### SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

Amends the Fire Department Promotion Act, the Counties Code, and the Illinois Municipal Code. Removes restrictions on the availability to receive a veteran's preference promotion if the person has already received a promotion from based on a veteran's preference. Effective immediately.

# 2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, 3 represented in the General Assembly:

4 Section 5. The Fire Department Promotion Act is amended by 5 changing Section 55 as follows:

#### 6 (50 ILCS 742/55)

7 Sec. 55. Veterans' preference. A person on a preliminary 8 promotion list who is eligible for veteran's preference under 9 any law or agreement applicable to an affected department may file a written application for that preference within 10 days 10 after the initial posting of the preliminary promotion list. 11 The veteran's preference shall be calculated as provided in the 12 applicable law and added to the applicant's total score on the 13 14 preliminary promotion list. Any person who has received a 15 promotion from a promotion list on which his or her position 16 was adjusted for veteran's preference, under this Act or anv 17 other law, shall not be eligible for any subsequent veteran's 18 preference under this Act.

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(55 ILCS 5/3-14021) (from Ch. 34, par. 3-14021)

2 Sec. 3-14021. Preference to veterans in appointments. Persons who were engaged in the military or naval service of 3 the United States during the years 1898, 1899, 1900, 1901, 4 1902, 1914, 1915, 1916, 1917, 1918, 1919, any time between 5 September 16, 1940 and July 25, 1947, or any time during the 6 7 national emergency between June 25, 1950 and January 31, 1955, 8 and who were honorably discharged therefrom, and all persons 9 who were engaged in such military or naval service during any 10 of said years, any time between September 16, 1940 and July 25, 11 1947, or any time during the national emergency between June 12 25, 1950 and January 31, 1955, who are now or may hereafter be on inactive or reserve duty in such military or naval service, 13 including, however, persons who were convicted by 14 not. 15 court-martial of disobedience of orders, where such 16 disobedience consisted in the refusal to perform military 17 service on the ground of alleged religious or conscientious objections against war shall be preferred for appointment to 18 civil offices, positions, and places of employment in the 19 20 classified service of the county, provided they are found to 21 possess the business capacity necessary for the proper 22 discharge of the duties of such office, position, or place of 23 employment as determined by examination for original entrance.

The Civil Service Commission on certifying from any existing register of eligibles resulting from the holding of an examination for original entrance or any register of eligibles

that may be hereafter created of persons who have taken and 1 successfully passed the examinations provided for in this 2 3 Division for original entrance commenced prior to September 1, 1949, shall place the name or names of such persons at the head 4 5 of any existing eligible register or list of eligibles that shall be created under the provisions of this Division to be 6 7 certified for appointment. The Civil Service Commission shall 8 give preference for original appointment to persons as 9 hereinabove designated whose names appear on any register of 10 eligibles resulting from an examination for original entrance 11 held under the provisions of this Division and commenced on or 12 after September 1, 1949 by adding to the final grade average 13 which they received or will receive as the result of any 14 examination held for original entrance, five points. The 15 numerical result thus attained shall be applied by the Civil 16 Service Commission in determining the position of such persons 17 on any eligible list which has been created as the result of any examination for original entrance commenced on or after 18 September 1, 1949 for purposes of preference in certification 19 20 and appointment from such eligible list.

Every certified Civil Service employee who was called to, or who volunteered for, the military or naval service of the United States at any time during the years specified in this Division, at any time between September 16, 1940 and July 25, 1947, or any time during the national emergency between June 25, 1950 and January 31, 1955, and who was honorably discharged

therefrom, who is now or who may hereafter be on inactive or 1 2 reserve duty in such military or naval service, not including, 3 however, persons who were convicted by courtmartial of disobedience of orders where such disobedience consisted in the 4 5 refusal to perform military service on the ground of alleged religious or conscientious objections against war, and whose 6 7 name appears on existing promotional eligible registers or on 8 any promotional eligible register that may hereafter be 9 created, shall be preferred for promotional appointments to 10 civil offices, positions, and places of employment in the 11 classified civil service of any county coming under the 12 provisions of this Division. The Civil Service Commission shall 13 give preference for promotional appointment to persons as 14 hereinabove designated whose names appear existing on 15 promotional eligible registers or promotional eliqible 16 registers that may hereafter be created by adding to the final 17 grade average which they received or will receive as the result of any promotional examination commencing prior to September 1, 18 1949 three-fourths of one point for each 6 months or fraction 19 20 thereof of military or naval service not exceeding 30 months, 21 and by adding to the final grade average which they will 22 receive as the result of any promotional examination held 23 commencing on or after September 1, 1949 seven-tenths of one point for each 6 months or fraction thereof of military or 24 25 naval service not exceeding 30 months. The numerical results 26 thus attained shall be applied by the Civil Service Commission

in determining the position of such persons on any eligible 1 2 list which has been created or will be created as the result of any promotional examination held hereunder for purposes of 3 preference in certification and appointment from such eligible 4 5 list. No person shall receive the preference for a promotional 6 appointment granted by this Section after he has received one promotion from an eligible list on which he was allowed such 7 8 preference and which was prepared as a result of an examination 9 held on or after September 1, 1949. No person entitled to 10 preference or credit for military or naval service hereunder 11 shall be required to furnish evidence or record of honorable 12 discharge from the armed forces before any examination held 13 under the provisions of this Division but such preference shall be given after the posting or publication of the eligible list 14 or register and before any certification or appointments are 15 16 made from the eligible register.

