Senator McConchie offered the following Senate Resolution, which was referred to the Committee on Assignments:

SENATE RESOLUTION NO. 973

WHEREAS, According to information compiled by the Governor's Office of Executive Appointments, the State of Illinois has over 300 boards, commissions, task forces, councils, and authorities (referred to as "boards and commissions"); and

WHEREAS, These boards and commissions are created by statutes, resolutions, and Executive Orders to serve a variety of advisory and substantive functions; and

WHEREAS, There are cumulatively hundreds of members on these boards and commissions; and

WHEREAS, Compensation to members of boards and commissions ranges from set salaries, stipends, or per diems to reimbursement of expenses only; and

WHEREAS, State agency directors and employees often serve as members of boards and commissions or provide administrative support to boards and commissions, or both, in addition to performing their regular duties; and

WHEREAS, According to findings of the Auditor General, some boards and commissions are not fulfilling their mission, including boards and commissions that were never established, were established at one time but are now inactive, have long-term vacancies, have members serving expired terms, or have failed to meet periodically as required; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE SENATE OF THE ONE HUNDRED FIRST GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that the Auditor General is directed to conduct a management audit of the State's boards and commissions; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the audit include, but not be limited to, the following for every known State board and commission:

- (1) its name and purpose;
- (2) the number of appointed members and the number of vacancies and the length of the vacancies;
- (3) costs of member stipends, salaries, and per diems and expense reimbursements to members and State officials and employees for attending board and commission meetings during Fiscal Years 2019 and 2020;
- (4) the date of each of the board's or commission's meetings during Fiscal Years 2019 and 2020 and the number of members in attendance and the number of members absent; and
- (5) identification of any report or work product prepared and made available by the board or commission during Fiscal Years 2019 and 2020; and be it further

RESOLVED, That all State agencies and boards and commissions and any other entity having information relevant to this audit cooperate fully and promptly with the Auditor General's Office in the conduct of this audit; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Auditor General commence this audit as soon as possible and report his or her findings and recommendations upon completion in accordance with the provisions of Section 3-14 of the Illinois State Auditing Act; and be it further

RESOLVED, That a copy of this resolution be delivered to the Auditor General.

Senator Lightford offered the following Senate Resolution, which was referred to the Committee on Assignments:

SENATE RESOLUTION NO. 974

WHEREAS, The Older Americans Act (OAA) provides essential services that help older adults live independently, such as meal programs, home assistance, support for family caregivers, transportation, protection from abuse, and other services; state programs funded by the OAA must target services to the older Americans with the greatest economic and social needs; and

WHEREAS, The bipartisan OAA has been reauthorized numerous times since it was first enacted in 1965; most recently, the OAA was reauthorized for a three-year period through the Older Americans Act Reauthorization Act of 2016, but it expired on September 30, 2019; reauthorization has been passed by the U.S. House of Representatives through the Dignity in Aging Act of 2019 and is being considered by the U.S. Senate; and

WHEREAS, Growth in the population of older adults significantly outpaces OAA appropriations, and funding has not kept pace with inflation; the population of older adults increased by 23.5 percent from 2010 to 2017, and meanwhile, appropriations for OAA decreased by 16 percent or about \$400 million in the last 18 years when adjusted for inflation; funding in 2010 was \$42.95 per senior in today's dollars but has dropped to \$27.25 per senior; and

WHEREAS, There is significant unmet need among older adults for the services supported through the OAA; according to a 2015 report from the U.S. Government Accountability Office, 24 percent of low-income older adults were food insecure, and 83 percent of them did not receive home-delivered or congregate meal services; nutrition programs make up about 40 percent of OAA funding; additionally, the report found that 2 out of 3 adults who have difficulty completing daily activities have limited or no access to home-based care, which can be provided through the OAA; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE SENATE OF THE ONE HUNDRED FIRST GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we urge the President and Congress of the United States to reauthorize the Older Americans Act and restore funding to Fiscal Year 2010 levels adjusted for inflation; and be it further

RESOLVED, That copies of this resolution be delivered to the President of the United States, the President of the United States Senate, the Speaker of the United States House of Representatives, and the members of the Illinois congressional delegation.

