The Illinois Dental Practice Act is amended by 4 5 changing Sections 4 and 54.3 as follows: 6 (225 ILCS 25/4) (from Ch. 111, par. 2304) 7 (Section scheduled to be repealed on January 1, 2026) Sec. 4. Definitions. As used in this Act: 8 "Address of record" means the designated address recorded 9 by the Department in the applicant's or licensee's application 10 file or license file as maintained by the Department's 11 12 licensure maintenance unit. It is the duty of the applicant or licensee to inform the Department of any change of address and 13 14 those changes must be made either through the Department's 15 website or by contacting the Department.

- "Dental assistant" means an appropriately trained person 13
- 14 who, under the supervision of a dentist, provides dental
- 15 services as authorized by Section 17.
- 16 "Expanded function dental assistant" means a dental
- assistant who has completed the training required by Section 17
- 17.1 of this Act. 18
- "Dental laboratory" means a person, firm or corporation 19
- 20 which:
- engages in making, providing, repairing or 2.1 (i)
- 22 altering dental prosthetic appliances and other artificial
- materials and devices which are returned to a dentist for 23
- 24 insertion into the human oral cavity or which come in
- 25 contact with its adjacent structures and tissues; and

(iii) performs such functions only for a dentist or 2 dentists. 3

"Supervision" means supervision of a dental hygienist or a dental assistant requiring that a dentist authorize the procedure, remain in the dental facility while the procedure is performed, and approve the work performed by the dental hygienist or dental assistant before dismissal of the patient, but does not mean that the dentist must be present at all times in the treatment room.

"General supervision" means supervision of a dental hygienist requiring that the patient be a patient of record, that the dentist examine the patient in accordance with Section 18 prior to treatment by the dental hygienist, and that the dentist authorize the procedures which are being carried out by a notation in the patient's record, but not requiring that a dentist be present when the authorized procedures are being The issuance of a prescription to a dental performed. laboratory by a dentist does not constitute supervision.

"Public member" means a person who is not a health professional. For purposes of board membership, any person with a significant financial interest in a health service or profession is not a public member.

"Dentistry" means the healing art which is concerned with the examination, diagnosis, treatment planning and care of

1 conditions within the human oral cavity and its adjacent tissues and structures, as further specified in Section 17. 2

"Branches of dentistry" means the various specialties of dentistry which, for purposes of this Act, shall be limited to the following: endodontics, oral and maxillofacial surgery, orthodontics and dentofacial orthopedics, pediatric dentistry, periodontics, prosthodontics, and oral and maxillofacial radiology, and dental anesthesiology.

"Specialist" means a dentist who has received a specialty license pursuant to Section 11(b).

"Dental technician" means a person who owns, operates or is employed by a dental laboratory and engages in making, providing, repairing or altering dental prosthetic appliances and other artificial materials and devices which are returned to a dentist for insertion into the human oral cavity or which come in contact with its adjacent structures and tissues.

"Impaired dentist" or "impaired dental hygienist" means a dentist or dental hygienist who is unable to practice with reasonable skill and safety because of a physical or mental disability as evidenced by a written determination or written consent based on clinical evidence, including deterioration through the aging process, loss of motor skills, abuse of drugs or alcohol, or a psychiatric disorder, of sufficient degree to diminish the person's ability to deliver competent patient care.

