RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-SEVENTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, THE SENATE CONCURRING HEREIN, that there shall be submitted to the electors of the State for adoption or rejection at the general election next occurring at least 6 months after the adoption of this resolution a proposition to amend Sections 7, 11, and 12 of Article VI of the Illinois Constitution as follows:

ARTICLE VI

THE JUDICIARY

SECTION 7. JUDICIAL CIRCUITS

(a) The State shall be divided into Judicial Circuits consisting of one or more counties. The First Judicial District shall constitute a Judicial Circuit. The Judicial

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Circuits within the other Judicial Districts shall be as provided by law. Circuits composed of more than one county shall be compact and of contiguous counties.

- (b) Each Judicial Circuit shall have one Circuit Court with such number of Circuit Judges as provided by law. Unless otherwise provided by law, there shall be at least one Circuit Judge from each county.
- (c) Circuit Judges in each circuit shall select by secret ballot a Chief Judge from their number to serve at their pleasure. Subject to the authority of the Supreme Court, the Chief Judge shall have general administrative authority over his court, including authority to provide for divisions, general or specialized, and for appropriate times and places of holding court.

SECTION 11. ELIGIBILITY FOR OFFICE

No person shall be eligible to be a Judge or Associate Judge unless he is a United States citizen, a licensed attorney-at-law of this State, and a resident of the unit from which he is selected. No change in the boundaries of a unit shall affect the tenure in office of a Judge or Associate Judge incumbent at the time of such change.

SECTION 12. SELECTION AND RETENTION

- (a) Supreme, Appellate and Circuit Judges shall be nominated as provided in this Section.
- (b) The office of a Judge shall be vacant upon his death, resignation, retirement, removal, or upon the conclusion of his term without retention in office. Whenever an additional Appellate or Circuit Judge is authorized by law,

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the office shall be filled in the manner provided for filling a vacancy in that office.

(c) Nonpartisan judicial commissions whose duty it shall be to nominate and submit to the Governor names of persons for appointment as provided in subsection (c-5) are hereby established and shall be organized on the following basis: (i) for vacancies in the office of Supreme Court Judge, there shall be one such commission; (ii) for vacancies in the office Appellate Court Judge, there shall be one such commission for each Judicial District; and (iii) vacancies in the office of Circuit Judge there shall be one such commission for each Judicial Circuit. Each commission shall consist of 4 attorneys and 4 non-attorneys. The 4 attorney members for the Supreme Court judicial commission shall be selected by the attorneys who are licensed to practice law in this State. The 4 attorney members of each Appellate or Circuit Court judicial commission shall be selected by the attorneys who are licensed to practice law in this State and who reside within the appropriate District or Circuit. The 4 non-attorney members of each judicial commission shall be appointed as follows: member appointed by the President of the Senate; one member appointed by the Minority Leader of the Senate; one member appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives; and one member appointed by the Minority Leader of the House of Representatives. Vacancies shall be filled for the unexpired term by the appointing authority. A person is not eligible to serve on a commission if he or she (i) is a federal, State, or local elected official and receives

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compensation for services rendered as an elected official holds any office or official position political party. Service in the State Militia or Armed Forces of the United States for a period of time determined by Supreme Court rule does not disqualify a person from service on a commission. Each member of commission shall be subject to ethics and economic disclosure requirements as provided by law. Members of judicial commissions shall serve for terms of 6 years. No member may be appointed or reappointed to a judicial commission for a period of 3 years after the expiration of his or her 6-year term. No member may serve on more than one judicial commission at a time. No member of a judicial commission may be appointed to judicial office while serving on a commission or for a period of 3 years after his or her term on the commission has ended. Each commission shall select a chairperson from among its members. The chairperson shall serve as chairperson for a term of 3 years or until the expiration of his or her term of office as member, whichever occurs sooner. a commission may conduct investigations, meetings, hearings, and may employ staff members as necessary to duties. The members its of anv commission perform established under this subsection shall receive no salary or other compensation for their services, but they shall be reimbursed for necessary expenses incurred while actually engaged in the discharge of their official duties from moneys appropriated for that purpose. All such commissions shall be administered, and all elections provided for under

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this subsection shall be held and regulated, under such rules as the Supreme Court shall promulgate.

(c-5) Whenever a vacancy occurs in the office of Supreme, Appellate, or Circuit Judge, the Administrative Director of the Illinois Courts shall promptly notify the applicable nonpartisan iudicial commission established subsection (c) of this Section. Within 60 days after receiving that notice, the commission shall submit to the Governor a list of 3 nominees who are qualified for review by the commission. Nominations shall be submitted to the Governor only upon concurrence of not less than two-thirds of all members of the commission. The list shall be in alphabetical order. The Governor shall make the list public. Not less than 28 days nor more than 56 days after receiving the list, the Governor shall fill the vacancy by appointing one of the 3 nominees. If the Governor fails to appoint any of the nominees within 56 days after the list nominees is submitted, the nonpartisan commission making the nomination shall appoint one of the nominees to fill the vacancy. As used in this subsection, "qualified for review by the commission" means that the nominee, by his or her character, temperament, professional aptitude, experience, and commitment to equal justice under the law, is deemed by the commission to be well qualified to fit the vacancy. All such qualified persons have the right to be considered for selection by the commission free from discrimination on the basis of race, color, creed, national ancestry, or gender. A commission may not include on its list of 3 nominees any person who is on another list

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submitted to the Governor to fill a vacancy in the same judicial office.

- (d) Not less than six months before the general election preceding the expiration of his term of office, a Supreme, Appellate or Circuit Judge who has been appointed or elected to that office may file in the office of Secretary of State a declaration of candidacy to succeed himself. The Secretary of State, not less than 63 days before the election, shall certify the Judge's candidacy to the proper election officials. The names of Judges seeking retention shall be submitted to the electors, separately and without party designation, on the sole question whether each Judge shall be retained in office for another term. The retention elections shall be conducted at general elections in the appropriate Judicial District, for Supreme and Appellate Judges, and in the circuit for The affirmative vote of three-fifths Judges. of the electors voting on the question shall elect the Judge to the office for a term commencing on the first Monday in December following his election.
- (e)A law reducing the number of Appellate or Circuit Judges shall be without prejudice to the right of the Judges affected to seek retention in office. A reduction shall become effective when a vacancy occurs in the affected unit.

SCHEDULE

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-SEVENTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, THE SENATE CONCURRING HEREIN, that there shall be submitted to the electors of the State for adoption or rejection at the general election next occurring at least 6 months after the adoption of this resolution a proposition to amend the Illinois Constitution in Article IV by adding Section 2.5 as follows:

ARTICLE IV

THE LEGISLATURE

SECTION 2.5. TERM LIMITS

- (a)A person may not serve as a Representative for more than 3 terms of office that begin on or after the date that this Section is declared adopted.
- (b)A person may not serve as a Senator for more than 2 terms of office that begin on or after the date that this Section is declared adopted.
- (c)A person is considered to serve a term of office for the purpose of this Section if the person is elected or appointed to serve any portion of the term.

SCHEDULE

This Constitutional Amendment takes effect upon being declared adopted in accordance with Section 7 of the Illinois Constitutional Amendment Act and applies to the election of members of the General Assembly in the first

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general election to occur after this Amendment is declared adopted and thereafter. This Constitutional Amendment does not, however, affect the terms of members of the General Assembly elected before this amendment is declared adopted.