Senator Villivalam offered the following Senate Resolution, which was referred to the Committee on Assignments:

SENATE RESOLUTION NO. 978

WHEREAS, In 1992, the State of Illinois established the sister-state relationship with the Taiwan Province, the Republic of China (Taiwan); Illinois and Taiwan have enjoyed strong bilateral trade, educational and cultural exchanges, and tourism throughout their relationship; and

WHEREAS, Taiwan shares the same values of freedom, democracy, human rights, the rule of law, peace, and prosperity with the United States and the State of Illinois; and

WHEREAS, The United States ranks as Taiwan's second largest trading partner, and Taiwan is the United States' eleventh largest trading partner; bilateral trade between the two countries reached \$76.3 billion in U.S. dollars in 2018; and

WHEREAS, Taiwan and the State of Illinois have enjoyed a long and mutually beneficial relationship with the prospect of future growth; in 2018, Taiwan was Illinois' sixth largest export market in Asia with \$832 million U.S. dollars worth of Illinois' goods exported to Taiwan; and

WHEREAS, Negotiations for a Bilateral Trade Agreement between Taiwan and the United States are an important step towards further strengthening bilateral trade between our two countries; and

WHEREAS, This Bilateral Trade Agreement would increase Illinois exports to Taiwan and create bilateral investment and technical collaboration through tariff reduction and other trade facilitation measures; and

WHEREAS, Taiwan has taken a policy of "steadfast diplomacy" in its international relations; Taiwan is capable of fulfilling and is willing to fulfill its responsibilities and to collaborate with the world to deal with the challenges we face, including humanitarian aid and disease control; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE SENATE OF THE ONE HUNDRED FIRST GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we reaffirm our commitment to strengthening and deepening the sister ties between the State of Illinois and Taiwan; and be it further

RESOLVED, That we endorse Taiwan's efforts to secure the signing of a Bilateral Trade Agreement with the United States, and we reiterate our support for a closer economic and trade partnership between the State of Illinois and Taiwan; and be it further

RESOLVED, That we continue to support Taiwan's meaningful participation in international organizations that impact the health, safety, and well-being of its citizens and Taiwan's aspiration to make more contributions in international societies; and be it further

RESOLVED, That suitable copies of this resolution be delivered to the members of the Illinois Congressional Delegation and the Taipei Economic and Cultural Office in Chicago.

Senator Morrison offered the following Senate Resolution, which was referred to the Committee on Assignments:

SENATE RESOLUTION NO. 982

WHEREAS, Volumes of crude oil shipments have risen rapidly in the 2010s relative to previous decades; and

WHEREAS, The U.S. Department of Transportation (DOT) remains committed to transporting flammable liquids by all modes of transportation; this includes the nation's 140,000-mile freight railroad network that is often located near such public areas as neighborhoods and schools, endangering citizens by placing them unknowingly within blast and evacuations zones; and

WHEREAS, The rail transportation of large volumes of crude oil and other petroleum products presents unique safety risks; and

WHEREAS, Incidents such as the derailment in Lac-Mégantic, Quebec, Canada, when a unit train carrying crude oil from the Bakken region of North Dakota killed 47 unsuspecting people and decimated most of the village, have resulted in significant and devastating loss of life and destruction of property and the environment; and

WHEREAS, The safe and successful management of any hazardous materials incident is based on effective pre-incident planning, preparedness, training, exercises, and implementation of an incident management system; and

WHEREAS, The Pipeline and Hazardous Materials Safety Administration (PHMSA), in consultation with the Federal Railroad Administration (FRA), issued a final rule to improve oil spill response readiness and mitigate effects of rail accidents and incidents involving petroleum oil and high-hazard flammable trains (HHFTs); and

WHEREAS, The intent of comprehensive oil spill response plans (COSRPs) requirements is to ensure that local emergency responders and emergency response planning officials have access to sufficient information regarding the movement of HHFTs in their jurisdictions to adequately plan and prepare for emergency events; and

WHEREAS, Government concern regarding the dissemination of "sensitive security information" should not surpass a parent's right to information necessary in allowing them to make decisions related to securing the safety of their child or the school faculty and staff's right to safe working conditions; and

WHEREAS, In order for school personnel to manage a hazardous materials incident safely and successfully, they too must take part in effective pre-incident planning, preparedness, training, exercises, and implementation of an incident management system; and

WHEREAS, Even without derailling, spilling, or exploding, doctors have warned that proximity to oil trains poses a serious health risk with increasing rates in cancer, asthma, and cardiovascular disease through exposure to particulate matter released as emissions from trains; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE SENATE OF THE ONE HUNDRED FIRST GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we urge local emergency response planning officials to partner with school districts in their region in order to disseminate information pertaining to safety threats related to the storage and transport of hazardous substances, including petroleum oil and HHFTs, to the parents of attending students, faculty and staff, and schools at risk of being negatively impacted by storage facilities and/or the transport of such hazardous materials; and be it further

RESOLVED, That we urge local emergency response planning officials to include school districts in their region in the development and implementation of oil spill response plans specific to incidents involving the storage and transport of hazardous materials, including petroleum oil and HHFTs; and be it further

RESOLVED, That suitable copies of this resolution be delivered to all emergency response planning committees throughout the state.

