WHEREAS, On September 11th, 2001, 2,451 people were killed, including 341 firefighters, and hundreds were injured, during the terrorist attacks on the World Trade Center in New York City; in line with their professional duty, hundreds of firefighters rushed into the burning towers to save lives as people evacuated the buildings; and

WHEREAS, The true bravery of firefighters in America will never be forgotten after the events of

September 11th, nor should it ever be, as we continue to honor the spirit, strength, and duty to protect others that our nation's firefighters display every day; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-FIFTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we recognize the day of September 11th as National Firefighters' Day and thank the many men and women of the United States who serve as firefighters and devote themselves to the protection of others at the risk of their own lives day after day; and be it further

RESOLVED, That a suitable copy of this resolution be presented to David B. Foreman, State Fire Marshal.

HOUSE RESOLUTION 1057

Offered by Representative Miller:

WHEREAS, The members of the Illinois House of Representatives fully recognize that stroke is the third leading cause of death in the United States; each year, over 160,000 Americans die from strokes; African Americans are two times more likely to suffer a first-ever stroke than Caucasian Americans and age-adjusted death rates for stroke are also higher among African Americans; and

WHEREAS, Stroke is also a leading cause of serious long-term disability; more than 1.1 million American adults experience functional limitations and difficulty with activities of daily living as a result of a stroke every year; and

WHEREAS, Despite the fact that Americans are now more aware of stroke's risk factors and warning signs than in the past, less than one in five adults can correctly classify all stroke symptoms and warnings, which include sudden numbness or weakness of the face, arm, or leg, especially on one side of the body, confusion, trouble speaking or understanding, trouble seeing in one or both eyes, difficulty with walking, dizziness, loss of balance or coordination, or a severe headache with no known cause; and

WHEREAS, There is a need for a coordinated system of care for stroke that addresses stroke care along a continuum of care from primary prevention through rehabilitation to greatly reduce the fragmentation of care and the burden of stroke; and

WHEREAS, Essential components of an effective coordinated system of care for stroke include patient access to the full range of services associated with stroke prevention, treatment, and rehabilitation; such services include primordial and primary prevention, timely notification of and response by emergency medical service providers, acute treatment, sub-acute care and secondary prevention, rehabilitation, and continual quality improvement initiatives; and

WHEREAS, Timely recognition of the symptoms of stroke by stroke victims, family members, the public, and emergency medical service providers, which include, but are not limited to, emergency medical responders, transport providers, and hospital emergency room and health clinic personnel, is crucial because the effects of stroke can be totally reversed if recognized, diagnosed, and treated within three hours; and

WHEREAS, These groups can screen for stroke by remembering the first three letters of the word "STR", and asking the individual to Smile, Talk and speak a simple sentence coherently, and Raise both arms; and

WHEREAS, Another sign of stroke is noting whether an individual's tongue is crooked or goes to one side; and

WHEREAS, A concerted focus toward the dissemination of this type of information is one way to raise awareness about the power of communities, especially communities of color, to prevent stroke; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-FIFTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we encourage the members of the Illinois General Assembly and other legislators across the country to partner with the American Heart Association / American Stroke Association to promote the Power to End Stroke program as a precursor to a nationwide movement to address stroke as a serious health disparity in African Americans in order to raise awareness that uncontrolled high blood pressure and diabetes in African Americans raises the risk for stroke and to promote adherence to primary and secondary stroke prevention guidelines by healthcare professionals; and be it further

RESOLVED, That this body, in collaboration with the American Heart Association / American Stroke Association, will seek to introduce and enact policy that will create and/or expand statewide coordinated

systems of care for stroke, with special focus and attention on timely access to care, diagnosis, and the most advanced treatment for those most disproportionately affected by stroke.

HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION 113

Offered by Representative Madigan:

WHEREAS, Amyotrophic lateral sclerosis or ALS is better known as Lou Gehrig's disease; and

WHEREAS, ALS is a fatal neurodegenerative disease characterized by degeneration of cell bodies of the lower motor neurons in the gray matter of the anterior horns of the spinal cord; and

WHEREAS, The initial symptom of ALS is weakness of the skeletal muscles, especially those of the extremities; and

WHEREAS, As ALS progresses the patient experiences difficulty in swallowing, talking, and breathing; and

WHEREAS, ALS eventually causes muscles to atrophy and the patient becomes a functional quadriplegic; and

WHEREAS, ALS does not affect a patient's mental capacity, so that the patient remains alert and aware of his or her loss of motor functions and the inevitable outcome of continued deterioration and death; and

WHEREAS, On average, patients diagnosed with ALS only survive two to five years from the time of diagnosis; and

WHEREAS, research indicates that military veterans are at a 50% or greater risk of developing ALS than those who have not served in the military; and

WHEREAS, ALS has no known cause, means of prevention, or cure; and

WHEREAS, Amyotrophic Lateral Sclerosis Awareness Month increases the public's awareness of ALS patients' circumstances and acknowledges the terrible impact this disease has not only on the patient but on his or her family and the community and recognizes the research being done to eradicate this horrible disease; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-FIFTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, THE SENATE CONCURRING HEREIN, that we proclaim the month of May 2008 as Amyotrophic Lateral Sclerosis Awareness Month in the State of Illinois; and be it further

RESOLVED, That we memorialize the President and Congress of the United States to enact legislation to provide additional funding for research in order to find a treatment and eventually a cure for amyotrophic lateral sclerosis; and be it further

RESOLVED, That suitable copies of this resolution be presented to the President of the United States and each member of the Illinois congressional delegation.

HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTIONS CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENTS FIRST READING

Representative Boland introduced the following:

HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT 41

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-FIFTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, THE SENATE CONCURRING HEREIN, that there shall be submitted to the electors of the State for adoption or rejection at the general election next occurring at least 6 months after the adoption of this resolution a proposition to amend Article VII of the Illinois Constitution by changing Section 3 as follows:

ARTICLE VII LOCAL GOVERNMENT

SECTION 3. COUNTY BOARDS

- (a) A county board shall be elected in each county. The number of members of the county board shall be fixed by ordinance in each county within limitations provided by law; provided that if the number of a county's board members exceeds 17, then that county's number of members may be reduced to 17 upon approval at a county-wide referendum initiated by petition of the county's voters as provided by law.
- (b) The General Assembly by law shall provide methods available to all counties for the election of county board members. No county, other than Cook County, may change its method of electing board members except as approved by county-wide referendum.
- (c) Members of the Cook County Board shall be elected from two districts, Chicago and that part of Cook County outside Chicago, unless (1) a different method of election is approved by a majority of votes cast in each of the two districts in a county-wide referendum or (2) the Cook County Board by ordinance divides the county into single member districts from which members of the County Board resident in each district are elected. If a different method of election is adopted pursuant to option (1) the method of election may thereafter be altered only pursuant to option (2) or by county-wide referendum. A different method of election may be adopted pursuant to option (2) only once and the method of election may thereafter be

altered only by county-wide referendum. (Source: Illinois Constitution.)

SCHEDULE

This Constitutional Amendment takes effect upon being declared adopted in accordance with Section 7 of the Illinois Constitutional Amendment Act.
