A BILL FOR

1 AN ACT concerning safety.

2 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois,**  
3 **represented in the General Assembly:**

4 Section 5. The Hazardous Materials Emergency Act is amended  
5 by changing Sections 5.03 and 5.07 as follows:

6 (430 ILCS 50/5.03) (from Ch. 127, par. 1255.03)

7 Sec. 5.03. To establish a program, ~~with the advice and~~  
8 ~~recommendations of the Board,~~ for utilization of the State's  
9 communication systems (a) to accept telephone reports of  
10 accidents involving hazardous materials; (b) to relate to the  
11 emergency agencies in the vicinity of the accident any  
12 information available about the location and type of accident,  
13 nature of the hazardous material involved, and any precautions  
14 which should be taken in handling the material; and (c) to  
15 report to and coordinate with the other State agencies or  
16 departments which might be knowledgeable about the type of  
17 accident or the hazardous material involved and with the United  
18 States Department of Transportation.

19 All files, records and data gathered by the Agency or the  
20 Department under this Act shall be made available to the  
21 Department of Public Health pursuant to the Illinois Health and  
22 Hazardous Substances Registry Act.
