2. Special Session. Motion by Senator Gilbert that the
3. reading of the Journal be dispensed with. All in favor
4. signify by saying aye. Contrary minded. Motion prevails.
5. We . . . Senator Gilbert points out that he's gonna be
6. missed on important motions like that after the . . .
7. during the next Legislative Session. We have House Joint
8. Resolution 3 on the Secretary's Desk by Senator . . . by
9. Representative Randolph. Just a moment, please. Gentlemen,
10. let's have some order. Is there any . . . any motion or
11. disposition? Senator Partee, do you know what is the desire
12. of the Body in connection with this?

13. SENATOR PARTEE:

14. On what is this, Sir?

15. PRESIDENT:

16. We're now in the Special Session. We have the resolution
17. on the Secretary's Desk, House Joint Resolution 3 by
18. Representative Randolph. It creates a joint committee to hold
19. joint hearings and so forth.

20. SENATOR PARTEE:

21. Yes. Senator Clarke, would you like to respond to that
22. in light of our last conversation.

23. PRESIDENT:

24. Senator Clarke.

25. SENATOR CLARKE:

26. I . . . I think for the moment I think we ought to just
27. leave it on the Secretary's Desk.

28. PRESIDENT:

29. Is there any further business to come before this Special
30. Session? The motion by Senator Partee is that the Special
31. Session adjourn until 11 o'clock tomorrow, or what's your . . .

32. SENATOR PARTEE:

33. No, let's . . . let's adjourn it till . . . till 4 o'clock

1. this afternoon and then that . . . by that time we can be in
2. a position to know what date we actually want to adjourn it.to.

3. PRESIDENT:

4. Motion to recess until 4 o'clock this afternoon. All in favor
5. signify by saying aye. Contrary minded. Senate stands in
6. recess. We will be back in Regular Session then at 3:30. Executive
7. Committee will meet . . . Senator Cherry, Executive Committee
8. here . . . 212.

9. SENATOR CHERRY:

10. No. 212.

11. PRESIDENT:

12. Room 212.

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19. PRESIDENT:

20. Special Session. What business . . . I'm getting the
21. wrong signals from someone.

22. SENATOR COURSE:

23. Mr. President, I think we have to adopt the resolu . . .
24. the resolution first.

25. PRESIDENT:

26. Is there a motion to . . . Senator Partee.

27. SENATOR PARTEE:

28. What has to be accomplished is, we have to find ourselves
29. in a posture where. Those bills as introduced by
30. Senator Clarke . . . Senators Clarke and others yesterday,
31. one through seven, will be not in the Assignment of Bills
32. Committee, but will, in fact, be in the Revenue Committee which
33. would then allow them to be studied along with the comparable

1. House bills which will be in that same joint Revenue Committee.
2. So that's what we hope to accomplish. Now I think there is
3. a motion to be made by Senator Donnewald first and then by
4. Senator Course. That's what we are accomplishing.

5. PRESIDENT:

6. All right. Senator Donnewald.

7. SENATOR DONNEWALD:

8. Mr. President and members of the Senate, I do now move that
9. the Committee on Assignment of Bills be discharged and the
10. consideration of Senate Bills 1 through 7 and that they be
11. assigned immediately to the Committee on Revenue.

12. PRESIDENT:

13. These bills have not been read a first time yet.

14. SENATOR CHERRY:

15. They were read yesterday.

16. PRESIDENT:

17. All right. I'm corrected. They have been read a
18. first time. I wasn't here for that Special Session yesterday.
19. All right. Motion by . . . has been made by Senator Donnewald.
20. I think it's understood. Is there any discussion? All in
21. favor signify by saying aye. Contrary minded. Motion
22. prevails. Is there further . . . Senator Course.

23. SENATOR COURSE:

24. Mr. President, I'd like to have unanimous consent to
25. waive the six day posting bill and have these bills heard
26. Monday, December the 4th at noon in the Joint House-Senate
27. Committee. . . on the House Floor.

