

1 AN ACT concerning local government.

2 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois,**  
3 **represented in the General Assembly:**

4 Section 3. The Department of Revenue Law of the Civil  
5 Administrative Code of Illinois is amended by reenacting and  
6 changing Section 2505-800 as follows:

7 (20 ILCS 2505/2505-800)

8 (Section scheduled to be repealed on April 30, 2018)

9 Sec. 2505-800. Tax Increment Financing Reform Task Force.

10 (a) There is hereby created the Tax Increment Financing  
11 Reform Task Force which shall consist of the following members:

12 (1) 3 members of the General Assembly, appointed by the  
13 President of the Senate;

14 (2) 3 members of the General Assembly, appointed by the  
15 Minority Leader of the Senate;

16 (3) 3 members of the General Assembly, appointed by the  
17 Speaker of the House of Representatives; and

18 (4) 3 members of the General Assembly, appointed by the  
19 Minority Leader of the House of Representatives.

20 (b) The members of the Task Force shall elect one co-chair  
21 from each legislative caucus, who shall call meetings of the  
22 Task Force to order. The Task Force shall hold an initial  
23 meeting within 60 days after the effective date of this

1 amendatory Act of the 100th General Assembly.

2 (c) The Task Force shall conduct a study examining current  
3 Tax Increment Financing (TIF) laws in this State and issues  
4 that include, but are not limited to:

- 5 (1) the benefits and costs of TIF districts;  
6 (2) the interaction between TIF law and school funding;  
7 (3) the expenditure of TIF funds; and  
8 (4) the expenditure of TIF surplus funds.

9 (d) The Task Force shall report the findings of the study  
10 and any recommendations to the General Assembly on or before  
11 June 1, 2018 ~~April 1, 2018~~, at which time the Task Force shall  
12 be dissolved.

13 (e) The Department of Revenue shall provide staff and  
14 administrative support to the Task Force, and shall post on its  
15 website the report under subsection (d) of this Section.

16 (f) The Task Force is exempt from any requirements under  
17 the Freedom of Information Act and Open Meetings Act.

18 (g) The General Assembly finds and declares that this  
19 amendatory Act of the 100th General Assembly manifests the  
20 intention of the General Assembly to extend the repeal of this  
21 Act and have this Act continue in effect until July 1, 2019.

22 This Section shall be deemed to have been in continuous  
23 effect since August 31, 2017 (the effective date of Public Act  
24 100-465) and it shall continue to be in effect until July 1,  
25 2019. All previously enacted amendments to this Act taking  
26 effect on or after August 31, 2017, are hereby validated. All

1 actions taken in reliance on this Section by the Task Force are  
2 hereby validated.

3 In order to ensure the continuing effectiveness of this  
4 Section, it is set forth in full and reenacted by this  
5 amendatory Act of the 100th General Assembly. Striking and  
6 underscoring are used only to show changes being made to the  
7 base text. This reenactment is intended as a continuation of  
8 this Section.

9 (h) This Section is repealed on July 1, 2019 ~~April 30,~~  
10 2018.

12 Section 5. The Illinois Municipal Code is amended by  
13 changing Section 11-74.4-3.5 as follows:

15 Sec. 11-74.4-3.5. Completion dates for redevelopment  
16 projects.

17 (a) Unless otherwise stated in this Section, the estimated  
18 dates of completion of the redevelopment project and retirement  
19 of obligations issued to finance redevelopment project costs  
20 (including refunding bonds under Section 11-74.4-7) may not be  
21 later than December 31 of the year in which the payment to the  
22 municipal treasurer, as provided in subsection (b) of Section  
23 11-74.4-8 of this Act, is to be made with respect to ad valorem  
24 taxes levied in the 23rd calendar year after the year in which

1 the ordinance approving the redevelopment project area was  
2 adopted if the ordinance was adopted on or after January 15,  
3 1981.

4 (a-5) If the redevelopment project area is located within a  
5 transit facility improvement area established pursuant to  
6 Section 11-74.4-3, the estimated dates of completion of the  
7 redevelopment project and retirement of obligations issued to  
8 finance redevelopment project costs (including refunding bonds  
9 under Section 11-74.4-7) may not be later than December 31 of  
10 the year in which the payment to the municipal treasurer, as  
11 provided in subsection (b) of Section 11-74.4-8 of this Act  
12 ~~amendatory Act of the 99th General Assembly~~, is to be made with  
13 respect to ad valorem taxes levied in the 35th calendar year  
14 after the year in which the ordinance approving the  
15 redevelopment project area was adopted.

16 (a-7) A municipality may adopt tax increment financing for  
17 a redevelopment project area located in a transit facility  
18 improvement area that also includes real property located  
19 within an existing redevelopment project area established  
20 prior to August 12, 2016 (the effective date of Public Act  
21 99-792) ~~this amendatory Act of 99th General Assembly~~. In such  
22 case: (i) the provisions of this Division shall apply with  
23 respect to the previously established redevelopment project  
24 area until the municipality adopts, as required in accordance  
25 with applicable provisions of this Division, an ordinance  
26 dissolving the special tax allocation fund for such

1 redevelopment project area and terminating the designation of  
2 such redevelopment project area as a redevelopment project  
3 area; and (ii) after the effective date of the ordinance  
4 described in (i), the provisions of this Division shall apply  
5 with respect to the subsequently established redevelopment  
6 project area located in a transit facility improvement area.

