Amend Senate Bill 339 by replacing 2 everything after the enacting clause with the following: 3 "Section 5. The Nurse Practice Act is amended by changing 4 Sections 50-10, 50-75, and 60-35 and by adding Section 80-65 as 5 6 follows: 7 (225 ILCS 65/50-10) (was 225 ILCS 65/5-10) 8 (Section scheduled to be repealed on January 1, 2028) Sec. 50-10. Definitions. Each of the following terms, when 9 used in this Act, shall have the meaning ascribed to it in this 10 Section, except where the context clearly indicates otherwise: 11 "Academic year" means the customary annual schedule of 12 courses at a college, university, or approved school, 13 customarily regarded as the school year as distinguished from 14 15 the calendar year.

"Address of record" means the designated address recorded

- 1 by the Department in the applicant's or licensee's application
- 2 file or license file as maintained by the Department's
- 3 licensure maintenance unit.
- 4 "Advanced practice registered nurse" or "APRN" means a
- 5 person who has met the qualifications for a (i) certified nurse
- 6 midwife (CNM); (ii) certified nurse practitioner (CNP); (iii)
- 7 certified registered nurse anesthetist (CRNA); or (iv)
- 8 clinical nurse specialist (CNS) and has been licensed by the
- 9 Department. All advanced practice registered nurses licensed
- 10 and practicing in the State of Illinois shall use the title
- 11 APRN and may use specialty credentials CNM, CNP, CRNA, or CNS
- 12 after their name. All advanced practice registered nurses may
- 13 only practice in accordance with national certification and
- 14 this Act.
- 15 "Advisory Board" means the Illinois Nursing Workforce
- 16 Center Advisory Board.
- "Approved program of professional nursing education" and
- 18 "approved program of practical nursing education" are programs
- of professional or practical nursing, respectively, approved
- 20 by the Department under the provisions of this Act.
- 21 "Board" means the Board of Nursing appointed by the
- 22 Secretary.
- "Center" means the Illinois Nursing Workforce Center.
- "Collaboration" means a process involving 2 or more health
- 25 care professionals working together, each contributing one's
- 26 respective area of expertise to provide more comprehensive

- 1 patient care.
- 2 "Competence" means an expected and measurable level of
- performance that integrates knowledge, skills, abilities, and 3
- 4 judgment based on established scientific knowledge
- 5 expectations for nursing practice.
- 6 "Comprehensive nursing assessment" means the gathering of
- information about the patient's physiological, psychological, 7
- 8 sociological, and spiritual status on an ongoing basis by a
- 9 registered professional nurse and is the first step in
- 10 implementing and guiding the nursing plan of care.
- 11 "Consultation" means the process whereby an advanced
- practice registered nurse seeks the advice or opinion of 12
- 13 another health care professional.
- "Credentialed" means the process of assessing and 14
- 15 validating the qualifications of a health care professional.
- 16 "Dentist" means a person licensed to practice dentistry
- under the Illinois Dental Practice Act. 17
- 18 "Department" means the Department of Financial
- 19 Professional Regulation.
- 20 "Email address of record" means the designated email
- 2.1 address recorded by the Department in the applicant's
- 22 application file or the licensee's license file, as maintained
- 23 by the Department's licensure maintenance unit.
- 24 "Focused nursing assessment" means an appraisal of an
- 25 individual's status and current situation, contributing to the
- 26 comprehensive nursing assessment performed by the registered

1 professional nurse or advanced practice registered nurse or the assessment by the physician assistant, physician, dentist, 2 3 podiatric physician, or other licensed health 4 professional, as determined by the Department, supporting 5 ongoing data collection, and deciding who needs to be informed of the information and when to inform. 6

"Full practice authority" means the authority of an advanced practice registered nurse licensed in Illinois and certified as a nurse practitioner, clinical nurse specialist, or nurse midwife to practice without a written collaborative agreement and:

