

2019 State Use Program Annual Report

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Overview of the Act

Pursuant to 30 ILCS 500/45-35 supplies or services may be procured without advertising or calling for bids from any qualified not-for-profit agency for persons with significant disabilities. To be eligible for qualification, not-for-profit organizations must be certified as a work center by the United States Department of Labor as an accredited vocational program and must also be accredited by a nationally recognized accrediting organization or certified as a developmental training provider by the Illinois Department of Human Services.

State Use Program Annual Report

In Fiscal Year 2019, the State Use Program reviewed and approved 247 contracts accounting for more than \$72 million in spend for various products and services between not-for-profit agencies for persons with significant disabilities and state agencies. The program provided training, employment and greater independence for approximately 1,950 disabled individuals and supplied them with 988,062 hours of work.

With continued support of this program, the number of disabled individuals with long-term employment opportunities and increased economic stability will grow. The Department of Central Management Services continues to raise awareness about the program with outreach efforts to educate State agencies about products and services offered through the State Use Program.

Procurement Procedures

State Use contracts are exempt from the competitive solicitation process. Any State agency wishing to establish a contract with a qualified State Use vendor must submit a State Use Request Letter to the State Use Coordinator minimally two weeks prior to the next scheduled Committee meeting. The Request Letter includes the vendor's name, duration, value of the contract, as well as a description of the goods or services to be provided. Upon request by the Coordinator, the proposed contracting vendor must provide a Certificate of Assurance (COA), which includes a narrative outlining the specifics of the contract and the number of persons with disabilities that could be provided employment. The Request Letter and COA are presented to the State Use Committee for review. If the proposed contract is approved by the Committee, the State agency receives an Authorization Letter from the Coordinator to proceed with the contract approval process.
