A BILL FOR

1 AN ACT concerning appropriations.

2 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented**
3 **in the General Assembly:**

4 ARTICLE 1

5 Section 1. Purpose. This Act makes appropriations and
6 reappropriations for State fiscal year 2019. Article 15 and
7 Article 29 contain reappropriations of certain appropriations
8 as may have been appropriated for State fiscal year 2018 by
9 Article 105, Section 60 and Article 110, Section 1 of Public
10 Act 100-0021, respectively, as amended. To the extent that
11 Article 105, Section 60 and Article 110, Section 1 of Public
12 Act 100-0021 have not been enacted as amended, Article 14 and
13 Article 28 contains appropriations of identical amounts and
14 purposes to those in Article 15 and Article 29 but as new
15 appropriations rather than as reappropriations. Section 99 of
16 Article 99 sets forth an effective date that causes Articles
17 15 and 29 to become effective if, and only if, Article 105,
18 Section 60 of Public Act 100-0021 and Article 110, Section 1
19 of Public Act 100-0021, respectively, should be amended; should
20 such an amendment not be enacted, the Section causes Articles
21 14 and 28 to become effective.

22 ARTICLE 2

1 Section 1. It is the intent of the State that all or a
 2 portion of the costs of projects funded by appropriations made
 3 in this Act from the Capital Development Fund, the School
 4 Construction Fund, the Anti-Pollution Fund, the Transportation
 5 Bond Series A Fund, the Transportation Bond Series B Fund, the
 6 Coal Development Fund, the Transportation Bond Series D Fund,
 7 and the Build Illinois Bond Fund will be paid or reimbursed
 8 from the proceeds of tax-exempt bonds subsequently issued by
 9 the State.

10 ARTICLE 3

11 DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE AND ECONOMIC OPPORTUNITY

12 Section 1. The sum of \$1,000,000, or so much thereof as
 13 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Port Development
 14 Revolving Loan Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
 15 Opportunity for grants and loans associated with the Port
 16 Development Revolving Loan Program pursuant to 30 ILCS 750/9-
 17 11.

18 Total, this Article \$1,000,000

19 ARTICLE 4

20 DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE AND ECONOMIC OPPORTUNITY

21 Section 5. The sum of \$10,000,000, or so much thereof as

1 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Build Illinois Bond
2 Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity a
3 grant to the Uptown Theatre for costs associated with capital
4 improvements.

5 Section 10. The sum of \$17,000,000, or so much thereof as
6 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Build Illinois Bond
7 Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
8 grants associated with the redevelopment of brownfield sites.

9 Section 15. The sum of \$5,500,001, or so much thereof as
10 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Build Illinois Bond
11 Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
12 grants associated with the redevelopment of brownfield sites.

13 Section 20. The sum of \$1,052,757, or so much thereof as
14 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Capital Development
15 Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
16 a grant to the Illinois Medical District Commission for capital
17 improvements, acquisition and development of land and
18 structures, including previously incurred costs.

19 Section 25. The sum of \$12,386,633, or so much thereof as
20 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Build Illinois Bond
21 Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for

1 a grant for the Illinois Science and Technology Park.

2 Section 30. The sum of \$33,581,935, or so much thereof as
3 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Build Illinois Bond
4 Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
5 grants and loans pursuant but not limited to Article 8, Article
6 9, or Article 10 of the Build Illinois Act.

7 Section 35. The sum of \$75,338,451, or so much thereof as
8 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Build Illinois Bond
9 Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
10 the purpose of making grants and loans to local governments for
11 planning, engineering, acquisition, construction,
12 reconstruction, development, improvement and extension of the
13 public infrastructure, and for any other purposes authorized
14 in subsection (a) of Section 4 of the Build Illinois Bond Act
15 and for grants to State agencies for such purposes.

