SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

20 ILCS 2805/37

Amends the Department of Veterans' Affairs Act. Allows specified actions to be performed by the designee of the Director of Veterans' Affairs. Provides that the Illinois Joining Forces Foundation shall (currently, may) be assisted in carrying out its functions by Department of Veterans' Affairs personnel, including legal professionals. Requires the Foundation's audit to be included in the Department's audit and to be prepared by the Department.

A BILL FOR

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AN ACT concerning State government.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

4 Section 5. The Department of Veterans' Affairs Act is 5 amended by changing Section 37 as follows:

6 (20 ILCS 2805/37)

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Sec. 37. Illinois Joining Forces Foundation.

8 (a) The General Assembly finds that navigating the "sea of 9 goodwill" for those who serve in uniform is one of the greatest challenges that transitioning veterans face; as a result, they 10 risk being unable to access many of the federal, State, and 11 12 non-profit resources available to them. Recognizing this problem, the Department of Veterans' Affairs and the Department 13 14 of Military Affairs acted to establish the Illinois Joining Forces initiative, a public-private network of military and 15 16 veteran-serving organizations that are working together, in 17 person and online, to create a no-wrong-door system of support for the State's military and veteran communities. Illinois 18 19 Joining Forces is a nation-leading model, awarded by the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs and the National Association of 20 21 State Directors of Veterans Affairs for its groundbreaking work 22 in creating smarter, collaborative community support for those in uniform, past and present. The foundation created by this 23

1 amendatory Act of the 98th General Assembly will serve to 2 ensure the long-term sustainability of Illinois Joining 3 Forces, which is critically important for the support of the 4 State's military and veteran communities.

5 (b) The Illinois Joining Forces Foundation shall benefit
6 service members, veterans, and their families by:

7 (1) convening military and veteran support 8 organizations, through Illinois Joining Forces working 9 groups, to build cross-sector relationships and mutual 10 awareness;

(2) providing policy recommendations through Illinois
Joining Forces member working groups to the Illinois
Veterans' Advisory Council;

14 (3) facilitating the transfer of information and 15 knowledge among Illinois Joining Forces member 16 organizations;

17 (4) maintaining and continuing to build the18 no-wrong-door online navigation platform;

19 (5) educating Illinois Joining Forces members and 20 other community providers regarding military and veteran 21 culture and needs, thus improving the collective capacity 22 of the support system; and

(6) outreaching directly to service members, veterans,
and their families regarding the no-wrong-door system that
Illinois Joining Forces provides to them.

26 (c) For the purpose of this Section, "veterans service

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1 organization" means an organization that meets all of the 2 following criteria:

3 (1) The organization is formed by and for United States
 4 military veterans.

5 (2) The organization is chartered by the United States
6 Congress and incorporated in the State of Illinois.

7 (3) The organization has maintained a State
8 headquarters office in Illinois for the 10-year period
9 immediately preceding the effective date of this
10 amendatory Act of the 98th General Assembly.

11 (4) The organization maintains at least one office in
12 this State, staffed by a veterans service officer.

13 (5) The organization is capable of preparing a power of
14 attorney for a veteran and processing claims for veterans
15 services.

16 (6) The organization is not funded by the State of17 Illinois or by any county in this State.

The General Assembly authorizes the Department of 18 (d) Veterans' Affairs, in accordance with Section 10 of the State 19 20 Agency Entity Creation Act, to create the Illinois Joining 21 Forces Foundation as а not-for-profit foundation. The 22 Department shall file articles of incorporation as required 23 under the General Not For Profit Corporation Act of 1986 to create the Foundation. The Foundation's Board of Directors 24 25 shall be appointed as follows: one member appointed by the 26 Governor; one member appointed by the President of the Senate;