Senator Joyce offered the following Senate Resolution, which was referred to the Committee on Assignments:

SENATE RESOLUTION NO. 983

WHEREAS, February 2020 has been designated Career and Technical Education Month by the Association for Career and Technical Education; and

WHEREAS, Career and technical education offers students the opportunity to gain the academic, technical, and employability skills necessary for true career readiness; and

WHEREAS, Students in career and technical education programs participate in authentic, meaningful experiences that improve the quality of their education and increase their engagement and achievement; and

WHEREAS, Career and technical education provides students with career exploration opportunities earlier in their educational experience, which enables them to make informed and beneficial decisions about their academic coursework and pursue established programs of study and career pathways; and

WHEREAS, Leaders from business and industry nationwide report increasing challenges related to addressing the skills gap and connecting qualified professionals with available careers in critical and growing CTE-related fields, including healthcare, energy, advanced manufacturing, cybersecurity, and information technology; and

WHEREAS, Career and technical education prepares students for these and other fulfilling careers by offering integrated programs of study that link secondary and postsecondary education and lead to the attainment of industry-recognized credentials; and

WHEREAS, Career and technical education programs ensure that employers have access to a qualified and thriving workforce, ensuring America has a strong and competitive economy; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE SENATE OF THE ONE HUNDRED FIRST GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we declare February of 2020 as Career and Technical Education Month in the State of Illinois.

Senator Castro offered the following Senate Resolution, which was referred to the Committee on Assignments:

SENATE RESOLUTION NO. 987

WHEREAS, Distracted driving occurs when motorists engage in activities that divert their attention from driving safely; these can include texting, talking on a cell phone, adjusting the radio, and interacting with passengers; and

WHEREAS, Safe driving and public awareness of the dangers associated with distracted driving will result in fewer traffic crashes, fewer injuries, and fewer fatalities; and

WHEREAS, In 2015, distracted driving was a factor in motor vehicle crashes that killed 3,459 people nationally; and

WHEREAS, Educating and informing the public about distracted driving, enhancing public awareness of the dangers associated with driving while distracted, ensuring younger drivers understand the consequences of driving distracted, and obeying established distracted driving traffic laws will reduce the number of fatalities and injuries; and

WHEREAS, The Illinois Association of Chiefs of Police (ILACP) and their partner the American Automobile Association (AAA), supported by the Illinois State Police, the Illinois Department of Transportation, the Illinois High School & College Driver Education Association (IHSCDEA), local law enforcement agencies, and the State's first responders, are committed to educating Illinois residents on all aspects of distracted driving, to enforcing applicable State laws and to supporting Illinois Distracted Driving Awareness Week; and

WHEREAS, The ILACP and the AAA continue to develop partnerships designed to create and enhance a strong, supportive traffic safety culture throughout Illinois; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE SENATE OF THE ONE HUNDRED FIRST GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we declare the fourth week of April 2020 as "Illinois Distracted Driving Awareness Week" in remembrance of John M. Sligting; and be it further

RESOLVED, That suitable copies of this resolution be presented to the Illinois Association of Chiefs of Police, the American Automobile Association, the Illinois State Police, the Illinois Department of Transportation, and the Illinois High School & College Driver Education Association.

