- Speaker Brunsvold: "The House shall wait for a quorum, and I believe we have waited almost fifteen minutes now. It is apparent that a quorum is not present. Representative Curran, for what reason do you seek recognition?"
- Curran: "Thank you, Mr. Speaker. There is important business for this First Special Session to consider that should not be delayed, and therefore, I move to adjourn the House until Wednesday, October 6, 1993, at the hour of 12:00 noon."
- Speaker Brunsvold: "All those in favor of the Motion say 'aye'. Those opposed say 'no'. The 'ayes' have it, and the House stands adjourned for the First Special Session until Wednesday, October the 6th, 1993, at the hour of noon. The House stands adjourned."
