Whereas the House of Representatives has learned that Tony Leone, through one quick, calm and decisive act of heroism, saved the life of Ms. Adeline Malinski; and whereas on the afternoon of March 6, 1985, Adeline Malinski was in Springfield to attend a two day seminar of legislative district office personnel and was having lunch at the Rathskeller dining room in the Capitol Building, when she suddenly choked while eating; and

whereas while others around were near panic, Tony Leone, our friend and Assistant House Clerk, who has had no formal training in lifesaving techniques, very calmly, forcefully and instinctively applied the Heimlich maneuver to save Ms. Malinski, and his action led to dislodging of the food so that she could breathe normally again; and whereas every one at the scene was aware that Tony Leone did, in fact, save Ms. Malinski's life, and that had been chaotic and stressful minutes turned into a happy ending because of Tony's heroism; and whereas Tony's calm in responding to an emergency situation turned to nervousness afterwards when he suddenly realized what could have been. Therefore, be it resolved by the House of Representatives of the 84th General Assembly of the State of Illinois, that we commend Tony Leone, Assistant House Clerk, for his act of heroism on March 6, 1985, when his quick, alert and calm action saved the life of Ms. Adeline Malinski. We hail his quickness of mind in instinctively applying a lifesaving technique to save Ms. Malinski from choking, and we thereby honor our good friend and associate, for it was his good deed that saved a precious life, and be it further resolved that a suitable copy of this Preamble and Resolution be presented to Tony Leone."

Speaker Greiman: "The Gentleman from Cook, Mr. Piel, on the Resolution. Mr. Piel."

Piel: "Thank you, Mr. Speaker. Needless to say, I was very surprised when my two legislative aides came up to the office and I heard of what happened yesterday. Many times, you know, we are not prepared when an emergency arises, and this lady had started changing color and her eyes started going into the back of her head when Tony rushed over. I'd heard from the people that were down there that he was really the only cool head that prevailed. Everybody was in

a mass state of shock and panic when this happened. And my legislative aide, needless to say, Tony, appreciates you for saving her life. Thank you."

Speaker Greiman: "The Gentleman from Cook, Mr. Piel, has moved for the adoption of House Resolution 91. And on that, Mr. Vinson."

Vinson: "Thank you, Mr. Speaker, Ladies and Gentlemen of the House. In this one exceptional situation, I would request leave of the Body for a special thing to be done with this Resolution, and that would be for Jack O'Brien to be added as a Cosponsor."

Speaker Greiman: "Mr. Ewing, the Gentleman from Livingston."

Ewing: "Is this an Agreed Resolution?"

Speaker Greiman: "Well, we'll see how the debate goes."

Ewing: "I mean, no one has contacted us on this side of the aisle about whether we wanted to agree to this Resolution."

Speaker Greiman: "We're going to ram it down your throats."

Ewing: "Well, as long as we have Tony, we always know we can get back."

Regan: "(Coughs) Thank you very much."

Matijevich: "Yes, I think all the Members should be on this Resolution, and at the urging of Jack O'Brien, I want to tell everybody that I wrote that Resolution, so I happily commend Tony. You know, very often, we don't understand how precious life is, and it's easy for any of us when something like that happens to just get so nervous that we can't do anything, and I'm sure Tony today is wondering how he did it. But the... You know, it's so... What makes this something that we all ought to recognize the fact that Tony has never had any training in that type of life-saving