16 Section 40. The sum of \$2,200,000, or so much thereof as
17 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Build Illinois Bond
18 Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
19 a grant to the Illinois Medical District Commission for the
20 purpose of fostering economic development and increased
21 employment and the well-being of the citizens of Illinois, and
22 for any other purposes authorized in subsection (b) of Section

1 4 of the Build Illinois Bond Act and for grants to State
2 agencies for such purposes.

3 Section 45. The sum of \$7,267,741, or so much thereof as
4 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Build Illinois Bond
5 Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
6 purposes authorized in subsection (c) of Section 4 of the Build
7 Illinois Bond Act and for grants to State agencies for such
8 purposes.

9 Section 50. The sum of \$26,714,480, or so much thereof as
10 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Capital Development
11 Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
12 deposits into the Partners for Conservation Projects Fund and
13 other purposes authorized by subsection (c) of Section 3 of the
14 General Obligation Bond Act or for grants to State agencies for
15 such purposes.

16 Section 55. The sum of \$19,328,499, or so much thereof as
17 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Capital Development
18 Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
19 grants to local governments for the acquisition, financing,
20 architectural planning, development, alteration, installation,
21 and construction of capital facilities consisting of buildings,
22 structures, durable equipment, and land as authorized by

1 subsection (1) of Section 3 of the General Obligation Bond Act
2 or for grants to State agencies for such purposes.

3 Section 60. The sum of \$8,750,000, or so much thereof as
4 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Capital Development
5 Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
6 grants to local governments for the acquisition, financing,
7 architectural planning, development, alteration, installation,
8 and construction of capital facilities consisting of buildings,
9 structures, durable equipment, and land as authorized by
10 subsection (1) of Section 3 of the General Obligation Bond Act
11 or for grants to State agencies for such purposes.

12 Section 65. The sum of \$1,195,268, or so much thereof as
13 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Capital Development
14 Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
15 a grant to the Chicago Housing Authority for LeClaire Courts.

16 Section 70. The sum of \$398,974,111, or so much thereof
17 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Build Illinois
18 Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
19 Opportunity for grants awarded under the Urban Weatherization
20 Initiative Act.

21 Section 75. The sum of \$3,414,314, or so much thereof as

1 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Build Illinois Bond
2 Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
3 grants and loans including but not limited to broadband
4 deployment to expand and strengthen existing broadband network
5 infrastructure, health information technology, telemedicine,
6 distance learning, and public safety.

7 Section 80. The sum of \$15,080,745, or so much thereof as
8 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Build Illinois Bond
9 Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
10 infrastructure projects that lead directly to private sector
11 expansion or retention activities including but not limited to
12 public infrastructure construction and renovation, financing
13 for the purchase of land and buildings, construction or
14 renovation of fixed assets, site preparation and purchase of
15 machinery and equipment.

16 Section 85. The sum of \$2,330,884, or so much thereof as
17 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Build Illinois Bond
18 Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
19 the requirements necessary to leverage capital-related American
20 Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 funds of equal or greater
21 value in order to make Illinois or Illinois applicants more
22 competitive and/or for costs associated with bondable
23 improvements to match federal, local, private or other funds.

1 Section 90. The sum of \$125,591, or so much thereof as may
 2 be necessary, is appropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund
 3 to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for a
 4 grant to the Phoenix Foundation of Southern Illinois for
 5 hospital renovation and equipment.

6 Section 95. The sum of \$2,978,788, or so much thereof as
 7 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Build Illinois Bond
 8 Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
 9 grants associated with the redevelopment of brownfield sites.

10 Section 105. The sum of \$9,000,000, or so much thereof as
 11 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Build Illinois Bond
 12 Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
 13 grants for acquisition, construction, renovation and equipping
 14 new charter schools, to a silver certification from the United
 15 States Green Building Council's Leadership in Energy and
 16 Environmental Design Green Building Rating System as
 17 approximated below:

19 Section 110. The sum of \$2,606,686, or so much thereof as
 20 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Build Illinois Bond
 21 Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for

1 provide grants, loans, and other investments to emerging
2 technology enterprises to support and encourage: (i)
3 commercialization of technology based products and services;
4 (ii) technology transfer projects involving the promotion of
5 new or innovative technologies; or (iii) research and
6 development projects to respond to unique, advanced technology
7 projects and which foster the development of Illinois' economy
8 through the advancement of the State's economic, scientific,
9 and technological assets.

