INTRODUCTION AND FIRST READING OF BILLS

Introduced by Representatives Bradley, John - Smith - Eddy - Holbrook - Mitchell, Jerry, Mautino, Crespo, Flider, Beiser, Ryg, Bellock, Osmond, Tryon, Sacia, Cultra, Pihos, Biggins, Ramey, Krause, Kosel, Coladipietro, Reboletti, Mathias, Pritchard, Gordon, Dugan, Verschoore, Hannig, Froehlich, Golar, Jakobsson, Joyce, D'Amico and Fritchey, AN ACT concerning education.

HOUSE BILL 4149. Introduced by Representatives Bradley, John - Smith - Eddy - Holbrook - Mitchell, Jerry, AN ACT concerning appropriations.

HOUSE RESOLUTIONS

The following resolutions were offered and placed in the Committee on Rules.

HOUSE RESOLUTION 703

Offered by Representative Mathias:

WHEREAS, More than 11 million Americans currently suffer from food allergies; from 1997 to 2002, the number of children with food allergies doubled; and

WHEREAS, Food allergies kill as many as 200 Americans and send 30,000 people to emergency rooms

each year; and

WHEREAS, For some children, even a small drop of milk left on a shopping cart from another child's snack can trigger life-threatening anaphylaxis; and

WHEREAS, The average school has 10 children suffering from severe food allergies; the most common allergens include peanuts, eggs, milk, fish, and wheat, which are nearly impossible to avoid completely at schools; and

WHEREAS, Scientists believe that a cure can be found for most allergies by using existing science that has been developed to treat asthma, airborne allergens, and venom from bee stings, and they believe that a cure could be found within a decade; and

WHEREAS, Severe food allergies disqualify individuals from military service eligibility; the growing incidence of food allergies could significantly decrease the pool of qualified candidates to serve in our armed forces; and

WHEREAS, Only \$10 million is spent annually for allergy research by the National Institutes of Health, while research for attention deficit disorder gets \$107 million a year and research for diabetes gets \$1.2 billion a year; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-FIFTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that that the United States Congress should increase funding to the National Institutes of Health for research to discover a cure for food allergies to benefit individuals and society as a whole; and be it further

RESOLVED, That suitable copies of this resolution be delivered to each member of the Illinois Congressional delegation.

HOUSE RESOLUTION 720

Offered by Representative Dunkin:

WHEREAS, The members of the Illinois House of Representatives are pleased to honor Lonnie Rashid Lynn, more famously known as the Chicago hip-hop artist Common, for his work in the community; and

WHEREAS, Lonnie Rashid Lynn was raised on the South Side of Chicago; he is the son of one of Chicago's most respected educators, Mahalia Ann Hines, the principal at John Hope College Preparatory High School, and former professional basketball player Lonnie Lynn; and

WHEREAS, Common's career began in 1992, when he, then named COMMON SENSE, introduced himself to the world with the single "Take It EZ"; since 1992, he has sold 2.6 million copies of his albums; and

WHEREAS, Common's music has been described as refreshing in how he speaks directly to the African-American community and suggests that it must first heal and unify itself, before it can face its outside oppressors; and

WHEREAS, Common has also become a successful actor; he made his acting debut in January 2007, co-starring alongside Jeremy Piven, Ben Affleck, and Ray Liotta in the film "Smokin' Aces"; he has also co-starred opposite Denzel Washington in "American Gangster" and recently wrapped the filming of "Wanted", with co-stars Morgan Freeman and Angelina Jolie; he will soon start work on "The Night Watchman", co-starring with Keanu Reeves and Forest Whitaker; and

WHEREAS, In addition to his theatrical roles, he has been active in advertising, appearing in national ad campaigns for The Gap and Converse Red; he has also written three books inspired by his daughter, "The Mirror and Me", "M.E. (Mixed Emotions)", and "I Like You, But I Love Me", which was recently nominated for a NAACP Image Award; he has also created a line of designer hats; and

WHEREAS, Common is the founder of the Common Ground Foundation, an organization dedicated to utilizing the cultural relevance of hip-hop music to serve as an advocate for justice and education, as well as to fight poverty and increase health awareness among young people in underserved communities throughout the United States; and

WHEREAS, Common's dedication to his music and film career and his willingness to serve his community make him a model for the people of the State of Illinois; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-FIFTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we honor Lonnie Rashid Lynn for his work in the community and wish him continued success and happiness in the future; and be it further

RESOLVED, That we urge the City of Chicago to proclaim September 20, 2007 as Common Day in the

City of Chicago; and be it further

RESOLVED, That a suitable copy of this resolution be presented to Lonnie Rashid Lynn as a symbol of our esteem and respect.

HOUSE RESOLUTION 721

Offered by Representative Lang:

WHEREAS, On Tuesday, October 24, 2006, Dr. David Cornbleet was tortured and brutally murdered in his office located at 30 N. Michigan Ave. in Chicago; and

WHEREAS, A former patient of Dr. Cornbleet's, Hans Peterson, has confessed to committing this murder; and

WHEREAS, After committing this horrendous crime, Peterson fled to and hid in the French portion of St. Martin; and

WHEREAS, Before confessing and turning himself into French officials, Peterson applied for and was granted French citizenship merely based on his mother's nationality; and

WHEREAS, Even though he was born and raised in the United States and filled out his French citizenship application after committing the act of murder, France granted him citizenship in May of 2007 based on the fact that there is French blood in his lineage; and

WHEREAS, France claims that Peterson is protected as a French citizen by its laws and has refused extradition; and

WHEREAS, If Peterson is ever tried and convicted, under French law at most he will face 20 years in prison, what the French consider being a life sentence; and

WHEREAS, The 2002 Treaty between the United States and the French Republic merely states that "there is no obligation upon the Requested State to grant the extradition of a person who is a national of the Requested State" and does not absolutely preclude such extradition; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-FIFTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we urge the French Republic to extradite Hans Peterson, an American citizen who committed a crime on American soil; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the French Republic's treatment of this case to date offends the notions of justice of this body and of the people of the State of Illinois; and be it further

RESOLVED, That a suitable copy of this resolution be presented to the French Republic's Consul General to Chicago as an appeal by the people of the State of Illinois for France to exercise its ability to extradite under the 2002 Treaty with the United States in the interest of true justice.

HOUSE RESOLUTION 724

Offered by Representative Granberg:

WHEREAS, The members of the Illinois House of Representatives wish to show their support for Southern Illinois University President, Glenn Poshard; and
