Offered by Representative Tracy:

WHEREAS, Cargill is an international provider of food, agricultural, and risk management products and services, with 149,000 employees in 63 countries; and

WHEREAS, Cargill contributes more than \$36 million globally to civic and charitable organizations each year to help the communities where its employees live and work; and

WHEREAS, The Cargill Grain Company of Illinois was formed in 1931 and provides nearly 3,000 Illinois jobs in 26 communities throughout the State; and

WHEREAS, Cargill is a leading sponsor of Farm Safety 4 Just Kids and supports 4-H Healthy Lifestyles; the company has received the Illinois 4-H Partners Award for its ongoing support of 4-H groups throughout Illinois; and

WHEREAS, Cargill has awarded more than \$300,000 in scholarships to more than 130 Illinois students; the company has also committed more than \$1 million to the University of Illinois for academic programs in agriculture, engineering, and business; and

WHEREAS, Cargill has pledged \$150,000 to Beardstown High School for new science labs in the effort to bring science curriculum to local students; and

WHEREAS, Cargill offers English as a Second Language classes to its employees and their families through its partnership with Lincoln Land Community College; and

WHEREAS, Cargill has donated more than \$700,000 to charities and communities throughout Illinois, including a new dispatch center for the police department in Beardstown, building homes for Habitat for Humanity, and contributions to United Way organizations throughout Illinois; and

HOUSE RESOLUTION 1031

Offered by Representative Bellock:

WHEREAS, DNA technology is increasingly vital to ensuring accuracy and fairness in the criminal justice system, but is not yet considered a routine tool for criminal identification by law enforcement; and

WHEREAS, Over 50,000 law enforcement investigations have already been aided nationwide because of DNA matches made through the FBI's Combined DNA Index System (CODIS), bringing justice to victims and removing criminals from the streets; and

WHEREAS, The Innocence Project has used DNA in over 200 cases to exonerate persons who were wrongfully convicted of crimes; and

WHEREAS, The State of Illinois and other states throughout the nation have significantly expanded their DNA programs to include a growing number of convicted and/or arrested felons to match against unsolved crimes; and

WHEREAS, The demand for DNA testing in both violent and non-violent crimes has continued to increase as the reliability of this evidence is proven; and

WHEREAS, Many laboratories still maintain DNA backlogs of six months or longer and are unable to meet the growing demand for DNA testing despite funding commitments from state and local governments; and

WHEREAS, The Debbie Smith DNA backlog grant program has permitted state and local governments an opportunity to begin to maximize the full potential of forensic DNA through backlog reduction, but much work remains to be done; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-FIFTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we strongly urge the United States Congress to reauthorize the Debbie Smith DNA backlog grant program at current or increased levels; and be it further

RESOLVED, That suitable copies of this resolution be delivered to the Majority Leader and Minority Leader of the United States Senate, the Speaker and Minority Leader of the United States House of Representatives, and to each member of the Illinois congressional delegation.
