RECALL

At the request of the principal sponsor, Representative Saviano, HOUSE BILL 122 was recalled from the order of Third Reading to the order of Second Reading.

HOUSE BILL ON SECOND READING

HOUSE BILL 122. Having been recalled on June 20, 2007, the same was again taken up.

Floor Amendment No. 1 remained in the Committee on Rules.

Representative Saviano offered the following amendment and moved its adoption:

AMENDMENT NO. 2. Amend House Bill 122, AS AMENDED, with reference to page and line numbers of House Amendment No. 1, by replacing line 24 on page 21 through line 6 on page 22 with the following:

"the <u>Secretary</u> Director. The Board has 60 calendar days from receipt of the report to review the report of the hearing officer and present its findings of fact, conclusions of law and recommendations to the

Secretary Director. If the Board fails to present its report within the 60 calendar day period, the respondent may request in writing a direct appeal to the Secretary, in which case the Secretary shall, within 7 calendar days after the request, issue an order directing the Board to issue its findings of fact, conclusions of law, and recommendations to the Secretary within 30 calendar days after such order. If the Board fails to issue its findings of fact, conclusions of law, and recommendations within that time frame to the Secretary after the entry of such order, the Secretary shall, within 30 calendar days thereafter, issue an order based upon the report of the hearing officer and the record of the proceedings or issue an order remanding the matter back to the hearing officer for additional proceedings in accordance with the order. If (i) a direct appeal is requested, (ii) the Board fails to issue its findings of fact, conclusions of law, and recommendations within the 30-day mandate from the Secretary or the Secretary fails to order the Board to do so, and (iii) the Secretary fails to issue an order within 30 calendar days thereafter, then the hearing officer's report is deemed accepted and a final decision of the Secretary. Notwithstanding any other provision of this Section, if the Secretary, upon review, determines that substantial justice has not been done in the revocation, suspension, or refusal to issue or renew a license or other disciplinary action taken as the result of the entry of the hearing officer's report, the Secretary may order a rehearing by the same or other examiners the Director may issue an order based on the report of the hearing officer. If the Secretary Director disagrees".

The foregoing motion prevailed and Amendment No. 2 was adopted.

There being no further amendments, the foregoing Amendment No. 2 was ordered engrossed; and the bill, as amended, was again advanced to the order of Third Reading.

HOUSE BILL ON THIRD READING

The following bill and any amendments adopted thereto were reproduced. This bill has been examined, any amendments thereto engrossed and any errors corrected. Any amendments pending were tabled pursuant to Rule 40(a).

On motion of Representative Saviano, HOUSE BILL 122 was taken up and read by title a third time. A three-fifths vote is required.

And the question being, "Shall this bill pass?" it was decided in the affirmative by the following vote: 104, Yeas; 0, Nays; 0, Answering Present.

(ROLL CALL 2)

This bill, having received the votes of three-fifths of the Members elected, was declared passed. Ordered that the Clerk inform the Senate and ask their concurrence.

HOUSE BILL ON SECOND READING

HOUSE BILL 128. Having been recalled on June 20, 2007, the same was again taken up.

Representative Saviano offered the following amendment and moved its adoption.

AMENDMENT NO. 2_. Amend House Bill 128, AS AMENDED, with reference to page and line numbers of House Amendment No. 1, on page 18, by replacing lines 11 through 17 with the following: "Board and the <u>Secretary Director</u>. The Board shall have 60 days from receipt of the report to review the report of the hearing officer and present its findings of fact, conclusions of law and recommendation to the <u>Secretary Director</u>. If the Board fails to present its report within the 60 day period, <u>the respondent may request in writing a direct appeal to the Secretary, in which case the Secretary shall, within 7 calendar days after the request, issue an order directing the Board to issue its findings of fact, conclusions of law, and</u>

recommendations to the Secretary within 30 calendar days after such order. If the Board fails to issue its findings of fact, conclusions of law, and recommendations within that time frame to the Secretary after the entry of such order, the Secretary shall, within 30 calendar days thereafter, issue an order based upon the report of the hearing officer and the record of the proceedings or issue an order remanding the matter back to the hearing officer for additional proceedings in accordance with the order. If (i) a direct appeal is requested, (ii) the Board fails to issue its findings of fact, conclusions of law, and recommendations within the 30-day mandate from the Secretary or the Secretary fails to order the Board to do so, and (iii) the Secretary fails to issue an order within 30 calendar days thereafter, then the hearing officer's report is deemed accepted and a final decision of the Secretary. Notwithstanding any other provision of this Section, if the Secretary, upon review, determines that substantial justice has not been done in the revocation, suspension, or refusal to issue or renew a license or other disciplinary action taken as the result of the entry of the hearing officer's report, the Secretary may order a rehearing by the same or other examiners the Director shall issue an order based on the report of the hearing officer. If the Secretary Director determines".