10 Section 115. The sum of \$5,938,000, or so much thereof as
11 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Build Illinois Bond
12 Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
13 provide grants for land acquisition, infrastructure, equipment
14 and other permissible capital expenditures to businesses that
15 will encourage new investment and the creation or retention of
16 jobs in economically depressed areas of the State.

17 Section 120. The sum of \$3,301,210, or so much thereof as
18 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Capital Development
19 Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
20 a grant to the University of Chicago Medical Center for costs
21 associated with Provident Hospital.

22 Section 125. The sum of \$2,084,459, or so much thereof as

1 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Build Illinois Bond
2 Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
3 a grant to Community Health and Emergency Services, Inc. for
4 the construction of a hospital wing at the Cairo Megaclinic.

5 Section 130. The sum of \$1,125,000, or so much thereof as
6 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Build Illinois Bond
7 Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
8 a grant to the Cook County Health and Hospital System for costs
9 associated with medical equipment and capital improvements at
10 Provident Hospital.

11 Section 140. The sum of \$15,000,000, or so much thereof as
12 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Build Illinois Bond
13 Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
14 grants awarded in conjunction with the Office of Minority
15 Economic Empowerment.

16 Section 145. The sum of \$1,000,000, or so much thereof as
17 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Build Illinois Bond
18 Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
19 costs associated with the Cairo Port Development.

20 Section 150. The sum of \$500,000,000 or so much thereof as
21 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Build Illinois Bond

1 Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
2 the development of the University of Illinois Discovery
3 Partner's Institute.

4 Section 165. The sum of \$750,000, or so much thereof as
5 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Build Illinois Bond
6 Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
7 a grant to Erie Neighborhood House.

8 Section 170. The sum of \$338,579, or so much thereof as
9 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Build Illinois Bond
10 Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
11 a grant to Family Guidance Center.

12 Section 175. Section 165 and Section 170 of this Article
13 are not subject to limitations under Section 5 of Article 48
14 of Public Act 95-734 or any similar limitation.

15 Section 180. No contract shall be entered into or
16 obligation incurred or any expenditure made from any
17 appropriation herein made in this Article until after the
18 purpose and amounts have been approved in writing by the
19 Governor.

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ARTICLE 5

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DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE AND ECONOMIC OPPORTUNITY

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Section 1. The sum of \$10,569,017, or so much thereof as may be necessary and remain unexpended at the close of business on June 30, 2018, from a reappropriation heretofore made for such purpose in Article 102, Section 1 of Public Act 100-0021, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for grants to local governments for capital improvements to civic centers.

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Section 5. The sum of \$500,000 or so much thereof as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business of June 30th 2018, from a reappropriation heretofore made for such purpose in Article 111, Section 25 of Public Act 100-0021, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for a grant to the Rockford District 205 for the project hereinafter enumerated: CICS ROCKFORD CHARTER PATRIOTS CENTER.

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Section 10. The sum of \$15,000,000 or so much thereof as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business on June 30, 2018, from a reappropriation heretofore made for such purpose in Article 111, Section 105 of Public Act 100-0021, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund to

1 the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for a grant
2 to the commuter Rail Division of the Regional Transportation
3 Authority for a Metra station at Peterson Avenue and Ravenswood
4 Avenue.

5 Section 15. No contract shall be entered into or obligation
6 incurred or any expenditure made from any appropriation herein
7 made in this Article until after the purpose and amounts have
8 been approved in writing by the Governor.

