### HOUSE RESOLUTIONS

The following resolutions were offered and placed in the Committee on Rules.

#### HOUSE RESOLUTION 542

Offered by Representatives Mitchell, Bill:

WHEREAS, Public Act 93-0002 amended the General Obligation Bond Act to increase bond authorization by \$10 billion; and

WHEREAS, These 30-year general obligation bonds were designated as a pension funding series; the State of Illinois used a portion of the bond proceeds to pay part of the Fiscal Year 2003 State contribution and all of the Fiscal Year 2004 State contributions to the retirement systems; and

WHEREAS, Of the \$10 billion that was allocated, \$7.3 billion was used to reduce the unfunded liabilities of the State-funded retirement systems; and

WHEREAS, Along with the \$10 billion increase in bond authorization, Public Act 93-0002 included a provision requiring State contributions to the retirement systems to be reduced by the amount of the debt service on the bonds; and

WHEREAS, The State will be paying off the principal and debt on these bonds until 2033; and

WHEREAS, The State of Illinois has the worst funded pension system in the nation, with around \$85 billion in unfunded liability; and

WHEREAS, The bonding for 2003 was supposed to reduce the unfunded liability in the pensions systems and reduce the pension systems' financial cost to the State; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-SEVENTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that the Commission on Government Forecasting and Accountability shall study the impact of Public Act 93-0002 and the true cost of the bill versus the projected savings and create a report on its findings; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Commission on Government Forecasting and Accountability shall release its report, report all of its findings to the Illinois General Assembly and Governor, and publish all findings on the Commission on Government Forecasting and Accountability website by July 1, 2012.

#### HOUSE RESOLUTION 547

WHEREAS, The participants in the "Be a Santa to a Senior" program intend to recognize and celebrate our senior adults and the invaluable contributions they continue to make to our cities, this State, and the world at large; and

WHEREAS, The citizens of the State of Illinois recognize that our diverse population is committed to improving the well-being and serenity of our communities, as well as placing a greater focus on our lonely elders through the "Be a Santa to a Senior" program; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-SEVENTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we congratulate and thank the members of the "Be a Santa to a Senior" program for its contributions to the senior adults of this State; and be it further

RESOLVED, That we designate the month of December 2011 as Be a Santa to a Senior Month in the State of Illinois in recognition of this wonderful program; and be it further

#### HOUSE RESOLUTION 564

Offered by Representative Poe:

WHEREAS, St. John's Hospital School of Nursing, the first Catholic school of nursing in the United States, was established on October 4, 1886 in Springfield for the members of the Hospital Sisters of the Third Order of St. Francis; and

WHEREAS, Their mission was to care for the sick and the needy of the community in a spirit of joy, respect, and commitment to competence; and

WHEREAS, From that day until the present, the values and vision of the Hospital Sisters have underscored and directed the efforts of the faculty and students; and

WHEREAS, In 1912, the school accepted the first laywoman and voluntarily sought approval from the Illinois Department of Registration and Education; and

WHEREAS, In 1952, when the National League for Nursing first began its accreditation program for schools of nursing, St. John's was among those who came forward to meet this new challenge; and

WHEREAS, Today, St. John's College students earn a Bachelor of Science Degree in Nursing; and

WHEREAS, St. John's College has a vision to educate nurses and health care professionals for innovative practice excellence and values-based leadership; and
