The report concludes with a database listing all of the requests received, organized by Senate and House districts, including those requests for waivers and modifications acted on by the State Superintendent of Education in accordance with Section 1A-4 of the School Code (105 ILCS 5/1A-4) and applications that have been returned to school districts or other eligible applicants.

Executive Summary

The following report outlines waivers of School Code mandates that school districts, regional offices of education, or special education or vocational education cooperatives have requested since the last report, which was transmitted in February 2011. Pursuant to Section 2-3.25g of the School Code (105 ILCS 5/2-3.25g), these requests must be sent to the General Assembly for its consideration before October 1, 2011.

The report is organized by subject area and by school district, regional office, or special education or vocational education cooperative. The General Assembly may disapprove the report in whole or in part within 60 calendar days after each chamber next convenes once the report is filed. This is done by a joint resolution. If either chamber fails to reject a waiver request, then that request is deemed granted.

Section I summarizes the 47 requests received for waivers of School Code mandates for consideration by the General Assembly, which are presented alphabetically by topic area. The largest number of applications received (15 requests) seeks waivers from daily physical education. There are 13 requests for non-resident tuition, and nine requests for driver education requirements, which includes eight requests to increase the fee and one request not to offer either portion of driver's education. There are five requests for limitation of administrative costs, three requests for school inservice training, and one request each for content of evaluation plans and computation of General State Aid.

This document also contains one other section beyond what is required under Section 2-3.25g of the School Code. Section II is a database with listings of modifications or waivers of State Board of Education rules and modifications of School Code mandates upon which the State Superintendent of Education has acted in accordance with Section 1A-4 of the School Code (105 ILCS 5/1A-4). The database also includes listings of requests that have been returned to or withdrawn by the petitioning entities. In addition, the database includes the 47 waiver requests for the General Assembly's consideration and is organized by Senate and House districts.

Complete copies of the waiver requests for the General Assembly's consideration have been made available to legislative staff.

This is the thirty-third report submitted pursuant to Section 2-3.25g of the School Code, which requires that the State Board of Education through agency staff compile and submit requests for waivers of School Code mandates to the General Assembly before March 1 and October 1 of each year.

Keeneyville ESD 20 - DuPage (SD 28/HD 56) / Expiration: 2015-16 school year

WM100-5520 (renewal) – **Waiver of School Code** (Section 24A-5) request to allow the district to replace the teacher evaluation rating scale of "excellent, satisfactory, and unsatisfactory" with a teacher evaluation process with ratings of "Professional Growth Track – no rating" and "Professional Support Track – satisfactory or unsatisfactory."

Rockford SD 205 – Winnebago (SD 34/HD 67) / Expiration: 2015-16 school year

WM100-5483-4 – **Waiver of School Code** (Section 27-24.2) request to allow the district not to offer either portion of driver's education (classroom or behind-the-wheel) to its students. The district states that it will instead offer students access to driver education through outside vendors whose rates are within \$60 of the maximum fee imposed by Section 27-24.2 of the School Code (105 ILCS 5/27-24.2). (Note: at the time of Rockford's waiver application the maximum driver's education fee was still \$50; it was raised to \$250 later in the year through passage of Public Act 97-145.)

Stewardson – Strasburg CUSD 5A – Shelby, Effingham (SD 55/HD 109) / Expiration: 2015-16 school year

WM100-5488 – Waiver of School Code (Section 27-24.2) request to allow the district to charge a fee not to exceed \$250 of students who participate in driver education courses.

Plano CUSD 88 - Kendall (SD 25/HD 50) / Expiration: 2015-16 school year

WM100-5490 – **Waiver of School Code** (Section 27-24.2) request to allow the district to charge a fee not to exceed \$300 of students who participate in driver education courses.

Barrington CUSD 220 – Lake (SD 26/HD 52) / Expiration: 2015-16 school year WM100-5493 (renewal) – Waiver of School Code (Section 27-24.2) request to allow the district to

charge a fee not to exceed \$350 of students who participate in driver education courses.

Downers Grove CHSD 99 – DuPage (SD 24/HD 47) / Expiration: 2015-16 school year

WM100-5501 (renewal) – **Waiver of School Code** (Section 27-24.2) request to allow the district to charge a fee not to exceed \$350 of students who participate in driver education courses.

