SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

35 ILCS 200/10-235

Amends the Property Tax Code. Provides that a Section concerning low-income housing project valuation also applies to residential property that is rented to a formerly incarcerated person. Effective immediately.

HOUSING AFFORDABILITY IMPACT NOTE ACT MAY APPLY 1 AN ACT concerning revenue.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

- Section 5. The Property Tax Code is amended by changing Section 10-235 as follows:
- 6 (35 ILCS 200/10-235)

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Sec. 10-235. Low-income housing project valuation policy; intent. It is the policy of this State that (i) low-income housing projects developed under Section 515 of the federal Housing Act, (ii) property that qualifies or that qualify for the low-income housing tax credit under Section 42 of the Internal Revenue Code, and (iii) residential property that is rented to a formerly incarcerated person shall be valued at 33 and one-third percent of the fair market value of their economic productivity to the owners of the projects to help insure that their valuation for property taxation does not result in taxes so high that rent levels must be raised to cover this project expense, which can cause excess vacancies, project loan defaults, and eventual loss of rental housing facilities for those most in need of them, low-income families and the elderly. It is the intent of this State that the valuation required by this Division is the closest representation of cash value required by law and is the method

- 2 As used in this Section "formerly incarcerated person"
- 3 means a person who (i) has been convicted of, or pled guilty
- 4 to, a crime in this State or any other jurisdiction and (ii)
- 5 was sentenced to a term of imprisonment in a penitentiary for
- 6 <u>one year or more.</u>
