Speaker Riley: "The hour of 10:00 having come and gone, the House of Representatives of the State of Illinois will come to order. Members and guests are asked to be in your seats, refrain from starting all laptop computers, silence all cell phones, and rise for the invocation and Pledge of Allegiance. We'll be led in prayer today by Reverend Dave Price, who is with the Hope United Methodist Church in Joliet, Illinois. Reverend Price is the guest of Representative Manley. Reverend Price."

Revered Price: "Let us pray. Oh Creator and Mighty God, You have promised strength for the weak, rest for the laborers, light for the way, grace for the trials, help from above, unfailing sympathy, and undying love. Oh Creator and Mighty God, help us to continue in Your promise. Let us ask Your blessing now upon this Legislature as they do the people's work. Guide them and be with them, we pray this today, Amen."

Speaker Riley: "Thank you. We'll be led in the Pledge by Representative Will Guzzardi."

Guzzardi - et al: "I pledge allegiance to the flag of the United States of America and to the republic for which it stands, one nation under God, indivisible, with liberty and justice for all."

Speaker Riley: "Roll Call for Attendance. Leader Currie."

Currie: "Thank you, Speaker. Please let the record reflect the excused absences of Representatives Acevedo, Drury, Gabel, Gordon-Booth, and Mautino."

Speaker Riley: "Thank you. Leader Bellock."

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Bellock: "Thank you very much, Mr. Speaker. And please let the record reflect, we have excused absences for Representative Ives, Leitch, Poe, Unes, and Sommer."

Speaker Riley: "Thank you."

Bellock: "Thank..."

Speaker Riley: "Mr. Clerk, take the record. With 105 Members present... 106 Members present, we have a quorum and are ready to do the business of the people of the State of Illinois. Representative Fine, for what reason do you rise?"

Fine: "Point of personal privilege, please."

Speaker Riley: "Make your point."

Fine: "I'd like to introduce my Page for the day, Gracie Holmes from Blaine Elementary School in Chicago, and her parents, Tamara and Todd Holmes, who are up in the gallery."

Speaker Riley: "Thank you very much for coming here to Springfield. Enjoy your day. Representative Welch, for what reason do you rise?"

Welch: "Thank you, Mr. Speaker. Point of personal privilege."

Speaker Riley: "Make your point."

Welch: "I'd just like the House chamber to please recognize my Honorary Page for the day, Mr. Donald Strickland. Let's give him a round of applause."

Speaker Riley: "Thank you very much. Enjoy your day in Springfield. Representative Will Davis, for what reason do you rise?"

Davis, W.: "For a point of personal privilege."

Speaker Riley: "Make your point."

Davis, W.: "Thank you very much, Mr. Speaker. Ladies and Gentlemen, I just want to publicly thank the faculty, staff,

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and Principle Davis at Franklin Middle School here in Springfield. They were kind enough to invite me to their school yesterday where I had the opportunity to speak to several classes about the importance of black history during their celebration of Black History Month. And I would like to also thank Mona Martin, who's one of our good friends down here and lobbyist and advocates, for inviting me to come to her son's school for that purpose. Thank you very much."

Speaker Riley: "Thank you very much. Thank you for your interest in education. Representative Sims, for what reason do you rise?"

Sims: "Point of personal privilege."

Speaker Riley: "Your point."

Sims: "Thank you, Mr. Speaker. Yesterday, Illinois was blessed by a visit by President Obama, the Illinois House District #34, in particular. Moffitt: "Mr. Speaker, I rise to a point of personal privilege."

Speaker Riley: "Make your point."

Moffitt: "Could I have the attention of the House, please?"

Speaker Riley: "Members... Members, please give Representative Moffitt your attention. Shh."

Moffitt: "Mr. Speaker, are there any Bills on the Calendar that Representative Brauer has scheduled on the Calendar there? I just thought maybe..."

Speaker Riley: "No. No, there are not."

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Moffitt: "Well, I thought maybe today we'd have an opportunity to talk to him about his last Bill, but if there's none on there, I would still like to take a moment with Representative Brauer 'cause... "

Speaker Riley: "Rep..."

Moffitt: "as of... if we don't adjourn by noon, he's going to be leaving today and he..."

Speaker Riley: "Representative Moffitt, you have the floor. And so, you go right ahead."

Moffitt: "Okay. We have a colleague who's leaving after 13 years of service here in the House chamber and he's been a tremendous asset to us and is moving to a position that will continue to work with all of us throughout the State of Illinois. It's with mixed feelings that I tell you a row mate back here is leaving, and... but I look... want to say thanks for your service, congratulations on the position that you're going to, and we wish you the very best. You've been a tremendous asset here in the House, so I would... perhaps somebody has something else that wants to comment, but Representative Brauer, thank you. It's been a pleasure and honor to serve with you and keep up the good work. You're going to continue to work for the citizens of Illinois, I know, in your position at IDOT. So, thank you very much."

Speaker Riley: "Representative Brauer, your name was mentioned in... not debate, but the previous statement. Would you like to give a statement to your colleagues?"

Brauer: "Well, thank you. I'm sorry. Let me get rid of my gum first. Sorry, Mr. Mapes, that wasn't funny. And I actually have it on the front of my... stet is with great honor and..."

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that I have come to the House Floor and served this past 12 years and... Can... can I leave now? No, there's a lot of friendships I was told when I came here that this will be the most fun you've had since college, and I didn't know if that would be legal or not, but it really has been an enjoyable, very fast 13 years. So, I'm going to be working with administration. I'm going to wait for their announcement, hopefully they're going to announce this thing today. That I will probably see a lot of you more in the future than I have and I look forward to working with you. As I told a good friend of mine, Mayor Davlin of Springfield, that my mom was a Democrat and I loved her. So, it certainly... it's going to be, you know, my door is always going to be open. I certainly welcome your visits, your phone calls. And I look forward to working with you at... in a different capacity in the future. So, again, thank you. It's been a pleasure."

Speaker Riley: "Representative Will Davis, for what reason do you rise?"

Davis, W.: "Thank you, Mr. Speaker. I just want to offer my congratulations to my colleague, Rich. He was one of my classmates 12... 13 years ago. When you walk in the door, he's always been someone who's always had a kind word to say, a friendly handshake, good... good kind words, outstanding and excellent individual. And for a minute I tried to... I was trying to figure out who was ahead of me in the alphabet so, upon his departure, that means my plate number goes up one and I really... really appreciate that. Thank you very much."

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-NINTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, THE SENATE CONCURRING HEREIN, that there shall be submitted to the electors of the State for adoption or rejection at the general election next occurring at least 6 months after the adoption of this resolution a proposition to add Section 11 to Article IX of the Illinois Constitution as follows:

ARTICLE IX

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REVENUE

SECTION 11. TAX FOR EDUCATION

Notwithstanding subsection (a) of Section 3 of this Article, and in addition to any other tax, a tax shall be imposed on individuals in an amount equal to 3% of income greater than \$1,000,000 for the taxable year. All revenue collected pursuant to this Section shall be distributed to school districts solely on a per pupil basis. The General Assembly by law shall provide for the implementation and enforcement of this Section.

SCHEDULE

This Constitutional Amendment takes effect upon being declared adopted in accordance with Section 7 of the Illinois Constitutional Amendment Act and applies to taxable years beginning on or after January 1, 2017.