Carpentersville CUSD 300 – Kane (SD 22/HD 43) / Expiration: 2015-16 school year

WM100-5503 (renewal) – **Waiver of School Code** (Section 27-24.2) request to allow the district to charge a fee not to exceed \$300 of students who participate in driver education courses.

Ridgewood HSD 234 – Cook (SD 10/HD 20) / Expiration: 2015-16 school year

WM100-5504-1 (renewal) – **Waiver of School Code** (Section 27-24.2) request to allow the district to charge a fee not to exceed \$500 of students who participate in driver education courses.

Mundelein CHSD 120 – Lake (SD 26/HD 51) / Expiration: 2016-17 school year

WM100-5530-2 (renewal) – Waiver of School Code (Section 27-24.2) request to allow the district to charge a fee not to exceed \$500 of students who participate in driver education courses. If approved, this waiver would take effect in the 2012-2013 school year.

General State Aid

Rockford SD 205 - Winnebago (SD 34/HD 67) / Expiration: 2016-17 school year

WM100-5483-1 (renewal) – **Waiver of School Code** (Section 18-8.05(F)(2)) request to allow the district to count the attendance of students enrolled full-time in its middle and high schools in much the same way as the attendance of students enrolled part-time is counted, by claiming one-sixth of a day for each class period of at least 50 minutes attended by a student (up to a maximum of six classes per day). If approved, this waiver would take effect in the 2012-2013 school year.

Limitation of Administrative Costs

Ball - Chatham CUSD 5 - Sangamon (SD 50/HD 100) / Expiration: 2010-11 school year

WM100-5491 – **Waiver of School Code** (Section 17-1.5) request to allow the district to waive the limitation of administrative costs due to circumstances beyond its control. The district withdrew from a special education cooperative in order to better serve its students' needs. This action entailed the hiring of a director of special education services and associated support staff. The addition of these new positions, along with the employment of an interim certified school business official, caused the district's administrative costs for FY 2011 to exceed the 5 percent limitation.

Atwood Heights SD 125 – Cook (SD 18/HD 35) / Expiration: 2010-11 school year

WM100-5507 – **Waiver of School Code** (Section 17-1.5) request to allow the district to waive the limitation of administrative costs due to circumstances beyond its control. The superintendent's administrative assistant retired at the end of FY 2011 and an extra secretary was hired for one year only to assist with office operations while another administrative assistant was being trained. The increased expenses necessary to cover this one-time situation caused the district's costs to exceed the 5 percent limitation.

Northwestern CUSD 2 – Macoupin (SD 49/HD 97) / Expiration: 2010-11 school year

WM100-5508 – **Waiver of School Code** (Section 17-1.5) request to allow the district to waive the limitation of administrative costs due to circumstances beyond its control. In previous years the costs for the superintendent's secretary and the special education director had been paid out of incorrect accounts. In FY 2011 these costs were reallocated to the appropriate line items. These transfers to the correct accounts caused the district's administrative costs to exceed the 5 percent limitation.

Dallas ESD 327 – Hancock, Henderson (SD 47/HD 94) / Expiration: 2010-11 school year

WM100-5519 – Waiver of School Code (Section 17-1.5) request to allow the district to waive the limitation of administrative costs due to circumstances beyond its control. The district shares its superintendent with LaHarpe CSD 347; LaHarpe bills the Dallas district each year for its share of the superintendent's costs. Late billing caused expenses for FY 2010 to be paid in FY 2011, while actual expenses for FY 2011 were also received and paid for during the same fiscal year. The imbalance in administrative expenses between the two fiscal years caused administrative costs for Dallas to exceed the 5 percent limitation. New accounting procedures have been put in place in both districts to prevent such an occurrence in the future.

Dongola USD 66 - Union (SD 59/HD 118) / Expiration: 2011-12 school year

WM100-5533 – **Waiver of School Code** (Section 17-1.5) request to allow the district to waive the limitation of administrative costs due to circumstances beyond its control. The district wants to employ a full-time superintendent in lieu of an interim superintendent for the 2011-2012 school year and expects that this personnel change will have a positive impact on student performance. The anticipated salary increase will cause the district's administrative costs to exceed the 5 percent limitation.

