Speaker Breslin: "Mr. Clerk, withdraw Amendments 6 thru 10. Are there any further Amendments?"

Clerk O'Brien: "Floor Amendment #11 offered by, Representative

Speaker Breslin: "Representative Mautino."

Mautino: "Thank you, very much, Madam Speaker. Amendment #11, provides for \$16,000 from GRF to the Department of Employment Security for those ordinary and contingent expenses for the regional office, which is the...lease in equipment at the facility and I move for its adoption."