9 Total, this Article \$26,069,017

10 ARTICLE 6

11 DEPARTMENT OF NATURAL RESOURCES

12 Section 1. The sum of \$150,000, or so much thereof as may
13 be necessary, is appropriated from the State Boating Act Fund
14 to the Department of Natural Resources for a grant to the Chain
15 O'Lakes - Fox River Waterway Management Agency for the Agency's
16 operational expenses.

17 Section 5. The sum of \$7,415,383, or so much thereof as
18 may be necessary, is appropriated from the State Boating Act
19 Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for the
20 administration and payment of grants to local governmental
21 units for the construction, maintenance, and improvement of

1 boat access areas.

2 Section 10. The sum of \$486,743, or so much thereof as may
3 be necessary, is appropriated from the State Boating Act Fund
4 to the Department of Natural Resources for the purposes of the
5 Snowmobile Registration and Safety Act and for the
6 administration and payment of grants to local governmental
7 units for the construction, land acquisition, lease,
8 maintenance and improvement of snowmobile trails and access
9 areas.

10 Section 15. To the extent federal funds, including
11 reimbursements, are available for such purposes, the sum of
12 \$4,845,932, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is
13 appropriated from the State Boating act Fund to the Department
14 of Natural Resources for all costs for construction and
15 development of facilities for transient, non-trailerable
16 recreational boats, including grants for such purposes
17 authorizes under the Boating Infrastructure Grant Program.

18 Section 20. The sum of \$10,242,902, or so much thereof as
19 may be necessary, is appropriated from the State Boating Act
20 Fund to the Department of Natural Resources For multiple use
21 facilities and programs for boating purposes provided by the
22 Department of Natural Resources, including construction and

1 development, all costs for supplies, materials, labor, land
2 acquisition, services, studies and all other expenses required
3 to comply with the intent of this appropriation.

4 Section 25. The sum of \$150,000, or so much thereof as may
5 be necessary, is appropriated from the State Parks Fund for
6 matching recreational trails and trail-related projects
7 authorized under the Intermodal Surface Transportation
8 Efficiency Act of 1991, multiple use facilities and programs
9 for park and trail purposes provided by the Department of
10 Natural Resources, including construction and development, all
11 costs for supplies, materials, labor, land acquisition,
12 services, studies, and all other expenses required to comply
13 with the intent of this appropriation.

14 Section 30. The sum of \$100,000, or so much thereof as may
15 be necessary, is appropriated from the Wildlife and Fish Fund
16 to the Department of Natural Resources for acquisition and
17 development, including grants, for the implementation of the
18 North American Waterfowl Management Plan within the Dominion
19 of Canada or the United States which specifically provides
20 waterfowl for the Mississippi Flyway.

21 Section 35. To the extent federal funds including
22 reimbursements are available for such purposes, the sum of

1 \$1,351,995, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is
2 appropriated from the Wildlife and Fish Fund to the Department
3 of Natural Resources for construction and renovation of waste
4 reception facilities for recreational boaters, including grants
5 for such purposes authorized under the Clean Vessel Act.

6 Section 45. The sum of \$500,000, or so much thereof as may
7 be necessary, made either independently or in cooperation with
8 the Federal Government or any agency thereof, any municipal
9 corporation, or political subdivision of the State, or with any
10 public or private corporation, organization, or individual, is
11 appropriated from the Forest Reserve Fund for refunds and for
12 the U.S. Forest Service Program.

13 Section 45. The sum of \$346,149, or so much thereof as may
14 be necessary, is appropriated from the State Furbearer Fund to
15 the Department of Natural Resources for the conservation of fur
16 bearing mammals in accordance with the provisions of Section
17 5/1.32 of the "Wildlife Code", as now or hereafter amended.

18 Section 55. The sum of \$29,335,808, or so much thereof as
19 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Natural Areas
20 Acquisition Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for the
21 acquisition, preservation and stewardship of natural areas,
22 including habitats for endangered and threatened species, high

1 quality natural communities, wetlands and other areas with
2 unique or unusual natural heritage qualities.

