WHEREAS, From the 19th century to the present, the Rock Island Arsenal has been a part of the economic and government service history of the Quad Cities; and

WHEREAS, From an employment peak of 18,467 during the height of World War II, the arsenal's workforce has shrunk to less than half that number; and

WHEREAS, The arsenal remains a major economic engine in the region, with more than 8,500 employees and more than 70 federal and commercial tenants; the arsenal also adds some \$1 billion to the

local economy and impacts 14,000 community jobs; and

WHEREAS, The Joint Manufacturing and Technology Center at the arsenal is one of the world's largest weapons manufacturing facilities; the arsenal and its employees have repeatedly proven that, for smallquantity orders and specialty jobs, it has the expertise, equipment, and dedication to the defense of the United States that cannot be equaled in private industry; and

WHEREAS, A reduction at the Rock Island Arsenal would not only threaten the local economy, but would also jeopardize the readiness of United States forces to quickly respond in the war on terror or in any future conflict; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-SEVENTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, THE SENATE CONCURRING HEREIN, that we urge the President of the United States, the United States Congress, and the Secretary of the Department of Defense to protect the Rock Island Arsenal from any future reductions or other budget cuts; and be it further

RESOLVED, That suitable copies of this Resolution be delivered to the President of the United States, the Secretary of the United States Department of Defense, and the members of the Illinois congressional delegation.

HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION 74

Offered by Representative Currie:

WHEREAS, The future of our nation's productivity and competitiveness in the global marketplace depends on the success of all men and women; and

WHEREAS, Women have been discriminated against in education, the workplace, and society as a whole; and

WHEREAS, Women continue to earn no more than 78 cents on the dollar compared to men; and

WHEREAS, The pay gap has been shown to start as soon as one year after college; this inequality affects not only women, but their families and society as a whole; and

WHEREAS, The pay gap between women and men has long-term effects on women's economic security; such a gap affects women's Social Security earnings, their ability to save for retirement, and their children's education; and

WHEREAS, Pay equity is closely linked to the eradication of poverty and is essential to having a highly-motivated workforce; and

WHEREAS, Equal Pay Day was originated by the National Committee on Pay Equity in 1996 as a public awareness event to illustrate the gap between men's and women's wages; the day, observed in April, symbolizes how far into the year a woman must work, on average, to earn as much as a man earned the previous year, with Tuesday being the day in which women's wages catch up to men's wages from the previous week; because women earn less on average than men, they must work longer for the same amount of pay; this wage gap is even greater for most women of color; and

WHEREAS, Equal pay is a priority for all women and for our society at large; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-SEVENTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, THE SENATE CONCURRING HEREIN, that we designate April 17, 2012 as Pay Equity Day in the State of Illinois in order to raise awareness about this endemic inequity.