WM100-5480 – **Waiver of School Code** (Section 10-20.12a) request to enable the district to allow nonresident students whose parents are full-time certified employees of the district to attend its schools free of charge.

Crab Orchard CUSD 3 - Williamson (SD 59/HD 117) / Expiration: 2015-16 school year

WM100-5485 (renewal) – **Waiver of School Code** (Section 10-20.12a) request to enable the district to allow non-resident students whose parents are employees of the district to attend its schools free of charge.

Rankin CSD 98 - Tazewell (SD 46/HD 91) / Expiration: 2015-16 school year

WM100-5496 – Waiver of School Code (Section 10-20.12a) request to enable the district to allow nonresident students whose parents are full-time faculty members of the district to attend its schools free of charge.

River Ridge CUSD 210 – Jo Daviess (SD 45/HD 89) / Expiration: 2015-16 school year

WM100-5497 – Waiver of School Code (Section 10-20.12a) request to enable the district to allow nonresident students whose parents are full-time employees of the district to attend its schools free of charge.

Warsaw CUSD 316 - Hancock (SD 47/HD 94) / Expiration: 2015-16 school year

WM100-5498 – Waiver of School Code (Section 10-20.12a) request to enable the district to allow nonresident students whose parents are full-time employees of the district to attend its schools free of charge.

Riverdale CUSD 100 – Rock Island (SD 36/HD 71) / Expiration: 2015-16 school year

WM100-5505 – **Waiver of School Code** (Section 10-20.12a) request to enable the district to allow nonresident students whose parents are full-time faculty members of the district to attend its schools free of charge.

West Central CUSD 325 – Henderson (SD 47/HD 94) / Expiration: 2015-16 school year WM100-5518 – Waiver of School Code (Section 10-20.12a) request to enable the district to allow non-

resident students whose parents are employees of the district to attend its schools free of charge.

Waverly CUSD 6 - Morgan (SD 49/HD 97) / Expiration: 2016-17 school year

WM100-5526 – Waiver of School Code (Section 10-20.12a) request to enable the district to allow nonresident students whose parents are full-time employees of the district to attend its schools free of charge. If approved, this waiver would take effect in the 2012-2013 school year.

Mendon CUSD 4 – Adams, Hancock (SD 47/HD 93) / Expiration: 2016-17 school year

WM100-5528 – Waiver of School Code (Section 10-20.12a) request to enable the district to allow nonresident students whose parents are full-time employees of the district to attend its schools free of charge. If approved, this waiver would take effect in the 2012-2013 school year.

Tamaroa GSD 5 – Perry (SD 58/HD 115) / Expiration: 2016-17 school year

WM100-5532 – **Waiver of School Code** (Section 10-20.12a) request to enable the district to allow nonresident students whose parents are employees of the district to attend its schools free of charge. If approved, this waiver would take effect in the 2012-2013 school year.

Physical Education

Rockford SD 205 - Winnebago (SD 34/HD 67) / Expiration: 2012-13 school year

WM100-5483-3 (renewal) – Waiver of School Code (Section 27-6) request to allow the district to excuse students in grades 6 through 10 from the daily physical education requirement in order to participate in interscholastic athletics and students in grades 6 through 12 from the daily physical education requirement in order to take other elective courses, such as fine arts, foreign languages, technology, and advanced academic courses. Due to financial difficulties, the district has reduced its schedule to six periods a day, and it contends that the waiver will enable students to enroll in additional coursework needed for college admissions and to compete for scholarships.

Winnebago CUSD 323 - Winnebago (SD 45/HD 89) / Expiration: 2012-13 school year

WM100-5511 – Waiver of School Code (Section 27-6) request to allow the district to excuse students in grades 11 and 12 from the daily physical education requirement for enrollment in the Running Start Program at Rock Valley College. This dual-enrollment program allows students to complete high school graduation requirements while simultaneously completing requirements for an associate's degree.

