WHEREAS, Effective school board membership requires activities which may occur during business hours throughout the year; many employers in the State of Illinois support their employees who serve as school board members by allowing them the time to participate in those activities; and

WHEREAS, Employers are supportive of their employees who serve as school board members, generously lending support and time; employers give their employees the opportunity to better serve the needs of the school districts and citizens they represent through sometimes tremendous sacrifice to the

employer; and

WHEREAS, The decisions made by school board members directly impact the quality of life in their communities, placing them at the front line of American democracy; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-FIFTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we proclaim November 15 in 2007, and November 15 of each year thereafter, as School Board Members Day in the State of Illinois, as a way to honor those citizens who devote so much of their time and energy for the education of our children.

Sec. 1. This Act shall be known <u>and</u> and may be cited as the Illinois Health Facilities Planning Act. (Source: P.A. 78-1156.)".