Senator Bertino-Tarrant offered the following Senate Resolution, which was referred to the Committee on Assignments:

SENATE RESOLUTION NO. 988

WHEREAS, On January 1, 2016, Silver Search legislation was passed by the Illinois General Assembly; and

WHEREAS, The Silver Search Task Force was created to bring agencies and organizations together with the common goal of creating a Silver Search program and toolkit to assist in missing person cases involving those with Alzheimer's or dementia; and

WHEREAS, The Silver Search program brings to light the increasing incidence of people with Alzheimer's or dementia that get lost and the ways in which the public can help law enforcement return them home safely; and

WHEREAS, Silver Search utilizes an Endangered Missing Person Advisory when a person with Alzheimer's or dementia goes missing; the purpose of the advisory is to get as many eyes looking for a missing person as possible; emails, faxes, radio and television broadcasts, text messages, and law enforcement bulletins are all means to disseminate the information about a missing person; and

WHEREAS, Because of the partnership with the Illinois Department of Transportation and the Illinois Tollway Authority, the dynamic message signs on the interstates and tollways can now be utilized during advisories when a person is missing while driving a vehicle; and

WHEREAS, Of the 121 Silver Alerts that have been issued since the creation of the Silver Search program, all but one person has been found; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE SENATE OF THE ONE HUNDRED FIRST GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we urge county authorities throughout the State to utilize the Silver Search program more frequently.

Senator McClure offered the following Senate Joint Resolution, which was referred to the Committee on Assignments:

SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 59

WHEREAS, It is highly fitting that the Illinois General Assembly pays honor and respect to those individuals who have served our country and, in doing so, have made the ultimate sacrifice for our nation; and

WHEREAS, Ronald E. Powers was born on June 12, 1948 and was raised in Macoupin County; and

WHEREAS, Ronald Powers joined the United States Army and served as a Private First Class with the 9th Infantry Division, 1st Battalion, 16th Infantry, Combat Support Company; and

WHEREAS, PFC Powers began his tour of duty in South Vietnam on September 5, 1968; and

WHEREAS, On October 4, 1968, PFC Powers was killed in action while serving in the Dinh Tuong Province in South Vietnam; and

WHEREAS, PFC Powers was awarded the Purple Heart, the Bronze Star, the National Defense Medal, the Vietnam Service Medal, and the Vietnam Campaign Medal; his name can be found on the Vietnam Veterans Memorial on Panel 41w, line 7; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE SENATE OF THE ONE HUNDRED FIRST GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES CONCURRING HEREIN, that we designate Illinois Route 16 from its intersection with Illinois Route 111 to its intersection with US Route 67 as the "PFC Ronald E. Powers Memorial Highway"; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Illinois Department of Transportation is requested to erect at suitable locations, consistent with State and federal regulations, appropriate plaques or signs giving notice of the name "PFC Ronald E. Powers Memorial Highway"; and be it further

RESOLVED, That suitable copies of this resolution be presented to the family of PFC Powers and the Secretary of the Illinois Department of Transportation.

Senator Crowe offered the following Senate Joint Resolution, which was ordered printed and referred to the Committee on Assignments:

**SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION
CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT NO. 14**

SC0014

RESOLVED, BY THE SENATE OF THE ONE HUNDRED FIRST GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES CONCURRING HEREIN, that there shall be submitted to the electors of the State for adoption or rejection at the general election next occurring at least 6 months after the adoption of this resolution a proposition to amend Section 6 of Article VII as follows:

ARTICLE VII
LOCAL GOVERNMENT

SECTION 6. POWERS OF HOME RULE UNITS

(a) A County which has a chief executive officer elected by the electors of the county and any municipality which has a population of more than 5,000 ~~25,000~~ are home rule units. Other municipalities may elect by referendum to become home rule units. Except as limited by this Section, a home rule unit may exercise any power and perform any function pertaining to its government and affairs including, but not limited to, the power to regulate for the protection of the public health, safety, morals and welfare; to license; to tax; and to incur debt.

(b) A home rule unit by referendum may elect not to be a home rule unit.

(c) If a home rule county ordinance conflicts with an ordinance of a municipality, the municipal ordinance shall prevail within its jurisdiction.

(d) A home rule unit does not have the power (1) to incur debt payable from ad valorem property tax receipts maturing more than 40 years from the time it is incurred or (2) to define and provide for the punishment of a felony.

(e) A home rule unit shall have only the power that the General Assembly may provide by law (1) to punish by imprisonment for more than six months or (2) to license for revenue or impose taxes upon or measured by income or earnings or upon occupations.

(f) A home rule unit shall have the power subject to approval by referendum to adopt, alter or repeal a form of government provided by law, except that the form of government of Cook County shall be subject to the provisions of Section 3 of this Article. A home rule municipality shall have the power to provide for its officers, their manner of selection and terms of office only as approved by referendum or as otherwise authorized by law. A home rule county shall have the power to provide for its officers, their manner of selection and terms of office in the manner set forth in Section 4 of this Article.