28. PRESIDENT:

29. Is . . . is there objection? Sena . . . Senator Graham.

30. SENATOR GRAHAM:

31. Senator Course, who comprises this Joint House-Senate
32. Committee? All of the members of either the House or Senate
33. Committees?

1. SENATOR COURSE:
2. Both.
3. SENATOR GRAHAM:
4. Both full committees?
5. SENATOR COURSE:
6. Right.
7. SENATOR GRAHAM:
8. Thank you.
9. PRESIDENT:
10. Now, we have not, unless I'm mistaken, we have not passed House
11. Joint Resolution 3 yet. Is that correct? Should we . . .
12. Senator Partee.
13. SENATOR PARTEE:
14. House Joint Resolution 3 is the one which calls for a
15. reporting date which my recollection is, is set forth as December
16. 11th. Now we would amend that House Joint Resolution to December
17. 14th inasmuch as we will not be in Session on the 11th but
18. will be returning on the 14th. So I move that it be
19. altered to the 14th. Now that, of course, means it has to go
20. back to the House for concurrence.
21. PRESIDENT:
22. Right. Senator Partee moves for the adoption of the
23. resolution. All in favor signify by saying ay . . . for
24. the adoption of the amendment to the resolution. All in
25. favor signify by saying aye. Contrary minded. The amendment
26. is adopted. Is there any discussion on the resolution itself?
27. All in favor of the adoption of the resolution indicate by
28. saying aye. Contrary minded. The resolution is adopted.
29. Now, we have . . . we will now adjourn this Session until
30. December 14th, and I wonder if it isn't acceptable, Senators
31. Partee and Clarke, to . . . we can pull . . . get the resolutions
32. in here a little later even though we don't formally have
33. them at this time. Senator Clarke.

1. SENATOR CLARKE:

2. Can I raise the question as to whether we're going to
3. have a perfunctory tomorrow? There was a companion bill
4. that was not ready to be introduced with the bill that was
5. just read a first time and advanced and it deals with the
6. expense allowance in an increase from 6,000 to 10,000, and I
7. would like to have permission, unless we're going to have a
8. perfunctory tomorrow, I'd like to have permission to have
9. that bill also read a first time and advanced. No, that's in
10. this Regular Session.

11. PRESIDENT:

12. We're now in Special Session.

13. SENATOR CLARKE:

14. Oh, we're in the Special.

15. PRESIDENT:

16. We're . . . we're in the Special Session. Now, I think
17. we are at a point where we're ready for the adjournment
18. resolution which we do not have and if there is no objection . . .
19. if there is no objection on the part of the leadership we
20. will . . . the resolution will come along a little later, but we will
21. adjourn the Special Session until what time, Senator Partee?

22. SENATOR PARTEE:

23. Until noon on the 14th of December.

24. PRESIDENT:

25. This is the Special Session. On . . . until noon on
26. the 14th of December. All in favor . . .

27. SENATOR PARTEE:

28. Well, as long as we're at it, so that . . . Mr. President,
29. we can adjourn, finally, both Sessions till the same identical
30. moment on that date. We certainly can't have both of them at the
31. same time, but one can certainly be later starting than the other
32. one. But so that we don't get confused, we just adjourn both of
33. them till noon on that date. We'll take up one or the other in

1. kind, then the next one would come when we get ready for it.

2. PRESIDENT:

3. All right.

4. SENATOR PARTEE:

5. There's no sense in making two separate hours when you can make
6. one hour.

7. PRESIDENT:

8. We have . . . I understand we have the adjournment resolution
9. now. All right.

10. SECRETARY:

11. (Secretary Wright reads Senate Joint Resolution No. 1.)

12. PRESIDENT:

13. All in favor of the adoption of the resolution indicate
14. by saying aye. Contrary minded. The Special Session stands
15. adjourned.

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