Section 15. The Illinois Municipal Code is amended by changing Sections 10-1-16 and 10-2.1-11 as follows:

#### 20 (65 ILCS 5/10-1-16) (from Ch. 24, par. 10-1-16)

Sec. 10-1-16. Veteran's preference. Persons who were engaged in the active military or naval service of the United States for a period of at least one year and who were honorably discharged therefrom and all persons who were engaged in such

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military or naval service who are now or may hereafter be on 1 2 inactive or reserve duty in such military or naval service, not 3 including, however, persons who were convicted by court-martial of disobedience of orders, 4 where such 5 disobedience consisted in the refusal to perform military service on the ground of alleged religious or conscientious 6 objections against war, shall be preferred for appointments to 7 8 civil offices, positions, and places of employment in the 9 classified service of any municipality coming under the provisions of this Division 1, provided they are found to 10 11 possess the business capacity necessary for the proper 12 discharge of the duties of such office, position, or place of 13 employment as determined by examination. For purposes of this 14 Section, if a person has been deployed, then "active duty military or naval service of the United States" includes 15 16 training and service school attendance, as defined in 10 U.S.C. 17 101(d), which is ordered pursuant to 10 U.S.C. 12301(d).

The civil service commission shall give preference points 18 19 for original appointment to qualified veterans whose names 20 appear on any register of eligibles resulting from an examination for original entrance in the classified service of 21 22 any municipality coming under the provisions of this Division 1 23 by adding to the final grade average that they receive or will receive as the result of any examination held for original 24 25 entrance, 5 points. The numerical result thus attained shall be 26 applied by the civil service commission in determining the

position of those persons on any eligibility list that has been 1 2 created as the result of any examination for original entrance for purposes of preference in certification and appointment 3 from that eligibility list. Persons who were engaged in the 4 5 active military or naval service of the United States for a 6 period of at least one year and who were honorably discharged 7 therefrom or who are now or who may hereafter be on inactive or 8 reserve duty in such military or naval service, not including, 9 however, persons who were convicted by court martial of 10 disobedience of orders where such disobedience consisted in the 11 refusal to perform military service on the ground of alleged 12 religious or conscientious objections against war, and whose 13 names appear on existing promotional eligible registers or any 14 promotional eligible register that may hereafter be created, as provided for by this Division 1, shall be preferred for 15 16 promotional appointment to civil offices, positions and places 17 employment in the classified civil service of any of municipality coming under the provisions of this Division 1. 18

The civil service commission shall give preference for 19 20 promotional appointment to persons as hereinabove designated 21 whose names appear on existing promotional eligible registers 22 or promotional eligible registers that may hereafter be created 23 by adding to the final grade average which they received or will receive as the result of any promotional examination 24 25 seven-tenths of one point for each 6 months or fraction thereof 26 of active military or naval service not exceeding 30 months.

1 The numerical result thus attained shall be applied by the 2 civil service commission in determining the position of such 3 persons on any eligible list which has been created or will be 4 created as the result of any promotional examination held 5 hereunder for purposes of preference in certification and 6 appointment from such eligible list.

No person shall receive the preference for a promotional appointment granted by this Section after he or she has received one promotion from an eligible list on which he or she was allowed such preference.

11 No person entitled to preference or credit for military or 12 naval service hereunder shall be required to furnish evidence 13 or record of honorable discharge from the armed forces before the publication or posting of any eligible register or list 14 15 resulting from the examination. Such preference shall be given 16 after the posting or publication of any eligible list or 17 register resulting from such examination and before any certifications or appointments are made from such list or 18 19 register.

Sec. 10-2.1-11. Promotional examinations-Credits to
veterans.) The board of fire and police commissioners shall
give preference for promotional appointment to persons
designated in Section 10-2.1-10 whose names appear on

promotional eligibility registers by adding to the final grade 1 2 average which they will receive as a result of any promotional examination 7/10 of one point for each 6 months or fraction 3 thereof of military or naval service not exceeding 30 months. 4 5 The numerical result thus attained shall be applied by the 6 board of fire and police commissioners in determining the position of such persons on any eligibility list as the result 7 of any promotional examination held for purposes of preference 8 9 in certification and appointment from such eligibility list.

10 No person shall receive the preference for a promotional 11 appointment granted by this Division 2.1 after he has received 12 one promotion from an eligibility list on which he was allowed 13 such preference.