The foregoing motion prevailed and Amendment No. 2 was adopted.

There being no further amendments, the foregoing Amendment No. 2 was ordered engrossed; and the bill, as amended, was again advanced to the order of Third Reading.

And the question being, "Shall this bill pass?" it was decided in the affirmative by the following vote: 104, Yeas; 0, Nays; 0, Answering Present.

This bill, having received the votes of three-fifths of the Members elected, was declared passed. Ordered that the Clerk inform the Senate and ask their concurrence.

SENATE BILL ON SECOND READING

SENATE BILL 149. Having been recalled on June 20, 2007, and held on the order of Second Reading, the same was again taken up.

Representative Saviano offered the following amendment and moved its adoption.

AMENDMENT NO. 2. Amend Senate Bill 149 on page 26, by replacing lines 8 through 14 with the following:

"Director. The Disciplinary Board shall have 60 days from receipt of the report to review the report of the hearing officer and present their findings of fact, conclusions of law, and recommendations to the Secretary Director. If the Disciplinary Board fails to present its report within the 60 day period, the respondent may request in writing a direct appeal to the Secretary, in which case the Secretary shall, within 7 calendar days after the request, issue an order directing the Disciplinary Board to issue its findings of fact, conclusions of law, and recommendations to the Secretary within 30 calendar days after such order. If the Disciplinary Board fails to issue its findings of fact, conclusions of law, and recommendations within that time frame to

the Secretary after the entry of such order, the Secretary shall, within 30 calendar days thereafter, issue an order based upon the report of the hearing officer and the record of the proceedings or issue an order remanding the matter back to the hearing officer for additional proceedings in accordance with the order. If (i) a direct appeal is requested, (ii) the Disciplinary Board fails to issue its findings of fact, conclusions of law, and recommendations within the 30-day mandate from the Secretary or the Secretary fails to order the Disciplinary Board to do so, and (iii) the Secretary fails to issue an order within 30 calendar days thereafter, then the hearing officer's report is deemed accepted and a final decision of the Secretary. Notwithstanding any other provision of this Section, if the Secretary, upon review, determines that substantial justice has not been done in the revocation, suspension, or refusal to issue or renew a license or other disciplinary action taken as the result of the entry of the hearing officer's report, the Secretary may order a rehearing by the same or other examiners the Director shall issue an order based on the report of the hearing officer. If the Secretary".

The foregoing motion prevailed and the amendment was adopted and ordered reproduced.

There being no further amendments, the foregoing Amendment No. 2 was adopted and the bill, as amended, was held on the order of Second Reading.

SENATE BILL ON THIRD READING

On motion of Representative Hernandez, SENATE BILL 1446 was taken up and read by title a third time.

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AMENDMENT NO. 2 . Amend Senate Bill 17 as follows:
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on page 1, line 5, by changing "Division 16" to "Divisions 16 and 17"; and

on page 2, line 22, after "5", by inserting "contiguous"; and

on page 5, by replacing line 1 with the following:

"10-155, (iv) land certified under Section 10-160, or (v) any property dedicated as a nature preserve or a nature preserve buffer under the Illinois Natural Areas Preservation Act and assessed in accordance with subsection (e) of Section 9-145."; and

on page 8, by deleting lines 1 through 16; and

on page 8, line 18, by changing "may" to "shall"; and

on page 8, immediately below line 19, by inserting the following:

"(35 ILCS 200/Art. 10 Div. 17 heading new)

DIVISION 17. WOODED ACREAGE ASSESSMENT TRANSITION LAW

(35 ILCS 200/10-500 new)

Sec. 10-500. Short title. This Division may be cited as the Wooded Acreage Assessment Transition Law.