"Nurse" means a registered professional nurse, a certified

- registered nurse, or a licensed practical nurse licensed under 2
- the Nurse Practice Act. 3
- 4 "Patient of record" means a patient for whom the patient's
- 5 most recent dentist has obtained a relevant medical and dental
- history and on whom the dentist has performed an examination 6
- and evaluated the condition to be treated. 7
- "Dental responder" means a dentist or dental hygienist who
- 9 is appropriately certified in disaster preparedness,
- 10 immunizations, and dental humanitarian medical response
- 11 consistent with the Society of Disaster Medicine and Public
- Health and training certified by the National Incident 12
- 13 Management System or the National Disaster Life Support
- 14 Foundation.
- 15 "Mobile dental van or portable dental unit" means any
- 16 self-contained or portable dental unit in which dentistry is
- practiced that can be moved, towed, or transported from one 17
- location to another in order to establish a location where 18
- 19 dental services can be provided.
- 20 "Public health dental hygienist" means a hygienist who
- 2.1 holds a valid license to practice in the State, has 2 years of
- 22 full-time clinical experience or an equivalent of 4,000 hours
- of clinical experience and has completed at least 42 clock 23
- 24 hours of additional structured courses in dental education in
- 25 advanced areas specific to public health dentistry.
- 26 "Public health setting" means a federally qualified health

- 1 center; a federal, State, or local public health facility; Head
- 2 Start; a special supplemental nutrition program for Women,
- 3 Infants, and Children (WIC) facility; or a certified
- 4 school-based health center or school-based oral health
- 5 program.
- 6 "Public health supervision" means the supervision of a
- 7 public health dental hygienist by a licensed dentist who has a
- 8 written public health supervision agreement with that public
- 9 health dental hygienist while working in an approved facility
- or program that allows the public health dental hygienist to
- 11 treat patients, without a dentist first examining the patient
- and being present in the facility during treatment, (1) who are
- 13 eligible for Medicaid or (2) who are uninsured and whose
- 14 household income is not greater than 200% of the federal
- 15 poverty level.
- "Teledentistry" means the use of telehealth systems and
- 17 methodologies in dentistry and includes <u>limited</u> patient
- 18 <u>diagnosis</u>, <u>treatment planning</u>, <u>care</u> and education delivery
- 19 using synchronous and asynchronous communications under an
- Illinois licensed $\frac{1}{2}$ dentist's authority as provided under this
- 21 Act.

Sec. 54.3. Vaccinations. 2

- (a) Notwithstanding Section 54.2 of this Act, a dentist may administer vaccinations upon completion of appropriate training set forth by rule and approved by the Department on appropriate vaccine storage, proper administration, contraindications addressing and adverse reactions. Vaccinations shall be limited to patients 18 years of age and older pursuant to a recommendation published by the Centers for Disease Control establishing a general policy on influenza vaccines or a general policy statement from the Director of Public Health regarding the administration of influenza vaccines. If a public health emergency as defined in Section 4 of the Illinois Emergency Management Agency Act is declared, a licensed dentist or licensed dental hygienist who has completed the necessary prescribed just-in-time training shall be allowed to administer any vaccine approved for patient use regardless of age during the period of the declared public health emergency and under the direction of and in coordination with the appropriate federal or State authority valid prescription or standing order by a physician licensed to practice medicine in all its branches who, in the course of professional practice, administers vaccines to patients. Methods of communication shall be established for consultation with the physician in person or by telecommunications.
 - (b) Vaccinations administered by a dentist shall be limited

vaccine influenza (inactivated influenza and live attenuated influenza intranasal vaccine). Vaccines shall only be administered by the dentist and shall not be delegated to an assistant or any other person. Vaccination of a patient by a dentist shall be documented in the patient's dental record and the record shall be retained in accordance with current dental recordkeeping standards. The dentist shall notify the patient's primary care physician of each dose of vaccine administered to the patient and shall enter all patient level data or update the patient's current record. The dentist may provide this notice to the patient's physician electronically. In addition, the dentist shall enter all patient level data on vaccines administered in the immunization data registry maintained by the Department of Public Health.

- (c) A dentist shall only provide vaccinations under this Section if contracted with and credentialed by the patient's health insurance, health maintenance organization, or other health plan to specifically provide the vaccinations allowed under this Section. Persons enrolled in Medicare or Medicaid may only receive the vaccinations allowed for under this Section from dentists who are authorized to do so by the federal Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services or the Department of Healthcare and Family Services.
- 24 (d) The Department shall adopt any rules necessary to 25 implement this Section.
 - (e) This Section is repealed on January 1, 2026.
