Speaker McPike: "House will come to order. House will come to order. The Chaplain for today is Reverend Tom Palmer of the South Fork Church of Christ in Rochester, Illinois. ELIGIBILITY FOR OFFICE No person shall be eligible to be a Judge or Associate Judge unless that person he is a United States citizen, a licensed attorney-at-law of this State for at least 10 years before his or her term begins, and a resident of the unit which selects him or her. No change in the boundaries of a unit shall affect the tenure in office of a Judge or Associate Judge incumbent at the time of such change.