(g) The General Assembly by a law approved by the vote of three-fifths of the members elected to each house may deny or limit the power to tax and any other power or function of a home rule unit not exercised or performed by the State other than a power or function specified in subsection (l) of this section.

(h) The General Assembly may provide specifically by law for the exclusive exercise by the State of any power or function of a home rule unit other than a taxing power or a power or function specified in subsection (l) of this Section.

(i) Home rule units may exercise and perform concurrently with the State any power or function of a home rule unit to the extent that the General Assembly by law does not specifically limit the concurrent exercise or specifically declare the State's exercise to be exclusive.

(j) The General Assembly may limit by law the amount of debt which home rule counties may incur and may limit by law approved by three-fifths of the members elected to each house the amount of debt, other than debt payable from ad valorem property tax receipts, which home rule municipalities may incur.

(k) The General Assembly may limit by law the amount and require referendum approval of debt to be incurred by home rule municipalities, payable from ad valorem property tax receipts, only in excess of the following percentages of the assessed value of its taxable property: (1) if its population is 500,000 or more, an aggregate of three percent; (2) if its population is more than 5,000 ~~25,000~~ and less than 500,000, an aggregate of one percent; and (3) if its population is 5,000 ~~25,000~~ or less, an aggregate of one-half percent. Indebtedness which is outstanding on the effective date of this Constitution or which is thereafter approved by referendum or assumed from another unit of local government shall not be included in the foregoing percentage amounts.

(l) The General Assembly may not deny or limit the power of home rule units (1) to make local improvements by special assessment and to exercise this power jointly with other counties and municipalities, and other classes of units of local government having that power on the effective date of this Constitution unless that power is subsequently denied by law to any such other units of local government or (2) to levy or impose additional taxes upon areas within their boundaries in the manner provided by law for the provision of special services to those areas and for the payment of debt incurred in order to provide those special services.

(m) Powers and functions of home rule units shall be construed liberally.

Today, I veto House Bill 3902 from the 101st General Assembly, which would have amended the Use Tax Act, the Service Use Tax Act, the Service Occupation Tax Act, and the Retailers' Occupation Tax Act and applied a sales tax exemption for materials, parts, equipment, components, and furnishings incorporated into or upon an aircraft as part of the modification, refurbishment, completion, replacement, repair, or maintenance of a private aircraft continuously from January 1, 2010 through December 31, 2024.

My administration appreciates the hard work of the sponsors of this legislation in the House and Senate. However, I am opposed to providing a sales tax exemption to private aircraft companies. The delinquent taxes owed from Illinois' private jet companies amounts to roughly \$50 million, including interest and penalties, and if House Bill 3902 became law, the state would be allowing an additional \$10 million per year in tax credits through 2024.

Giving private aircraft companies tens of millions of dollars in past due tax forgiveness is not the right fiscal decision for our state as we face billions in debt associated with unpaid bills, a multi-billion-dollar structural deficit, and critical needs in schools and public safety services.

My administration is committed to growing Illinois' economy, spurring competition, and creating jobs in every region of the state. I've taken several steps to accomplish this objective, with the strong bipartisan support of the General Assembly in efforts that extend beyond any single industry.

- Together, we enacted the historic \$45 billion Rebuild Illinois plan, which will support and create hundreds of thousands of jobs, fix our long-neglected roads and bridges, invest in higher education and bring broadband to every part of the state.
- We also extended the Research and Development Tax Credit, helping manufacturers who are seeking certainty in the long-term.
- We expanded and made permanent the Manufacturers' Purchase Credit, allowing companies to receive a sales tax exemption for machinery or equipment used to manufacture personal property for retail sale or lease.
- We eliminated the Corporate Franchise Tax, which affects every business operating in the state of Illinois – small businesses most of all.
- We created a new apprenticeship tax credit, which will cover up to \$3,500 of qualified education expenses incurred by employers on behalf of a qualifying apprentice.
- We expanded a set of tax credits for relocating and expanding businesses through the Blue Collar Jobs Act.

Most importantly, we are working to balance our budget and to provide a stable fiscal environment upon which to build a thriving economy. Allowing this past due tax forgiveness to the private jet industry at this time is not in line with this vision.

Therefore, pursuant to Section 9(b) of Article IV of the Illinois Constitution of 1970, I hereby return House Bill 3902, entitled "AN ACT concerning revenue," with the forgoing objections, vetoed in its entirety.
