Speaker McPike: "The House will come to order. The House will come to order. We'll be led in the prayer today by Representative Deering."

Deering: "Bless this House, O Lord. We pray, make it safe by night and day."

Speaker McPike: "We'll be led in the Pledge of Allegiance by Representative Morrow."

Morrow - et al: "I pledge allegiance to the flag of the United States of America, and to the Republic for which it stands, one nation under God, indivisible, with liberty and justice for all."

Speaker McPike: "Roll Call for Attendance. Representative Kubik."

Kubik: "Yes. Thank you, Mr. Speaker. Let the record reflect that all the Republicans are present."

Speaker McPike: "I think the record will reflect that you have no excused absences, is that correct? Mr. Kubik."

Kubik: "I'm sorry, Mr. Speaker, you are correct. Representative McAuliffe is excused today."

Speaker McPike: "All right. Representative Steczo."

Steczko: "Thank you, Mr. Speaker. There's no excused absences on the Democratic side."

Speaker McPike: "Thank you. Mr. Clerk, take the record. Ninety eight Members answering the roll call, a quorum is present. Speaker Madigan."

Madigan: "Mr. Speaker and Ladies and Gentlemen, having convened, our plan is to stand at ease until 6:00 o'clock tonight. I'm waiting to hear from the Governor so that we can go back to meet with the Governor and continue the negotiations on the budget but I'm advised that he is doing

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parades today. So, it may be awhile before I hear from him. But, we'll stand at ease until 6:00 o'clock."

Speaker McPike: "Representative Daniels."

Daniels: "Well, Mr. Speaker, Ladies and Gentlemen of the House.

We are available to the other side of the aisle to sit down and go through their budget, and their plans at their convenience. So, we are here and ready for the Speaker to call and present his budget to us. We'll be happy to work with him in order to craft a budget that's acceptable to him. Behalf of the House, I think we should continue our work and I would be happy to sit down with the Speaker and do just that. As far as, the Governor, I know he is signing the Baby Richard Bill in Chicago. I'm sure he'll return and I think that it's understood that the Leader's will meet at 4:00 o'clock as when the last discussion we had, so from our vantage point we're prepared to meet approximately at 4:00 o'clock with the Governor and the other Leaders."

Speaker McPike: "Anything further? Speaker Madigan."

Madigan: "I want to thank, Mr. Daniels for telling me about the 4:00 o'clock meeting because that's the first I've heard about that, so, thank you very much. And, I do regret that the Senator's aren't here. But we're here at the call of the Governor and we're waiting for him to return to the building. So, thanks, again."

Speaker McPike: "The House will stand at ease until approximately 6:00 p.m."

Speaker McPike: "The House will come to order. Representative Granberg moves that the House stands adjourned until tomorrow at hour of 6:00 p.m. All in favor say 'aye';

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opposed, 'no'. The 'ayes' have it and the House stands adjourned. The House stands adjourned. The Democrats...the Democrats will have a caucus immediately in Room 114, do the Republicans wish a caucus? The Republicans wish a roll call...caucus? We've already adjourned. Well we've already adjourned. All right the House has adjourned, does anyone...yes, Representative Wojcik."

Wojcik: "Mr. Speaker, I was recorded on the roll call at noon and I was not here. So, I would like to be..."

Speaker McPike: "Well, as long as you have signed a slip that's no problem at all."

Wojcik: "Oh, is that okay? All right."

Speaker McPike: "Yes, sure. Any Republican caucus, does anybody want a caucus? Do the Republicans wish a caucus?"
