatening complications, but from 2012 to 2016, the average price of insulin increased from 13 cents per unit to 25 cents per unit; and

WHEREAS, The U.S. House of Representatives recently passed legislation that would cap the monthly cost of insulin at \$35 for the millions of diabetic Americans who rely on the drug; this legislation has now been sent to the U.S. Senate; and

WHEREAS, The majority of the Illinois' Congressional Delegation stood behind capping insulin costs, but Representatives Rodney Davis, Adam Kinzinger, Mary Miller, and Darin LaHood shamefully put pharmaceutical companies' profits ahead of patient care and voted to block the measure; and

WHEREAS, More steps can be taken to reduce prescription drug costs and put patient health ahead of pharmaceutical giants' profits, including reforming the broken patent system that allows pharmaceutical companies to avoid competition and keep prices high; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE ONE HUNDRED SECOND GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we again strongly declare our commitment to ensuring access to affordable prescription drugs for all Illinois residents, regardless of income, race, or location; and be it further

RESOLVED, That we urge the U.S. Senate to follow the U.S. House of Representatives and pass the \$35 insulin cap and further urge President Biden to sign this crucial legislation into law; and be it further

RESOLVED, That we condemn the actions of Representatives Rodney Davis, Adam Kinzinger, Mary Miller, and Darin LaHood in voting for unaffordable insulin; and be it further

RESOLVED, That we direct the Department of Healthcare and Family Services to study what steps can most effectively reduce the cost of prescription drugs in Illinois and report their findings to the General Assembly; and be it further

RESOLVED, That suitable copies of this resolution be delivered to the Governor, all Illinois constitutional officers, and all members of the Illinois Congressional Delegation in order to bring further awareness to the importance of access to affordable medication, including life-saving drugs like insulin.

HOUSE RESOLUTION 807

Offered by Representative Kelly:

WHEREAS, The State of Illinois is committed to ensuring its residents have affordable and accessible health care, regardless of their income, ethnicity, or zip code; and

WHEREAS, We have continued to take important steps in this State to reaffirm our commitment to ensuring access to quality health care for patients and healthcare consumers in Illinois, despite attempts from Republican members to undermine these efforts; and

WHEREAS, In 2021, the Illinois Legislative Black Caucus presented and passed the Health Equity Pillar, which included important provisions like implicit bias and racial training, expansion of sick leave, increased access to primary care physicians and federal qualified health centers, and state health assessment and improvement plan additions; and

WHEREAS, Medicaid funding was expanded under the Health Equity Pillar and other key legislation to include the coverage of, among other things, home-visiting and doulas, community health workers, hospital psychiatric services, veteran support specialists, noncitizen post-kidney transplant services, certified community behavioral health clinics, overdose patient observation treatment, and undocumented health coverage; and

WHEREAS, Under the leadership of Leader Greg Harris, Illinois recently passed HB 1745 and, by doing so, became the first state to pass legislation to ensure patients have the ability to plan and predict their prescription drug costs; and

WHEREAS, Under the leadership of Leader Mary Flowers, Illinois is leading the way for biomarker testing by becoming the first state in the country to pass biomarker testing coverage in HB 1779; the passage of HB 1779 ensures that over three million Illinoisans have access to comprehensive biomarker testing through Medicaid and state regulated insurance; and

WHEREAS, When former Governor Bruce Rauner slashed funding for lifesaving breast cancer screenings, senior care, HIV/AIDS services, and more, Democrats and a small number of independent-minded Republicans stood up to Rauner's extreme cuts and passed a budget over Rauner's veto; Illinois has continued to rebuild its critical infrastructure after the damage Rauner caused by passing a comprehensive budget, including \$24 million to the Illinois Breast and Cervical Cancer Program, \$138 million for HIV/AIDS services and prevention, \$30 million to maternal and child health programs, and over \$980 million to the Community Care Program, which, among other things, includes services to keep seniors in their homes instead of in a long-term care setting; and

WHEREAS, In order to improve the health outcomes of residents in the State of Illinois, we continue to recognize that it is essential to dramatically reform the State's health and human service system and remain committed to introducing more measures to support this transformation; and

WHEREAS, While partisan idealogues across the country tried to block the implementation of the Affordable Care Act and the federal expansion of Medicaid, Illinois acted decisively in expanding access to care; and

WHEREAS, While former President Donald Trump disgracefully tried to strip health care access from millions, Illinois moved in a fundamentally better direction by implementing state-level protections for care for individuals with pre-existing conditions, regardless of what extremists in Washington do; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE ONE HUNDRED SECOND GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we once again strongly declare our commitment to ensuring access to quality health care for Illinois residents; and be it further

RESOLVED, That we urge the Illinois Congressional Delegation to support federal legislation building on the Affordable Care Act to ensure all people have access to health care, regardless of income, race, or location; and be it further

RESOLVED, That we oppose extreme efforts to strip away health care from people with pre-existing conditions, dismantle regulation, and allow big insurance companies to pad their profits at the expense of patients; and be it further

RESOLVED, That suitable copies of this resolution be delivered to the Governor, all Illinois constitutional officers, and all members of the Illinois Congressional Delegation in order to bring further awareness to the importance of access to affordable quality health care in the State of Illinois and to be a model state for the rest of the country.
