

## 101ST GENERAL ASSEMBLY State of Illinois 2019 and 2020 SB1815

Introduced 2/15/2019, by Sen. Neil Anderson

## SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

430 ILCS 65/5 430 ILCS 66/50 from Ch. 38, par. 83-5

Amends the Firearm Owners Identification Card Act. Provides that a renewed Firearm Owner's Identification Card issued under the Act shall be valid for the person to whom it is issued for a period of 10 years from the date of expiration on the previously issued Card. Amends the Firearm Concealed Carry Act. Provides that a renewed license under the Act shall be valid for the person to whom it is issued for a period of 5 years from the date of expiration of the previously issued license. Effective immediately.

## Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

- Section 5. The Firearm Owners Identification Card Act is amended by changing Section 5 as follows:
- 6 (430 ILCS 65/5) (from Ch. 38, par. 83-5)
- 7 Sec. 5. Application and renewal.
- (a) The Department of State Police shall either approve or 8 deny all applications within 30 days from the date they are received, except as provided in subsection (b) of this Section, 10 and every applicant found qualified under Section 8 of this Act 11 by the Department shall be entitled to a Firearm Owner's 12 13 Identification Card upon the payment of a \$10 fee. Any 14 applicant who is an active duty member of the Armed Forces of the United States, a member of the Illinois National Guard, or 15 16 a member of the Reserve Forces of the United States is exempt from the application fee. \$6 of each fee derived from the 17 issuance of Firearm Owner's Identification Cards, or renewals 18 19 thereof, shall be deposited in the Wildlife and Fish Fund in 20 the State Treasury; \$1 of the fee shall be deposited in the 21 State Police Services Fund and \$3 of the fee shall be deposited in the State Police Firearm Services Fund. 22
  - (b) Renewal applications shall be approved or denied within

- 60 business days, provided the applicant submitted his or her 1 2 renewal application prior to the expiration of his or her Firearm Owner's Identification Card. If a renewal application 3 has been submitted prior to the expiration date of the 5 applicant's Firearm Owner's Identification Card, the Firearm 6 Owner's Identification Card shall remain valid while the 7 Department processes the application, unless the person is 8 subject to or becomes subject to revocation under this Act. The 9 cost for a renewal application shall be \$10 which shall be 10 deposited into the State Police Firearm Services Fund.
- 11 (c) A renewed Firearm Owner's Identification Card issued

  12 under this Act shall be valid for the person to whom it is

  13 issued for a period of 10 years from the date of expiration on

  14 the previously issued Card.

- Section 10. The Firearm Concealed Carry Act is amended by changing Section 50 as follows:
- 18 (430 ILCS 66/50)
- Sec. 50. License renewal. Applications for renewal of a license shall be made to the Department. A license shall be renewed for a period of 5 years upon receipt of a completed renewal application, completion of 3 hours of training required under Section 75 of this Act, payment of the applicable renewal fee, and completion of an investigation under Section 35 of

- 1 this Act. The renewal application shall contain the information
- 2 required in Section 30 of this Act, except that the applicant
- 3 need not resubmit a full set of fingerprints. A renewed license
- 4 under this Act shall be valid for the person to whom it is
- 5 issued for a period of 5 years from the date of expiration of
- 6 <u>the previously issued license.</u>