Washington District 50 Schools - Tazewell (SD 53/HD 106) / Expiration: 2013-14 school year

WM100-5512 (renewal) – Waiver of School Code (Section 27-6) request to allow the district to permit students in kindergarten through grade 8 to participate in physical education on less than a daily basis due to inadequate facilities. Students in kindergarten will have 25 minutes of physical education two times a week; students in first grade will have 25 minutes of instruction three times a week; and students in grades 2 and 3 will have 25 minutes of physical education four times a week. In addition, students in these grades will have 25 minutes of physical education four times a week. In addition, students in these grades will have two 15-minute recess periods daily. Students in grades 4 and 5 will have 35 minutes of instruction three times a week in one semester, and four such sessions a week in the following semester, with one 15-minute recess period each day; and students in grades 6 through 8 will participate in physical education for 48 minutes each day for one semester. The district states that under the proposed waiver, additional time can be devoted to the core academic curriculum, thus helping to decrease the number of students who are not achieving state standards. If approved, this waiver would take effect in the 2012-2013 school year.

Golf SD 67 – Cook (SD 8/HD 15) / Expiration: 2013-14 school year

WM300-5513 (renewal) – **Waiver of School Code** (Section 27-6) request to allow the district to permit students in kindergarten to participate in physical education three days a week for 20 minutes each session and students in grades 1 through 4 to take physical education three or four days a week for 30 minutes each session. This schedule would provide approximately 60 minutes of activity each week to students in kindergarten and 90 to 120 minutes of weekly activity to students in grades 1 through 4. Students also receive 30 minutes of recess daily. Inadequate facilities in the district would limit the length of daily physical education classes to no more than 11 minutes. If approved, this waiver would take effect in the 2012-2013 school year.

Central CUSD 4 – Iroquois (SD 53/HD 105) / Expiration: 2013-14 school year

WM100-5515 (renewal) – **Waiver of School Code** (Section 27-6) request to allow the district to excuse students in grades 9 and 10 from the daily physical education requirement if they participate in year-long (two or more) interscholastic sports. Such students would be allowed to participate in Tech Prep courses and job-shadowing experiences in place of physical education. If approved, this waiver would take effect in the 2012-2013 school year.

Calumet PSD 132 - Cook (SD 15/HD 30) / Expiration: 2013-14 school year

WM100-5516 (renewal) – **Waiver of School Code** (Section 27-6) request to allow the district to permit students in kindergarten through grade 8 to participate in physical education two times a week for 40 minutes each session due to inadequate facilities. The district's intent is to ensure adequate physical activities exist for its students while recognizing that its facilities are cramped and present safety concerns. If approved, this waiver would take effect in the 2012-2013 school year.

Danville CCSD 118 - Vermilion (SD 52/HD 104) / Expiration: 2013-14 school year

WM100-5521 (renewal) – **Waiver of School Code** (Section 27-6) request to allow the district to excuse students in grades 9 and 10 from the daily physical education requirement for ongoing participation in an interscholastic athletic program. Students eligible for the waiver would be able to maintain a full academic load while participating in athletics. If approved, this waiver would take effect in the 2012-2013 school year.

Mount Prospect SD 57 - Cook (SD 33/HD 66) - Expiration: 2013-14 school year

WM100-5522 (renewal) – **Waiver of School Code** (Section 27-6) request to allow the district to permit students in kindergarten to participate in physical education twice a week for 30 minutes each session, and students in grades 1 through 5 to participate in physical education three times a week for 30 minutes each session. The request is being made due to inadequate facilities. Students will also receive structured recess activities supervised by a certificated teacher in the classroom for the remaining two days of the week. If approved, this waiver would take effect in the 2012-2013 school year.

Mercer County SD 404 - Mercer (SD 36/HD 72) / Expiration: 2013-14 school year

WM100-5523 (renewal) – Waiver of School Code (Section 27-6) request to allow the district to excuse students in grades 11 and 12 from the daily physical education requirement for the entire semester in which they participate in an interscholastic athletic activity. Such students would be able to attend additional academic classes or study hall or receive academic support services during the school day. If approved, this waiver would take effect in the 2012-2013 school year.

Zion-Benton THSD 126 - Lake (SD 31/HD 61) / Expiration: 2013-14 school year

WM100-5524 (renewal) – **Waiver of School Code** (Section 27-6) request to allow the district to permit students in grades 9 through 12 attending New Tech High to participate in daily physical education three times a week for 54 minutes each session rather than on a daily basis. New Tech High is a small high school offering an integrated curriculum that is based on projects and features one-on-one computing. Students will be required to document an additional 120 minutes of physical activity per week outside of class. If approved, this waiver would take effect in the 2012-2013 school year.

