MESSAGES FROM THE SENATE

A message from the Senate by

Ms. Rock, Secretary:

Mr. Speaker -- I am directed to inform the House of Representatives that the Senate has passed a bill of the following title, the Governor's specific recommendations for change to the contrary notwithstanding, in the passage of which I am instructed to ask the concurrence of the House, to-wit:

Senate Bill No. 1

A bill for AN ACT concerning government.

I am further directed to transmit to the House of Representatives the following copy of the Governor's specific recommendations for change to the Senate:

Passed by the Senate, May 13, 2011, by a three-fifths vote.

To the Honorable Members of the Illinois Senate, 97th General Assembly

I hereby return Senate Bill 1 with a specific recommendation for change.

I commend the sponsors for their work to pass this bill. This legislation will provide additional transparency and accountability to the executive appointment process by expediting the constitutionally required public review before the Senate of appointees serving in expired terms.

The office of citizen is the highest office in the land. One of the best ways to participate in our democracy is by serving on a state board, commission, task force, or other executive appointment. These positions oversee and advise Illinois' elected officials, state agencies and organizations on a wide range of issues that affect the public welfare. They also play a vital role in promoting efficient, effective, and honest government.

It is important that citizens know about Illinois' boards and commissions and how to apply for membership. In 2009, I created appointments.illinois.gov. On this website, citizens can view descriptions of the positions, current members and vacancies, and I encourage all citizens to consider applying for a board or commission.

I applaud the sponsors for working to make the executive appointments process even more transparent. My recommendations for change would honor the intent of the sponsors but would also give citizens ample time to apply for a vacant position and allow a reasonable amount of time for identifying and recruiting qualified candidates.

Therefore, pursuant to Article IV, Section 9(e) of the Illinois Constitution of 1970, I hereby return Senate Bill 1, entitled "AN ACT concerning government," with the following specific recommendation for change:

On page 5, by adding immediately below line 22 the following:

"(e) The provisions of this Section pertaining to a salaried office apply on and after July 1, 2011. The provisions of this Section pertaining to an office other than a salaried office apply on and after October 1, 2011."

With this change, Senate Bill 1 will have my approval. I respectfully request your concurrence.

HOUSE RESOLUTION 368

Offered by Representative Berrios:

WHEREAS, The 14th Amendment of the United States Constitution clearly states that all persons born in the United States are citizens of the U.S. and the state in which they reside; and

WHEREAS, For over 100 years, the United States Supreme Court has upheld that citizenship be granted to all individuals born on U.S. soil, regardless of their parent's citizenship status; and

WHEREAS, A repeal of the 14th Amendment would have dire and costly effects on the State of Illinois, due to the creation of a lengthy bureaucratic process to confer U.S. citizenship; and

WHEREAS, Denying citizenship to certain U.S.-born children would create a permanent group of non-citizens and the potential for a stateless segment of the population; and

WHEREAS, Legislators have initiated a campaign to amend the United States Constitution in a way that undermines a pillar of U.S. civil rights; and

WHEREAS, The majority of immigrants come to this country to work or to reunite with family members already residing in the U.S.; and

WHEREAS, The residents of the State of Illinois deserve real solutions to address the undocumented population present in our state, not costly political distractions; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-SEVENTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we condemn divisive efforts to create two classes of citizens and to deny innocent children their constitutional right to U.S. citizenship through the repeal of the 14th Amendment of the United States Constitution or other measures; and be it further

RESOLVED, That we show our strong support for upholding the Constitution and its definition of citizenship.

HOUSE RESOLUTION 369

Offered by Representative Kosel:

WHEREAS, Motorcyclists across the country and in Illinois provide numerous benefits to communities across the State and participate in various activities including parades, memorial services, and demonstrations; and

WHEREAS, Motorcyclists often know and abide by the rules of the road for operating a motorcycle and would have an advantage in helping mediate traffic patterns between motorcycles and other vehicles; and

WHEREAS, Often at events with a heavy motorcycle presence there are issues involving the directing of traffic of all vehicles, including the motorcycles themselves, and often motorcyclists volunteer to direct traffic to ensure there are no accidents or injuries; and

WHEREAS, A special motorcycle crossing guard program would allow the State Police to officially train and certify motorcyclists on the Rules of the Road, traffic safety, directing traffic, and in the duties involved with being a crossing guard; and

WHEREAS, Motorcyclists, if trained under a special motorcycle crossing guard program, may be allowed to perform the duties of a crossing guard during special events that have a motorcycle presence; and

WHEREAS, A special motorcycle crossing guard program would benefit both the police authority and motorist by providing safety in directing traffic during special events that have a motorcycle presence; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-SEVENTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that the Illinois State Police shall conduct a study on the feasibility of creating and implementing a special motorcycle crossing guard program and shall issue a report with its recommendations to the General Assembly by July 15, 2012; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the study must include, but not be limited to, the following:

(1) an examination of current, related law, including, but not limited to, laws regarding funeral processions and funeral crossing guards;

- (2) how to make the training program cost neutral to the State of Illinois;
- (3) a proper definition of "special event";
- (4) consideration of a zero tolerance drug and alcohol use policy;
- (5) the necessity of liability insurance; and
- (6) the need for a uniform or visible, physical indicator that shows a motorcycle

crossing guard is trained and qualified; and be it further

RESOLVED, That a suitable copy of this resolution be presented to the Director of the Illinois State Police and the State Coordinator of A.B.A.T.E. Illinois.
