HOUSE RESOLUTIONS

The following resolutions were offered and placed in the Committee on Rules.

HOUSE RESOLUTION 236

Offered by Representative Currie:

WHEREAS, The future of our nation's productivity and competitiveness in the global marketplace depends on the success of all men and women; and

WHEREAS, Women have been discriminated against in education, the workplace, and society as a whole; and

WHEREAS, Women continue to earn no more than 77 cents on the dollar compared to men; and

WHEREAS, The pay gap has been shown to start as soon as one year after college; this inequality affects not only women, but their families and society as a whole; and

WHEREAS, The pay gap between women and men has long-term effects on women's economic security; such a gap affects women's Social Security earnings, their ability to save for retirement, and their children's education; and

WHEREAS, Pay equity is closely linked to the eradication of poverty and is essential to having a highly-motivated workforce; and

WHEREAS, Equal Pay Day was originated by the National Committee on Pay Equity in 1996 as a public awareness event to illustrate the gap between men's and women's wages; the day, observed in April, symbolizes how far into the year a woman must work, on average, to earn as much as a man earned the previous year, with Tuesday being the day in which women's wages catch up to men's wages from the previous week; because women earn less on average than men, they must work longer for the same amount of pay; this wage gap is even greater for most women of color; and

WHEREAS, Equal pay is a priority for all women and for our society at large; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-SEVENTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we designate April 12, 2011 as Pay Equity Day in the State of Illinois in order to raise awareness about this endemic inequity.

HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION 24

Offered by Representative Soto:

WHEREAS, Public transit is essential for the overall economic health and prosperity of the Chicagoland area; and

WHEREAS, Mass transit is an integral, essential part of the strengths that make the Northeastern Illinois region world-class; and

WHEREAS, Many people rely on the services provided by the Regional Transportation Authority, Chicago Transit Authority, Suburban Bus Division, and Commuter Rail Division (Authority and Service Boards) to get them safely and efficiently to their desired destinations; and

WHEREAS, Mass transit should continue to play a central role in our communities by:

- (1) strengthening neighborhoods, government and community services, and business districts and supporting civic events by making them more accessible;
- (2) providing a viable alternative to the automobile for residents who cannot or choose not to drive an automobile:
- (3) reducing traffic congestion, energy consumption, and automobile emissions;
- (4) reducing the need to create additional parking facilities; and
- (5) supporting the independence of the elderly and people with disabilities; and

WHEREAS, Mass transit is essential to creating and sustaining a strong job market; for every dollar

invested in public transit, local economies receive \$8 in economic activity; and

WHEREAS, The Authority is the third largest public transportation system in North America and provides more than 2 million rides a day; the services provided by the Authority cover 7,200 route miles in a 6-county region with a population of approximately 8,000,000 people; the combined assets of the Authority are valued at more than \$36 billion and include 5,640 bus and rail cars and 650 vanpool vehicles; and

WHEREAS, The Authority and Service Boards must work cohesively to modernize and maintain the transit system in order to produce a more efficient, convenient, and consumer-friendly transit system; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-SEVENTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, THE SENATE CONCURRING HEREIN, that the House of Representatives' Mass Transit Committee and the Senate's Transportation Committee hold at least one joint hearing no earlier than July 1, 2011 and no later than December 1, 2011 to take testimony from the Authority and the Service Boards concerning the following goals:

- (1) ensure that the Authority and the Service Boards have a strategic capital plan that focuses on reducing overall operating expenditures;
- (2) harness the Authority's and Service Boards' purchasing power to achieve cost savings and improved efficiency wherever possible;
- (3) create a plan to maximize the use of the transit system;
- (4) improve the experience of customers;
- (5) increase the coordination among the Service Boards; and
- (6) create a unified marketing, outreach, and government affairs approach for the

Authority and the Service Boards; and be it further

RESOLVED, That prior to the first joint meeting of the committees, the Authority, in conjunction with the Service Boards, must submit a report to the committees setting forth its goals and accomplishments concerning the creation of a more modern and efficient mass transit system; the report must be submitted by no later than July 1, 2011; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Authority provide administrative and other support to the committees; and be it further

RESOLVED, That on or before December 31, 2011, the committees must jointly report to the General Assembly their findings concerning the creation of a more modern and efficient mass transit system; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the requirement for reporting to the General Assembly shall be satisfied by filing copies of the report with the Speaker, the Minority Leader, and the Clerk of the House of Representatives, the President, the Minority Leader, and the Secretary of the Senate, and the Legislative Research Unit, as required by Section 3.1 of the General Assembly Organization Act, and filing additional copies with the State Government Report Distribution Center for the General Assembly as required under paragraph (t) of Section 7 of the State Library Act.

HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION 25

Offered by Representative D'Amico:

WHEREAS, On September 1, 1939 Poland was invaded by Germany, and although Russian signed a pact against Germany and promised to help Poland, they failed to keep that promise and attacked Poland on September 17, 1939; and

WHEREAS, Approximately 250,000 soldiers of the defeated Polish army who fled east were detained without resistance by advancing Soviet troops and were sent to a prison camp in Kozielsk; and

WHEREAS, The prisoners, which included lawyers and other Polish professionals in addition to thousands of military reserve officers, were methodically shot at sites in Western Russia, Ukraine and Belarus in April and May of 1940; and

WHEREAS, Those killed numbered 21,857, according to a since-released internal 1959 Soviet memorandum, and in 1943, the German Army found a pit in the Katyn forest in Russia, where they exhumed the remains of more than 4,000 Polish officers, which became a propaganda coup for the Germans; and

WHEREAS, Although a United States Congressional committee confirmed that the Soviets were responsible in 1952, little was done to acknowledge the Katyn Massacre, though in 1990, Mikhail Gorbachev approved an item from the state news agency acknowledging Soviet responsibility; and

WHEREAS, Wojciech Seweryn was an immigrant from Poland who was born on the first day of World War II and whose father was a reserve infantry officer for the Polish army; and

WHEREAS, Wojciech's father, Mieczyslaw, was part of the 250,000 defeated soldiers that were sent to the camp in Kozielsk and killed in the Katyn forest; and

WHEREAS, Wojciech came to the United States and found a home in Chicago, where he devoted his time to educate the Polish community about what happened in the Katyn forest; and

WHEREAS, Wojciech for 40 years dreamed of building a monument to honor the victims of the Katyn Massacre, and realized that dream in May 2007, when a monument to honor the victims was completed in Niles, Illinois; and

WHEREAS, Wojciech served as Grand Marshal for the Polish Parade in 2007 and in the crowning moment of his life, he was invited by the Polish President Lech Kaczynski to fly with him and other leaders to Katyn on April 10, 2010; and

WHEREAS, On the way to the ceremony in Katyn, the plane crashed, killing all passengers on board; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-SEVENTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, THE SENATE CONCURRING HEREIN, we designate a portion of Milwaukee Avenue from Albion Avenue to Gross Pointe Road in Chicago, Illinois the Wojciech M. Seweryn Memorial Road; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Illinois Department of Transportation is requested to erect at suitable locations, consistent with State regulations, plaques or signs giving notice of the name; and be it further

RESOLVED, That suitable copies of this resolution be presented to the Illinois Secretary of Transportation and to the family of Wojciech Seweryn.