(35 ILCS 200/10-505 new)

- Sec. 10-505. Wooded acreage defined. For the purposes of this Division 17, "wooded acreage" means any parcel of unimproved real property that:
- (1) can be defined as "wooded acreage" by the United States Department of Labor Bureau of Land Management;
 - (2) is at least 5 contiguous acres;
- (3) does not qualify as cropland, permanent pasture, other farmland, or wasteland under Section 10-125 of the this Code;
- (4) is not managed under a forestry management plan and considered to be other farmland under Section 10-150 of this Code;
 - (5) does not qualify for another preferential assessment under this Code; and
 - (6) is owned by the taxpayer on October 1, 2007.
 - (35 ILCS 200/10-510 new)
 - Sec. 10-510. Assessment of wooded acreage.
- (a) If wooded acreage was classified as farmland during the 2006 assessment year, then the property shall be assessed by multiplying the current fair cash value of the property by the transition percentage. The chief county assessment officer shall determine the transition percentage for the property by dividing (i) the property's 2006 equalized assessed value as farmland by (ii) the 2006 fair cash value of the property.
- (b) The wooded acreage shall continue to be assessed under the provisions of this Section through any assessment year in which the property is transferred or no longer qualifies as wooded acreage under Section 10-505, and the property must be assessed as otherwise permitted by law beginning the following assessment year.
 - (35 ILCS 200/10-515 new)
- Sec. 10-515. Notice requirement. If the owner of property subject to this Division is a corporation, partnership, limited liability company, trust, or other similar entity, then it shall report to the chief county assessment officer any change in ownership interest or beneficial interest. If, after October 1, 2007, the ownership interests or beneficial interests in such an entity change by more than 50% from those interests as they existed on October 1, 2007, then the property no longer qualifies to receive the preferential assessment treatment of the wooded acreage under this Division, and the property must be assessed as otherwise permitted by law beginning the following assessment year.
 - (35 ILCS 200/10-520 new)
- Sec. 10-520. Cook County exempt. This Division 17 does not apply to any property located within Cook County.".

The foregoing motion prevailed and the amendment was adopted and ordered reproduced.

There being no further amendments, the foregoing Amendment No. 2 was adopted and the bill, as amended, was advanced to the order of Third Reading.

RESOLUTIONS

Having been reported out of the Committee on Higher Education on June 13, 2007, HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION 69 was taken up for consideration.

The following amendment was offered in the Committee on Higher Education, adopted and reproduced:

AMENDMENT NO. $\underline{1}$. Amend House Joint Resolution 69 by replacing line 6 on page 2 through line 5 on page 3 with the following:

"RESOLVED, that the Task Force shall be chaired by the Chairperson of the Board of Higher Education and be composed of 4 members of the General Assembly, one appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives, one appointed by the Minority Leader of the House of Representatives, one appointed by the President of the Senate, and one appointed by the Minority Leader of the Senate; and 20 members appointed by the Governor, from nominees recommended by the Board of Higher Education, as follows:

- (1) a president or senior administrator of a public university;
- (2) a trustee of a community college;
- (3) a president or senior administrator of a community college;
- (4) a representative of the independent, not-for-profit education sector;
- (5) 3 business leaders from statewide business associations, an Illinois-based corporation, or the Illinois Workforce Investment Board;
- (6) a leader of a civic or nonprofit organization or foundation;
- (7) a leader of the healthcare industry;
- (8) an expert in student financial aid;
- (9) a school district superintendent;
- (10) a labor leader representing a statewide labor organization;
- (11) 2 faculty members or academic professionals from community colleges;
- (12) 2 faculty members or academic professionals from public universities;

- (13) one faculty member nominated by the Faculty Advisory Council to the Board of Higher Education;
- (14) one student nominated by the Student Advisory Committee to the Board of Higher Education;
- (15) one nationally recognized leader in higher education policy; and
- (16) a representative of the proprietary education sector; and be it further".

Representative McCarthy moved the adoption of the resolution.

And on that motion, a vote was taken resulting as follows:

104, Yeas; 0, Nays; 0, Answering Present.

(ROLL CALL 13)

The motion prevailed and the Resolution was adopted, as amended.