one member appointed by the Minority Leader of the Senate; one 1 2 member appointed by the Speaker of the House of 3 Representatives; one member appointed by the Minority Leader of the House of Representatives; and all of the members of the 4 5 Illinois Joining Forces Executive Committee, who shall be appointed by the Director of Veterans' 6 Affairs or the 7 Director's designee. In addition to any veterans service 8 organization otherwise represented on the Board of Directors, a 9 veterans service organization may designate in writing an ex 10 officio, non-voting participant to the Board of Directors. Any 11 veterans service organization appointee under this Section 12 does not count towards a quorum. The Director of Veterans' Affairs, or the Director's designee, and a designee chosen by 13 the Director of Military Affairs who is a senior management 14 15 official of the Department of Military Affairs with the 16 authority to make decisions on behalf of the agency shall serve 17 as members of the Foundation's Board of Directors. Board of Director appointments shall be for 2-year terms. Vacancies 18 shall be filled by the official who made the recommendation for 19 20 the vacated appointment. No member of the Board of Directors may receive compensation for his or her services to the 21 22 Foundation. Upon appointment, the Board of Directors, as 23 public entity, shall members of а be represented and indemnified pursuant to the requirements of the State Employee 24 25 Indemnification Act.

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(e) The purposes of the Foundation are to: promote,

Illinois 1 assist, and sustain Joining Forces support, 2 operations; solicit and accept grants and private donations and disburse them for the stated intent of the Foundation or the 3 private donor; solicit and generate public and private funding 4 5 and donations that assist in enhancing the Illinois Joining Forces mission, services, programs, and operations; and engage 6 7 generally in other lawful endeavors consistent with the 8 foregoing purposes. The foundation shall operate within the 9 provisions of the General Not For Profit Corporation Act of 1986. 10

11 (f) As soon as practicable after the Foundation is created, 12 the Board of Directors shall meet, organize, and designate, by 13 majority vote, a chairperson, a treasurer, a secretary, and any additional officers that may be needed to carry out the 14 15 activities of the Foundation and shall adopt bylaws of the 16 Foundation. The Department of Veterans' Affairs, in 17 consultation with the Department of Military Affairs, may adopt other rules deemed necessary to govern Foundation procedures. 18

19 (g) The Foundation may request and accept gifts, grants, 20 donations, or bequests from the federal government or its 21 agencies or officers or from any person, firm, or corporation, 22 and may expend receipts on activities that it considers 23 suitable to the performance of its duties under this Section 24 and consistent with any requirement of the grant, gift, 25 donation, or bequest. Funds collected by the Foundation shall 26 be considered private funds and shall be held in an appropriate

account outside of the State treasury. Private funds collected 1 2 by the Foundation are not subject to the Public Funds Investment Act. The treasurer of the Foundation shall be the 3 custodian of all Foundation funds. The treasurer shall be 4 5 required to obtain a fidelity or surety bond on satisfactory terms and in sufficient amounts to protect the interests of the 6 7 Foundation, the cost of which shall be reimbursed by the The Foundation and its officers 8 Foundation. shall be 9 responsible for the approval of the recording of receipts, 10 approval of payments, and the proper filing of required 11 reports. The Foundation may be assisted in carrying out its 12 functions by Department of Military Affairs personnel and shall 13 be assisted in carrying out its functions by Department of Veterans' Affairs personnel, including, but not limited to, 14 15 legal professionals. The Department of Military Affairs and the 16 Department of Veterans' Affairs shall provide reasonable 17 assistance to the Foundation to achieve the purposes of the Foundation as determined by the respective Directors. The 18 19 Foundation shall cooperate fully with the boards, commissions, 20 agencies, departments, and institutions of the State. The funds 21 held and made available by the Illinois Joining Forces 22 Foundation shall be subject to financial and compliance audits 23 in accordance with the Illinois State Auditing Act. The 24 Foundation's audit shall be included in the Department of 25 Veterans' Affairs audit and shall be prepared by the Department of Veterans' Affairs. The Foundation shall not have any power 26

of eminent domain. The Foundation shall not construct or make
 any permanent improvements to any real property.

3 (h) The Foundation must provide a written notice to any 4 entity providing a gift, grant, donation, or bequest to the 5 Foundation that the Foundation is not subject to the provisions 6 of the Public Funds Investment Act, which Act places 7 limitations on the types of securities in which a public agency 8 may invest public funds.

9 (i) Notwithstanding any law to the contrary, the Foundation 10 is not eligible for any grant administered or funded by the 11 Department of Veterans' Affairs or the Department of Military 12 Affairs.
