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Speaker Hannig: "And now we come into Session for regular Session. So, we're gonna begin as... with the use of the Attendance Roll Call in regular Session. Is there leave to use the Attendance Roll Call for the First Special Session? Leave is granted and the First Special Session Roll Call will be used and a quorum is present. And the House stands ready to do business. Mr. Clerk, read the Agreed Resolutions."

House Resolution 570, offered by Representative Tracy. House Resolution 571, offered by Representative Yarbrough. House Resolution 572, offered by Representative May. House Resolution 573, offered by Representative Dunkin. House Resolution 574, offered by Representative Burke. House Resolution 576, offered by Representative Currie. House Resolution 580, offered by Representative Smith. House Resolution 581, offered by Representative Washington. Resolution 582, offered by Representative Bill Mitchell. House Resolution 583, offered by Representative Jefferson. House Resolution 584, offered by Representative Granberg. House Resolution 585, offered by Representative Granberg. And House Resolution 586, offered by Representative Flider." Speaker Hannig: "Representative Currie moves for the adoption of the Agreed Resolutions. All in favor say 'aye'; opposed 'nay'. - Mitchell, J.: "Thank you, Gary. I appreciate that. I... I think it'll be helpful for all of the Members to get a compare and contrast between those two systems. Thank you."
- Speaker Hannig: "Representative Flowers, do you have an announcement?"
- Flowers: "Thank you, Mr. Speaker. I would like to remind all the Members that thanks to Dr. Quinn Young there will be a showing of the movie, <u>Sicko</u>, tonight at the Parkway Point Theater. And that's out by the Indigo Restaurant and all Legislators, their staff, and the media is welcome. So, again, the movie starts at seven at the Parkway Point Theater. Thank you very much and I'll see you there, staff, media, and Legislators. Thank you."
- Speaker Hannig: "And just a reminder after we adjourn that at 3:30 there'll be a meeting at the Governor's mansion for all those who are interested in budget negotiations.  - RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-FIFTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, THE SENATE CONCURRING HEREIN, that there shall be submitted to the electors of the State for adoption or rejection at the general election next occurring at least 6 months after the adoption of this resolution a proposition to add Section 17.5 to Article I of the Illinois Constitution as follows:

SECTION 17.5. RIGHT TO DECENT HOUSING

- (a) All persons shall have the right to decent, safe, sanitary, and affordable housing, which right shall not be denied or abridged by the State or by any subdivision of the State.
- (b) The General Assembly may provide by law for the enforcement and implementation of this Section.

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This Constitutional Amendment takes effect upon being declared adopted in accordance with Section 7 of the Illinois Constitutional Amendment Act. There being no further business, the House Perfunctory Session will stand adjourned."
