On June 5, 2007, the House concurred in Senate Amendments 1,2 and 3 to House Bill 822 (roll call sequence 11) with the understanding that these amendments had been approved for consideration by the House Agriculture Committee. It was later determined, however, that the Rules Committee had referred the Motions to Concur in Senate Amendments 1, 2, and 3 to the Agriculture Committee, but the Agriculture Committee had not yet acted on those motions. As a result, the Senate Amendments were out of order pursuant to House Rule 18(e) and not eligible for consideration by the full House.

### HOUSE RESOLUTIONS

The following resolutions were offered and placed in the Committee on Rules.

### **HOUSE RESOLUTION 507**

Offered by Representative Pihos:

WHEREAS, As of May 31, 2007, the General Assembly and the Governor have not reached a consensus on the State of Illinois Fiscal Year 2008 State budget; and

WHEREAS, After May 31, the General Assembly will be deemed in overtime session, which requires a three-fifths vote of the members in each chamber to pass legislation that includes an effective date before June 1 of the next calendar year; and

WHEREAS, Reaching a consensus on a State budget and any remaining substantive issues requires the legislative leaders and the Governor to be consistently present in Springfield to negotiate on the budget and remaining associated issues; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-FIFTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that the Governor reside in Springfield ready to negotiate during the General Assembly's scheduled overtime session and any special session days filed pursuant to gubernatorial proclamation.

### **HOUSE RESOLUTION 509**

Offered by Representative Yarbrough:

WHEREAS, A large proportion of diseases and disorders are preventable; modified health risk factors are precursors to a large number of diseases and disorders and to premature death; and

WHEREAS, Modifiable health risks can be improved through health promotion and disease prevention programs; and

WHEREAS, Health promotion and disease prevention programs can save the State money in health care expenditures and produce a positive return on investment; and

WHEREAS, According to a 2004 study, tobacco was the leading cause of actual death in the United States; tobacco use was responsible for 435,000 deaths, which was over 18% of total deaths in the United States; and

WHEREAS, An analysis of 22 peer-reviewed studies showed that for every dollar invested in health promotion, there was an average savings of \$5.81; there was also an average reduction of health care costs of 26%; and

WHEREAS, Based on 2001 data, if Illinois reduced smoking in the Medicaid population by 10%, the savings would be 16 million dollars; a 25% reduction would result in a savings of 40 million; a 50% reduction would save Medicaid 81 million dollars; and

WHEREAS, Creating incentives for Medicaid recipients to quit smoking will save money for the State and improve the quality of life of former smokers; the State does not have to create the program from scratch, but can enter into an agreement with experts in the health and wellness field to maximize immediate savings; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-FIFTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we urge the Department of Healthcare and Family Services to create a pilot incentive-based smoking cessation program for Medicaid recipients; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the program shall be operational 6 months after the date of adoption of this resolution; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Department may enter into an agreement with a third party to create or run the program.

### HOUSE RESOLUTION 511

Offered by Representative Coulson:

WHEREAS, Patients are at greater risk of injury, including skin tears, falls, and musculoskeletal injuries, while being lifted, transferred, or repositioned manually; and

WHEREAS, Safe patient handling can reduce skin tears suffered by patients by threefold and can significantly reduce other injuries to patients as well; and

WHEREAS, Health care workers are reported to lead the nation in work-related musculoskeletal disorders; and

WHEREAS, Between 38% and 50% of nurses and other health care workers will suffer a work-related back injury during their career; 42% of these workers will be unable to return to work in their pre-injury job; and

WHEREAS, The use of proper body mechanics by health care workers does not eliminate the risk of injury; and

WHEREAS, Assistive patient handling equipment and devices have essentially rendered the act of strict manual patient handling unnecessary as a function of nursing care; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-FIFTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that the Illinois House of Representatives shall convene an interagency Safe Patient Handling Task Force; this Task Force shall study safe patient handling policies and create recommended policy guidelines for all health care facilities to eliminate the manual lifting of patients by direct-care registered nurses and other health care providers through the use of mechanical devices, except in life-threatening situations or in an emergency; the recommended policy guidelines shall provide protection for registered nurses and health care providers for refusal of assignment and a whistleblower provision; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Safe Patient Task Force shall include the following members or their designees: the Director of Public Health, the Director of Aging, the Director of Healthcare and Family Services, the Secretary of Human Services, and the Secretary of Financial and Professional Regulation; that the Task Force shall also include, but is not limited to, the following members appointed by the Director of Public Health: one member of a statewide organization representing registered professional nurses, one direct care nurse currently practicing in a long-term care setting, one physician licensed to practice medicine in all its branches, one physical therapist, one member of a statewide organization representing hospitals, and one member of a statewide organization representing long-term care facilities; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Department of Public Health shall be the lead agency on the Task Force and that the citizen members of the Task Force may be reimbursed for actual travel expenses; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Safe Patient Handling Task Force shall submit a report to the General Assembly detailing its recommendations and findings by January 1, 2008.

AMENDMENT NO. 3. Amend Senate Bill 526, AS AMENDED, by deleting Section 99.

The foregoing motion prevailed and the amendment was adopted and ordered reproduced.

There being no further amendments, the foregoing Amendment No. 3 was adopted and the bill, as amended, was again advanced to the order of Third Reading.

### SENATE BILL ON THIRD READING

The following bill and any amendments adopted thereto were reproduced. Any amendments pending were tabled pursuant to Rule 40(a).

On motion of Representative Feigenholtz, SENATE BILL 526 was taken up and read by title a third time.

The Chair places this bill on extended debate.

And the question being, "Shall this bill pass?".

Pending the vote on said bill, on motion of Representative Feigenholtz, further consideration of SENATE BILL 526 was postponed.