7 (b) The estimated dates of completion of the redevelopment  
8 project and retirement of obligations issued to finance  
9 redevelopment project costs (including refunding bonds under  
10 Section 11-74.4-7) may not be later than December 31 of the  
11 year in which the payment to the municipal treasurer as  
12 provided in subsection (b) of Section 11-74.4-8 of this Act is  
13 to be made with respect to ad valorem taxes levied in the 32nd  
14 calendar year after the year in which the ordinance approving  
15 the redevelopment project area was adopted if the ordinance was  
16 adopted on September 9, 1999 by the Village of Downs.

17 The estimated dates of completion of the redevelopment  
18 project and retirement of obligations issued to finance  
19 redevelopment project costs (including refunding bonds under  
20 Section 11-74.4-7) may not be later than December 31 of the  
21 year in which the payment to the municipal treasurer as  
22 provided in subsection (b) of Section 11-74.4-8 of this Act is  
23 to be made with respect to ad valorem taxes levied in the 33rd  
24 calendar year after the year in which the ordinance approving  
25 the redevelopment project area was adopted if the ordinance was  
26 adopted on May 20, 1985 by the Village of Wheeling.

1           The estimated dates of completion of the redevelopment  
2 project and retirement of obligations issued to finance  
3 redevelopment project costs (including refunding bonds under  
4 Section 11-74.4-7) may not be later than December 31 of the  
5 year in which the payment to the municipal treasurer as  
6 provided in subsection (b) of Section 11-74.4-8 of this Act is  
7 to be made with respect to ad valorem taxes levied in the 28th  
8 calendar year after the year in which the ordinance approving  
9 the redevelopment project area was adopted if the ordinance was  
10 adopted on October 12, 1989 by the City of Lawrenceville.

11           (c) The estimated dates of completion of the redevelopment  
12 project and retirement of obligations issued to finance  
13 redevelopment project costs (including refunding bonds under  
14 Section 11-74.4-7) may not be later than December 31 of the  
15 year in which the payment to the municipal treasurer as  
16 provided in subsection (b) of Section 11-74.4-8 of this Act is  
17 to be made with respect to ad valorem taxes levied in the 35th  
18 calendar year after the year in which the ordinance approving  
19 the redevelopment project area was adopted:

8 of Section 11-74.4-8 are not required for these redevelopment  
9 project areas in 2009 but are required in 2013. The extension  
10 allowed by Public Act 87-1272 shall not apply to real property  
11 tax increment allocation financing under Section 11-74.4-8.

12 (e) Those dates, for purposes of real property tax  
13 increment allocation financing pursuant to Section 11-74.4-8  
14 only, shall be not more than 35 years for redevelopment project  
15 areas that were adopted on or after December 16, 1986 and for  
16 which at least \$8 million worth of municipal bonds were  
17 authorized on or after December 19, 1989 but before January 1,  
18 1990; provided that the municipality elects to extend the life  
19 of the redevelopment project area to 35 years by the adoption  
20 of an ordinance after at least 14 but not more than 30 days'  
21 written notice to the taxing bodies, that would otherwise  
22 constitute the joint review board for the redevelopment project  
23 area, before the adoption of the ordinance.

24 (f) Those dates, for purposes of real property tax  
25 increment allocation financing pursuant to Section 11-74.4-8  
26 only, shall be not more than 35 years for redevelopment project

1 areas that were established on or after December 1, 1981 but  
2 before January 1, 1982 and for which at least \$1,500,000 worth  
3 of tax increment revenue bonds were authorized on or after  
4 September 30, 1990 but before July 1, 1991; provided that the  
5 municipality elects to extend the life of the redevelopment  
6 project area to 35 years by the adoption of an ordinance after  
7 at least 14 but not more than 30 days' written notice to the  
8 taxing bodies, that would otherwise constitute the joint review  
9 board for the redevelopment project area, before the adoption  
10 of the ordinance.

11 (f-5) Those dates, for purposes of real property tax  
12 increment allocation financing pursuant to Section 11-74.4-8  
13 only, shall be not more than 47 years for redevelopment project  
14 areas that were established on December 29, 1981 by the City of  
15 Springfield; provided that (i) the City ~~city~~ of Springfield  
16 adopts an ordinance extending the life of the redevelopment  
17 project area to 47 years and (ii) the City of Springfield  
18 provides notice to the taxing bodies that would otherwise  
19 constitute the joint review board for the redevelopment project  
20 area not more than 30 and not less than 14 days prior to the  
21 adoption of that ordinance.

22 (g) In consolidating the material relating to completion  
23 dates from Sections 11-74.4-3 and 11-74.4-7 into this Section,  
24 it is not the intent of the General Assembly to make any  
25 substantive change in the law, except for the extension of the  
26 completion dates for the City of Aurora, the Village of Milan,

1 the City of West Frankfort, the Village of Libertyville, and  
2 the Village of Hoffman Estates set forth under items (67),  
3 (68), (69), (70), and (71) of subsection (c) of this Section.
