AMENDMENT NO. <u>1</u>. Amend Senate Bill 611 by replacing everything after the enacting clause with the following:

"Section 5. The Illinois Health Facilities Planning Act is amended by changing Section 19.6 as follows:

(20 ILCS 3960/19.6)

(Section scheduled to be repealed on April 1, 2007)

Sec. 19.6. Repeal. This Act is repealed on May 31 April 1, 2007.

Section 99. Effective date. This Act takes effect upon becoming law.".