- (1) to be fully accountable to patients for the quality of advanced nursing care rendered;
- (2) to be fully accountable for recognizing limits of knowledge and experience and for planning for the management of situations beyond the advanced practice registered nurse's expertise; the full practice authority for advanced practice registered nurses includes accepting referrals from, consulting with, collaborating with, or referring to other health care professionals as warranted by the needs of the patient; and
- (3) to possess the authority to prescribe medications, including Schedule II through V controlled substances, as provided in Section 65-43.
- 25 "Hospital affiliate" means a corporation, partnership, 26 joint venture, limited liability company, or similar

1 organization, other than a hospital, that is devoted primarily 2 to the provision, management, or support of health care services and that directly or indirectly controls, 3 4 controlled by, or is under common control of the hospital. For 5 the purposes of this definition, "control" means having at least an equal or a majority ownership or membership interest. 6 A hospital affiliate shall be 100% owned or controlled by any 7 combination of hospitals, their parent corporations, or 8 9 physicians licensed to practice medicine in all its branches in 10 Illinois. "Hospital affiliate" does not include a health maintenance 11 organization regulated under the Health Maintenance Organization Act. 12

"Impaired nurse" means a nurse licensed under this Act who is unable to practice with reasonable skill and safety because of a physical or mental disability as evidenced by a written determination or written consent based on clinical evidence, including loss of motor skills, abuse of drugs or alcohol, or a psychiatric disorder, of sufficient degree to diminish his or her ability to deliver competent patient care.

"License-pending advanced practice registered nurse" means a registered professional nurse who has completed all requirements for licensure as an advanced practice registered nurse except the certification examination and has applied to take the next available certification exam and received a temporary permit from the Department.

"License-pending registered nurse" means a person who has

- passed the Department-approved registered nurse licensure exam 1
- and has applied for a license from the Department. A 2
- 3 license-pending registered nurse shall use the title "RN lic
- 4 pend" on all documentation related to nursing practice.
- 5 "Nursing intervention" means any treatment based on
- 6 clinical nursing judgment or knowledge that a nurse performs.
- An individual or entity shall not mandate that a registered 7
- 8 professional nurse delegate nursing interventions if the
- 9 registered professional nurse determines it is inappropriate
- 10 to do so. A nurse shall not be subject to disciplinary or any
- 11 other adverse action for refusing to delegate a nursing
- intervention based on patient safety. 12
- "Physician" means a person licensed to practice medicine in 13
- all its branches under the Medical Practice Act of 1987. 14
- 15 "Podiatric physician" means a person licensed to practice
- 16 podiatry under the Podiatric Medical Practice Act of 1987.
- "Practical nurse" or "licensed practical nurse" means a 17
- 18 person who is licensed as a practical nurse under this Act and
- practices practical nursing as defined in this Act. Only a 19
- 20 practical nurse licensed under this Act is entitled to use the
- title "licensed practical nurse" and the abbreviation 21
- "L.P.N.". 22
- 23 "Practical nursing" means the performance of nursing
- 24 interventions requiring the nursing knowledge, judgment, and
- 25 skill acquired by means of completion of an approved practical
- 26 nursing education program. Practical nursing includes

1 assisting in the nursing process under the guidance of a registered professional nurse 2 or an advanced practice 3 registered nurse. The practical nurse may work under the 4 direction of a licensed physician, dentist, podiatric 5 physician, or other health care professional determined by the 6 Department.

"Privileged" means the authorization granted by the governing body of a healthcare facility, agency, organization to provide specific patient care services within well-defined limits, based on qualifications reviewed in the credentialing process.

"Registered Nurse" or "Registered Professional Nurse" means a person who is licensed as a professional nurse under this Act and practices nursing as defined in this Act. Only a registered nurse licensed under this Act is entitled to use the titles "registered nurse" and "registered professional nurse" and the abbreviation, "R.N.".

"Registered professional nursing practice" means scientific process founded on a professional body of knowledge that includes, but is not limited to, the protection, promotion, and optimization of health and abilities, prevention of illness and injury, the administration of medications and treatments prescribed by a physician, dentist, podiatric physician, <u>licensed optometrist</u>, <u>physician</u> assistant, or advanced practice registered nurse, development and implementation of the nursing plan of care, facilitation of

20	safely carried out by the person the professional

defined by the Department by rule.