3 Section 55. The sum of \$15,000,000, or so much thereof as
4 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Open Space Lands
5 Acquisition and Development Fund to the Department of Natural
6 Resources for expenses connected with and to make grants to
7 local governments as provided in the "Open Space Lands
8 Acquisition and Development Act".

9 Section 60. The sum of \$3,095,229, or so much thereof as
10 maybe necessary, is appropriated from the State Pheasant Fund
11 to the Department of Natural Resources for the conservation of
12 pheasants in accordance with the provisions of Section 5/1.31
13 of the "Wildlife Code", as now or hereafter amended.

14 Section 65. The sum of \$7,940,486, or so much thereof as
15 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Illinois Habitat
16 Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for the
17 preservation and maintenance of high quality habitat lands in
18 accordance with the provisions of the "Habitat Endowment Act",
19 as now or hereafter amended.

20 Section 70. The sum of \$2,718,401, or so much thereof as
21 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Illinois Habitat

1 Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for the
2 preservation and maintenance of a high quality fish and
3 wildlife habitat and to promote the heritage of outdoor sports
4 in Illinois from revenue derived from the sale of Sportsmen
5 Series license plates.

6 Section 75. The sum of \$2,500,000, or so much thereof as
7 may be necessary, made either independently or in cooperation
8 with the Federal Government or any agency thereof, any
9 municipal corporation, or political subdivision of the State,
10 or with any public or private corporation, organization, or
11 individual, is appropriated from the Land and Water Recreation
12 Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for refunds and for
13 outdoor recreation programs.

14 Section 80. The sum of \$2,604,971, or so much thereof as
15 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Off-Highway Vehicle
16 Trails Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for grants
17 to units of local governments, not-for-profit organizations,
18 and other groups to operate, maintain and acquire land for off-
19 highway vehicle trails and parks as provided for in the
20 Recreational Trails of Illinois Act, including administration,
21 enforcement, planning and implementation of this Act.

22 Section 85. The sum of \$3,142,458, or so much thereof as

1 may be necessary is appropriated from the Partners for
2 Conservation Projects Fund to the Department of Natural
3 Resources for the acquisition, planning and development of land
4 and long-term easements, and cost-shared natural resource
5 management practices for ecosystem-based management of
6 Illinois' natural resources, including grants for such
7 purposes.

8 Section 90. The sum of \$442,403, or so much thereof as may
9 be necessary, is appropriated from the Snowmobile Trail
10 Establishment Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for
11 the administration and payment of grants to nonprofit
12 snowmobile clubs and organizations for construction,
13 maintenance, and rehabilitation of snowmobile trails and for
14 the use of snowmobiles.

15 Section 95. The sum of \$250,000, or so much thereof as may
16 be necessary, is appropriated from the State Migratory
17 Waterfowl Stamp Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for
18 the payment of grants for the implementation of the North
19 American Waterfowl Management Plan within the Dominion of
20 Canada or the United States which specifically provides
21 waterfowl to the Mississippi Flyway as provided in the
22 "Wildlife Code", as amended.

1 Section 100. The sum of \$250,000, or so much thereof as
2 may be necessary, is appropriated from the State Migratory
3 Waterfowl Stamp Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for
4 the payment of grants for the development of waterfowl
5 propagation areas within the Dominion of Canada or the United
6 States which specifically provide waterfowl for the Mississippi
7 Flyway as provided in the "Wildlife Code", as amended.

8 Section 105. The sum of \$4,136,010, or so much thereof as
9 may be necessary, is appropriated from the State Migratory
10 Waterfowl Stamp Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for
11 the purpose of attracting waterfowl and improving public
12 migratory waterfowl areas within the State.

13 Section 110. The sum of \$13,324,058, or so much thereof
14 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Park and
15 Conservation Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for
16 grants to units of local government for the acquisition and
17 development of bike paths.

