#### PRESENTATION OF RESOLUTION

Senator John J. Cullerton, President of the Senate; Senator Radogno, Minority Leader of the Senate; and all Senators, offered the following Senate Resolution:

#### **SENATE RESOLUTION NO. 37**

WHEREAS, Article IV, Section 14, of the Illinois Constitution provides that, when the Governor of the State of Illinois is tried on impeachment, the Chief Justice of the Illinois Supreme Court shall preside over the Senate; and

WHEREAS, Pursuant to the Senate Impeachment Rules, on January 14, 2009, the Senate notified Thomas R. Fitzgerald, Chief Justice of the Illinois Supreme Court, of the time and place fixed for consideration of the article of impeachment against Rod R. Blagojevich, Governor of the State of

Illinois, and requested the Chief Justice to attend; and

WHEREAS, In the intervening days since January 14, 2009, Chief Justice Fitzgerald has presided over the Senate, when sitting as an impeachment tribunal for the purpose of trying the article of impeachment, for long hours over many days; and

WHEREAS, Chief Justice Fitzgerald, in presiding over the Senate, has exhibited extraordinary qualities of fairness, patience, equanimity, and wisdom; and

WHEREAS, By his manner of presiding over the Senate, Chief Justice Fitzgerald has contributed greatly to the Senate's decorum and has ensured that the impeachment trial proceedings were in all respects consistent with the Senate's Impeachment Rules and fair, impartial, and dignified to both the House Prosecutor and Governor; and

WHEREAS, The Senate and the State of Illinois are indebted to Chief Justice Fitzgerald for his distinguished and valued service in fulfilling his constitutional duty to preside over the Senate in the trial of the article of impeachment; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE SENATE OF THE NINETY-SIXTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that the Senate expresses its profound gratitude to Thomas R. Fitzgerald, Chief Justice of the Illinois Supreme Court, for his distinguished service in presiding over the Senate, while sitting as an impeachment tribunal for the purpose of trying the article of impeachment against Rod R. Blagojevich, Governor of the State of Illinois; and be it further

RESOLVED, That a suitable copy of this resolution be presented to the Chief Justice of the Illinois Supreme Court as a symbol of our appreciation for his distinguished service to the People of Illinois.

Senator Cullerton, having asked and obtained unanimous consent to suspend the rules for the immediate consideration of the foregoing resolution, moved its adoption.

The motion prevailed.

And the resolution was adopted.

At the hour of 5:06 o clock p.m., Senator Cullerton moved that the Regular Session of the Senate be granted leave to approve the final Journals of the Impeachment Tribunal, where such Journals have not, prior to adjournment sine die, been approved by the Impeachment Tribunal.

The motion carried.

At the hour of 5:08 o'clock p.m., Senator Cullerton moved the Senate arise from sitting as an Impeachment Tribunal.

The Chair announced the Senate has arisen from sitting as an Impeachment Tribunal, and the Impeachment Tribunal is adjourned SINE DIE.

Whereupon the Senate resumed consideration of regular business.

The Honorable President John J. Cullerton, presiding.

The Chair appointed the following members to escort Chief Justice of the Supreme Court Thomas Fitzgerald from the Senate Chamber: Senators Silverstein, Kotowski, Koehler, Lauzen, Dillard, and Cronin.