Freeport SD 145 - Stephenson (SD 45/HD 89) / Expiration: 2013-14 school year

WM100-5525 (renewal) – Waiver of School Code (Section 27-6) request to allow the district to excuse students in grades 9 and 10 from the daily physical education requirement when they are either participating in interscholastic athletics or have enrolled in an additional academic class; and to excuse students in grades 11 and 12 from daily physical education when they are participating in show choir, cheerleading or pom-pons. In addition, students in grades 10 through 12 who enrolled in an additional academic class would be allowed to earn high school credit for physical education taken during the district's summer school physical education session. The waiver would allow these students to enroll in courses in the fine arts, career preparation and/or other areas. If approved, this waiver would take effect in the 2012-2013 school year.

Ball-Chatham CUSD 5 - Sangamon (SD 50/HD 100) / Expiration: 2012-13 school year

WM100-5527 (renewal) – **Waiver of School Code** (Section 27-6) request to allow the district to excuse students in grades 9 through 12 from the daily physical education requirement for ongoing participation in show choir. The district indicates that choreography combined with singing requires students to be in "top cardio-vascular shape", and rigorous daily practice sessions during and after the school day have activity levels that are comparable to those provided in physical education classes. The waiver would allow eligible students to take additional academic classes.

Mundelein CHSD 120 - Lake (SD 26/HD 51) / Expiration: 2012-13 school year

WM100-5530-1 (renewal) – Waiver of School Code (Section 27-6) request to allow the district to excuse students in grades 11 and 12 from the daily physical education requirement for ongoing

participation in cheerleading, pom-pons, or show choir. The district states that students eligible for this waiver have rigorous daily practice sessions and that the waiver, if approved, would allow these students to schedule a study hall or enroll in other academic courses.

Cicero SD 99 – Cook (SD 12/HD 24) / Expiration: 2012-13 school year

WM100-5531 – Waiver of School Code (Section 27-6) request to allow the district to permit students in grades 1 through 6 to participate in physical education once or twice a week for 45 minutes each session rather than daily due to inadequate facilities. In addition, students have 10 minutes of classroom physical education on days when physical education is not taught, and all students have 10 minutes of daily recess. The district is stressing literacy and math education in order to best help its students improve academically.

North Greene UD 3 – Greene (SD 49/HD 97) / Expiration: 2012-13 school year

WM100-5534 (renewal) – **Waiver of School Code** (Section 27-6) request to allow the district to excuse students in grades 9 and 10 from the daily physical education requirement for ongoing participation in an interscholastic athletic program or competitive cheerleading. Students eligible to use the waiver will take additional classes, including dual credit courses and programs designed for high school seniors offered through the local community college.

School Improvement/Inservice Training

Rockford SD 205 – Winnebago (SD 34/HD 67) / Expiration: 2017-18 school year

WM100-5483-2 (renewal) – **Waiver of School Code** (Section 18-8.05(F)(2)(d)(2)) request to allow the district to hold two full-day teacher inservice sessions instead of four half days, and to count the days among the 176 days of pupil attendance required by Section 10-19. The district will accumulate sufficient time beyond the five-clock-hour requirement to apply towards these days. If approved, this waiver would take effect in the 2013-2014 school year.

Roselle SD 12 – DuPage (SD 23/HD 45) / Expiration: 2015-16 school year

WM100-5517 (renewal) – **Waiver of School Code** (Section 18-8.05(F)(2)(d)(2)) request to allow the district to hold four full-day teacher inservice sessions instead of nine half days, and to count the days among the 176 days of actual pupil attendance required by Section 10-19. The district will accumulate sufficient time beyond the five-clock-hour requirement to apply towards these days.

Fieldcrest CUSD 6 - Woodford (SD 53/HD 106) / Expiration: 2015-16 school year

WM100-5529 – Waiver of School Code (Section 18-8.05(F)(2)(d)(2)) request to allow the district to hold two full-day teacher inservice sessions instead of four half days, and to count the days among the 176 days of actual pupil attendance required by Section 10-19. The district will accumulate sufficient time beyond the five-clock-hour requirement to apply towards these days.