- judgment, or decision making, as defined by the Department by 2
- 3 rule.
- "Unencumbered license" means a license issued in good 4
- 5 standing.
- "Written 6 collaborative agreement" means а written
- agreement between an advanced practice registered nurse and a 7
- collaborating physician, dentist, or podiatric physician 8
- 9 pursuant to Section 65-35.

- determined that the patient's or individual's clinical status 22
- 23 is stable and expected to improve or the patient's or
- 24 individual's deteriorating condition is expected to follow a
- 25 known or expected course.

- (b) This Section authorizes a registered professional nurse or advanced practice registered nurse to:
 - (1) delegate tasks and nursing interventions to other registered professional nurses, licensed practical nurses, and other unlicensed personnel based on the comprehensive nursing assessment that includes, but is not limited to:
 - (A) the stability and condition of the patient;
 - (B) the potential for harm;
- 13 (C) the complexity of the nursing intervention to 14 be delegated;
 - (D) the predictability of outcomes; and
- 16 (E) competency of the individual to whom the nursing intervention is delegated; 17
 - delegate medication administration to other licensed nurses;
 - in community-based or in-home care settings, delegate tasks and selected nursing tasks, as defined by the Department by rule, which may include delegating delegate the administration of medication (limited to oral subcutaneous dosage and topical or transdermal application) to unlicensed personnel, if all conditions for delegation set forth in this Section are

- (4) refuse to delegate, stop, or rescind a previously authorized delegation; or
- in community-based or in-home care settings, delegate, guide, and evaluate the implementation of nursing interventions as a component of patient care coordination after completion of the comprehensive patient assessment based on analysis of the comprehensive nursing assessment data; care coordination in in-home care and school settings may occur in person, by telecommunication, or by electronic communication.
- (c) This Section prohibits the following:
- (1) An individual or entity from mandating that a registered professional nurse delegate interventions, tasks, or selected nursing tasks if the registered professional nurse determines inappropriate to do so. Nurses shall not be subject to disciplinary or any other adverse action for refusing to delegate a nursing intervention based on patient safety.
- (2) A registered professional nurse from the The delegation of medication administration to unlicensed personnel in any institutional or long-term facility, including, but not limited to, those facilities licensed by the Hospital Licensing Act, the University of Illinois Hospital Act, State-operated mental health hospitals, or State-operated developmental centers, except as authorized

- 1 under Article 80 of this Act or otherwise specifically 2 authorized by law.
 - (3) A registered professional nurse from delegating nursing judgment, the comprehensive patient assessment, the development of a plan of care, and the evaluation of care to licensed or unlicensed personnel.
 - (4) A licensed practical nurse or unlicensed personnel has been delegated a nursing intervention by a registered professional nurse from re-delegating that $\frac{1}{4}$ nursing intervention.
 - (5) An unlicensed personnel who has been delegated a task or selected nursing task by a registered professional nurse from re-delegating that task or selected nursing task.

Sec. 60-35. RN scope of practice. The RN scope of nursing 18 19 practice is the protection, promotion, and optimization of 20 health and abilities, the prevention of illness and injury, the 21 development and implementation of the nursing plan of care, the 22 facilitation of nursing interventions to alleviate suffering, 23 care coordination, and advocacy in the care of individuals, 24 families, groups, communities, and populations. Practice as a 25 registered professional nurse means this full scope of nursing,

- with or without compensation, that incorporates carring for all 1
- patients in all settings, through nursing standards of practice 2
- 3 and professional performance for coordination of care, and may
- 4 include, but is not limited to, all of the following:
- 5 (1) Collecting pertinent data and information relative
- to the patient's health or the situation on an ongoing 6
- 7 basis through the comprehensive nursing assessment.
- 8 (2) Analyzing comprehensive nursing assessment data to
- determine actual or potential diagnoses, problems, and 9
- 10 issues.
- Identifying expected outcomes for 11 (3) plan
- individualized to the patient or the situation that 12
- 13 prescribes strategies to attain expected, measurable
- 14 outcomes.
- 15 (4) Implementing the identified plan, coordinating
- care delivery, employing strategies to promote healthy and 16
- environments, and 17 administering or delegating
- medication administration according to Section 50-75 of 18
- this Act. 19