### HOUSE BILL ON THIRD READING

The following bill and any amendments adopted thereto were reproduced. This bill has been examined, any amendments thereto engrossed and any errors corrected. Any amendments still pending upon the passage or defeat of a bill on Third Reading are automatically tabled pursuant to Rule 40(a).

On motion of Representative Acevedo, HOUSE BILL 429 was taken up and read by title a third time. The Chair places this bill on extended debate.

And the question being, "Shall this bill pass?" it was decided in the affirmative by the following vote: 92, Yeas; 6, Nays; 2, Answering Present.

(ROLL CALL 3)

This bill, having received the votes of a constitutional majority of the Members elected, was declared passed.

Ordered that the Clerk inform the Senate and ask their concurrence.

### SENATE BILL ON SECOND READING

SENATE BILL 434. Having been reproduced, was taken up and read by title a second time. Representative Lyons offered the following amendment and moved its adoption:

AMENDMENT NO. 1 . Amend Senate Bill 434, immediately below the enacting clause, by inserting the following:

"Section 5. The Director of Central Management Services is authorized to convey by Quit Claim Deed for \$1 to the City of Chicago the following described real property: surplus property located within the area bordered by Oak Park Avenue, West Irving Park Road, North Narragansett Avenue, West Montrose Avenue, and Forest Preserve Drive, Chicago, Illinois; provided, however, that should the property fail to be used for any public purpose within the first 10 years after the effective date of this amendatory Act of the 95th General Assembly or fail to be used at any time by the Grantee for public purposes, then title shall revert to the State of Illinois.

Section 10. "An Act in relation to certain land", approved June 13, 2000, Public Act 91-824, is amended by changing Section 20-10 as follows:

(P.A. 91-824, Sec. 20-10)

Sec. 20-10. The Director of Central Management Services is authorized to:

- (a) convey by quit claim deed for \$1 buildings A & B of the former Henry Horner School property located on Oak Park Ave, Chicago, Illinois to Maryville Academy, provided however that should the property fail to be used by Maryville Academy for charitable or educational purposes, the title shall revert to the State of Illinois;
- (b) convey by quit claim deed for \$1 upon identification and survey of a site mutually agreeable to the parties to New Horizon Center for the Developmentally Disabled, provided that should the property fail to be used by New Horizon Center for the Developmentally Disabled for charitable or educational purposes, title shall revert to the State of Illinois;
  - (c) convey by Quit Claim Deed for \$1 to the City of Chicago the following described real property:
- A PARCEL OF LAND, APPROXIMATELY 16,000 SQUARE FEET ON AND ALONG THE NORTH SIDE OF WEST

IRVING PARK ROAD, HAVING APPROXIMATELY 135 FEET OF FRONTAGE ON SAID WEST IRVING PARK ROAD AND A DEPTH OF APPROXIMATELY 125 FEET, HAVING ITS EASTERLY BOUNDARY PARALLEL TO AND APPROXIMATELY 1,111 FEET WEST OF THE

WEST PROPERTY LINE OF NORTH NARRAGANSETT AVENUE, AND ITS WESTERLY BOUNDARY BEING PARALLEL TO AND 135 FEET WEST OF THE EASTERLY BOUNDARY LINE, ALL IN THE COUNTY OF COOK AND STATE OF ILLINOIS.

Provided however, should the property fail to be used by the Grantee for public purposes, title shall revert to the State of Illinois;

- (d) take steps to preserve, landscape, memorialize and protect unmarked historic cemetery grounds located by archeological survey on the grounds of Chicago Read Mental Health Center. This subsection shall also allow the relocation of the remains pursuant to regulations and procedures established by the Historic Preservation Agency when deemed necessary by the Director of Central Management Services. For the purpose of the relocation of such remains, the Secretary of Human Services is designated next of kin when it is not possible to definitively establish the identity of any such remains;
- (e) (the General Assembly finds and declares that the authorization under this subsection (e) as originally enacted by Public Act 91-824 was never acted upon; and, therefore, the provisions of that originally enacted subsection (e) are rescinded by this amendatory Act of the 95th General Assembly) in order to facilitate the conveyances referenced in subsections (a) and (b) after consultation with the Secretary of Transportation, the Secretary of Human Services, and the Director of Commerce and Community Affairs and upon obtaining necessary appraisals, surveys, and environmental reports, and in accordance with and in coordination with any pre existing redevelopment agreement, convey title by quit claim deed to Chicago Read Joint Venture, Limited Partnership to surplus property located within the area bordered by Harlem Avenue, West Irving Park Road, North Narragansett Avenue, West Montrose Avenue, and Forest Preserve Drive, Chicago, Illinois, but excluding the area comprised of the property of the former Henry Horner School and the property referred to as the "Phase Three Property" under the Chicago Read Dunning Redevelopment Agreement, at fair market value and on such terms and conditions necessary to bring about the orderly redevelopment of such surplus property, provided however that "surplus property" as described in this Section shall not include buildings and grounds currently under the jurisdiction of the Department of Human Services unless specifically consented to by the Secretary of Human Services; and
  - (f) accept replacement State facilities constructed in order to relocate State operations located in facilities to be replaced or otherwise transferred to coordinate with necessary redevelopment.

Section 15. The Director of Central Management Services shall obtain a certified copy of this Act within 60 days after its effective date, and shall record the certified document in the Recorder's Office in the county in which the land is located."; and

on page 1, line 4, by replacing "Section 5." with "Section 20.".

The foregoing motion prevailed and the amendment was adopted and ordered reproduced.

There being no further amendments, the foregoing Amendment No. 1 was adopted and the bill, as amended, was advanced to the order of Third Reading.
