SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

30 ILCS 105/5.886 new 110 ILCS 947/23 new

Amends the State Finance Act to create the First-Year College Promise Fund as a special fund in the State treasury. Amends the Higher Education Student Assistance Act. Requires the Illinois Student Assistance Commission to implement and administer a program to award First-Year College Promise grants to low-income Illinois residents seeking an associate degree from a public community college or a bachelor's degree from a public university. Provides that a First-Year College Promise grant shall be equal to the cost of tuition and mandatory fees at the public institution for 2 semesters of enrollment. Sets forth the terms and conditions of the program.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

- 12 (a) In this Section, "public institution" means the
- 13 <u>University of Illinois, Southern Illinois University, Chicago</u>
- 14 State University, Eastern Illinois University, Governors State
- University, Illinois State University, Northeastern Illinois
- 16 University, Northern Illinois University, Western Illinois
- 17 University, any public community college in this State, or any
- other public university, college, or community college now or
- 19 hereafter established or authorized by the General Assembly.
- 20 (b) The Commission shall implement and administer a program
- 21 to award First-Year College Promise grants to all eligible

3	and conditions shall apply to the program:

- (1) To be eligible for a grant, a student must be admitted to and enrolled full-time, as an Illinois resident, in a public institution in the fall semester after receiving a high school diploma or a certificate of high school graduation from an approved high school or a high school equivalency certificate and must have a family income at or below the poverty quidelines updated periodically in the Federal Register by the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services under the authority of 42 U.S.C. 9902(2).
- (2) Students applying for a grant shall complete the First-Year College Promise grant application and the Free Application for Federal Student Aid.
- Assembly from the First-Year College Promise Fund, a grant shall be equal to the cost of tuition and mandatory fees at the public institution, less all other student aid, for 2 semesters of enrollment. Student aid shall be credited first to the student's tuition and mandatory fees.
- (c) In awarding grants under this Section, the Commission shall, by rule, develop the selection criteria for students.
- (d) The First-Year College Promise Fund is created as a special fund in the State treasury. The Fund shall consist of

- 1 money appropriated by the General Assembly. All money in the
- 2 Fund shall only be used, subject to appropriation, by the
- 3 <u>Commission for the purposes of this Section.</u>
