HOUSE RESOLUTIONS

The following resolutions were offered and placed in the Committee on Rules.

HOUSE RESOLUTION 963

Offered by Representative Golar:

WHEREAS, Not-for-profit social service organizations provide critical assistance to the people of the State of Illinois; and

WHEREAS, In addition to providing that assistance, these organizations employ over 400,000 people in the State and are represented in each and every State legislative district; and

WHEREAS, In 2009, the State began withholding timely payment for services rendered by these organizations, causing not only funding emergencies for these organizations, but also critical service shortages for the persons who rely on those services; and

WHEREAS, These problems have been exacerbated by Public Act 97-72, which amended Section 3-2 of the State Prompt Payment Act to require payment of obligations within 90 days rather than 60 days, thus further delaying the ability of these organizations to seek payment through the State's Vendor Payment Program; and

WHEREAS, Today, the State owes not-for-profit social service organizations more than \$4 billion for services rendered; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-SEVENTH GENERAL

ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we recognize the importance of the services provided by not-for-profit social service organizations in the State and urge the Comptroller to prioritize the payment of obligations owed to these organizations; and be it further

RESOLVED, That a suitable copy of this resolution be delivered to the Comptroller.

HOUSE RESOLUTION 966

Offered by Representative William Davis:

WHEREAS, One hundred and seventeen years ago, Riverdale, the "Best Little Village in Illinois," was formed; the village is located 23 miles south of the Chicago Loop; and

WHEREAS, The Village of Riverdale is home to the State's largest butternut tree (*Juglans cinerea*), the official tree of Riverdale; and

WHEREAS, Notable and outstanding characteristics of Riverdale's urban forest are a unique diversity of Southern trees, which are common in the Chicago area, including Shumard Oaks (*Quercus shumardii*), Sweet gums (*Liquidambar styracflua*), Cumber Trees (*Magnolia acuminata*), Flowering Dogwoods (*Cornus florida*), and White Basswoods (*Tilia hereophylla*); the village also has outstanding fall color displayed on major streets by Sugar Maples (*Acer saccharinum*), Red Maples (*Acer rubrum*), White Ashes (*Fraxinus americana*), and Sweet gums (*Liquidambar styraciflua*), as well as a rare bird migration through the urban forest of the east Ivanhoe section; all of this activity is packed into a village with a residential population of 16,050; and

WHEREAS, The Village of Riverdale's Board of Trustees created a Riverdale Tree Commission in 2002, composed of volunteer residents and an arborist; the commission's purpose is to design and implement the Village Tree Program and conduct community-wide educational efforts to publicize the benefits of trees; and

WHEREAS, The National Arbor Day Foundation has recognized the Village of Riverdale as a "Tree City USA" community for 11 years, honoring the commitment of the village to provide a comprehensive community forestry program; and

WHEREAS, The majestic urban forest cools the air, provides oxygen, shades homes and outdoor activities from the sun, invites song birds into backyards and gardens, lines streets (where the trees reach a height of 100 feet and are over 3 feet wide), muffles noise, protects the soil, improves air quality, provides beauty, and serve as a windbreak; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-SEVENTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we support the Village of Riverdale Tree Commission's continued active participation in shaping Riverdale, the "Best Little Village In Illinois", into a "Green" community; and be it further

RESOLVED, That a suitable copy of this resolution be presented to the Riverdale Tree Commission as a symbol of our esteem and respect.