18 Section 115. The sum of \$6,767,533, or so much thereof as
19 may be necessary, is appropriated to the Department of
20 Resources from the Park and Conservation Fund for multiple use
21 facilities and programs for park and trail purposes provided
22 by the Department of Natural Resources, including construction

1 and development, all costs for supplies, materials, labor,
2 land, acquisition, services, studies, and all other expenses
3 required to comply with the intent of this appropriation.

4 Section 120. The sum of \$1,541,448, or so much thereof as
5 may be necessary, is appropriated to the Department of Natural
6 Resources from the Park and Conservation Fund for multiple use
7 facilities and programs for conservation purposes provided by
8 the Department of Natural Resources, including repairing,
9 maintaining, reconstructing, rehabilitating, replacing fixed
10 assets, construction and development, marketing and promotions,
11 all costs for supplies, materials, labor, land acquisition and
12 its related costs, services, studies, and all other expenses
13 required to comply with the intent of this appropriation.

14 Section 125. The sum of \$62,200,673, or so much thereof
15 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Park and
16 Conservation Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for
17 construction and maintenance of State owned, leased, and
18 managed sites.

19 Section 130. The sum of \$7,826,139, or so much thereof as
20 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Park and
21 Conservation Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for
22 land acquisition, development and maintenance of bike paths and

1 all other related expenses connected with the acquisition,
2 development, and maintenance of bike paths.

3 Section 135. The sum of \$1,500,000, or so much thereof as
4 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Park and
5 Conservation Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for
6 the development and maintenance, and other related expenses of
7 recreational trails and trail-related projects authorized under
8 the Intermodal Surface Transportation Efficiency Act of 1991,
9 provided such amount shall not exceed funds to be made available
10 for such purposes from State or federal sources.

11 Section 140. The sum of \$3,600,000, or so much thereof as
12 may be necessary, is appropriated from the State Parks Fund to
13 the Department of Natural Resources, in coordination with the
14 Capital Development Board, for the development of the World
15 Shooting and Recreation Complex including all construction and
16 debt service expenses required to comply with this

6 departments, authorities, public corporations, commissions and
7 agencies as authorized by subsection (e) of Section 3 of the
8 General Obligation Bond Act.

9 Section 5. No contract shall be entered into or obligation
10 incurred or any expenditure made from any appropriation herein
11 made in this Article until after the purpose and amounts have
12 been approved in writing by the Governor.

14 ARTICLE 29

15 DEPARTMENT OF INNOVATION AND TECHNOLOGY

16 Section 1. The sum of \$400,000,000, or so much thereof as
17 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business
18 on June 30, 2018, from a new appropriation heretofore made for
19 such purpose from such fund to such agency in such amount above
20 in Article 110, Section 1 of Public Act 100-0021, as amended,
21 is reappropriated from the Capital Development Fund to the
22 Department of Innovation and Technology for information

1 technology including, but not limited to, Enterprise Resource
2 Planning, and for use by the State, its departments,
3 authorities, public corporations, commissions and agencies as
4 authorized by subsection (e) of Section 3 of the General
5 Obligation Bond Act.

6 Section 5. No contract shall be entered into or obligation
7 incurred or any expenditure made from any appropriation herein
8 made in this Article until after the purpose and amounts have
9 been approved in writing by the Governor.

11 ARTICLE 98

12 Section 1. All appropriations in Articles 3, 4, 6, 8, 10,
13 12, 14, 16, 18, 20, 21, 22, 23, 24, 26, and 28 may be used for
14 costs incurred prior to July 1, 2019.

15 ARTICLE 99

16 Section 99. This Article and all other Articles not
17 including Article 15 and Article 29 take effect July 1, 2018.
18 Article 15 and Article 29 take effect July 1, 2018 if, and only
19 if, an amendment to Article 105, Section 60 and Article 110,

1 Section 1 of Public Act 100-0021, respectively, become law.
