5. In accord with the agreement reached in the Committee, I'd
6. like to move to Table that amendment and I have a subsequent
7. amendment that covers that area and other areas the committee
8. was concerned about.

19. The purpose of this act is to extend the time period for
20. publication of ordinances by municipalities. It originally was
21. introduced to affect only small municipalities but at the
22. suggestion of the Local Government Committee, we have extended
23. it to all municipalities keeping the act uniform and in a simple
24. form. The Illinois Press Association had reservation about one
25. section of the law and I agreed to delete it. This amendment
26. complies with that agreement and deletes that verbiage.

31. Would the caucus immediately in front of Senator Rock disperse.

1. The Rabbi is saying another prayer for Senator Carroll, I
2. think.

4. He needs it.

6. He needs more help than the rest of us.

14. Thank you Mr. President and Ladies and Gentlemen of the
15. Senate. Amendment No. 1 to Senate Bill 229 was placed on the
16. on the bill in committee at the request of the State Treasurer.
17. This bill would in its entirety allow the State Treasurer to
18. invest in Federal Government Agency obligations. The amendment
19. merely makes it clear that it is the Government of the United
20. States or its Agencies and I would move its adoption.

21. PRESIDENT:

22. Is there further discussion? The question is shall Amend-
23. ment No. 1 to Senate Bill 229 be adopted. Those in favor
24. indicate by saying Aye. Those opposed Nay. The Ayes have
25. it. Are there further amendments? Senator Rock.

28. SENATOR ROCK:

29. Thank you Mr. President and Ladies and Gentlemen of the
30. Senate. I have delivered to the Secretary's Desk and to Senator
31. Walsh, who is the Minority spokesman, two additional amendments
32. which were suggested during the course of the State Treasurer's
33. testimony before the committee. Senator Walsh indicated that

1. we should put in a provision to allow for investment in any
2. other agency created by Act of Congress, rather than amending
3. this bill piecemeal every time a new agency is created. Amendment
4. No. 2 does exactly that, it would allow the State Treasurer to
5. invest in United States Government Bonds or those issued by its
6. agencies or any other agency created by an Act of Congress. I
7. would move its adoption.

9. Is there further discussion? The question is shall
10. Amendment No. 2 to Senate Bill 229 be adopted. Those in favor
11. indicate by saying Aye. Those opposed Nay. The Ayes have it.

20. SENATOR ROCK:

21. Thank you Mr. President and Ladies and Gentlemen of the
22. Senate. Amendment No. 3 again was delivered to my office by
23. the State Treasurer. It would provide that the amendatory act
24. takes effect upon its becoming a law, so that the Treasurer would
25. be authorized to invest in these kinds of investments immediately
26. upon the Governor's signature. I know of no objection. I would
27. move its adoption.

28. PRESIDENT:

29. Is there further discussion? The question is shall Amend-
30. ment No. 3 to Senate Bill 229 be adopted. Those in favor indicate
31. by saying Aye. Those opposed Nay. The Ayes have it. The amend-
32. ment is adopted. Are there further amendments?

20. The question is shall Amendment No. 1 to Senate Bill 300

3. Mr. President and members of the Senate, at this time
4. I would like to have leave to move to discharge the Revenue

7. We have leave for the...to go to the order of motions.
8. SENATOR MARAGOS:
9. Right sir.
10. PRESIDENT:
11. Leave is granted.
12. SENATOR MARAGOS:
13. Thank you. I move at this time, Mr. President and members
14. of the Senate to discharge the Revenue Committee from further
15. consideration of Senate Bills 366 and 368 and reassign them to
16. the Committee on Higher Education.
17. PRESIDENT:
18. Is there leave? Leave is granted. Senate Bills 3rd
19. reading. Senator Knuppel, 99. Senator Regner, Senate Bill 166,
20. Not here? Read the bill.
21. SECRETARY:
22. Senate Bill 166.
23. (Secretary reads title of bill)
24. 3rd reading of the bill.
25. PRESIDENT:
26. Senator Regner.
27. SENATOR REGNER:
28. Yes, Mr. President and members of the Senate. What this
29. does it prohibits the wearing of headset receivers while operating
30. a motor vehicle. This bill was suggested to me by several our...
31. our local police and it is supported by the Department of Trans-
32. portation as a safety means...measure. What the problem has
33. been is they have had several instances where a person was

1. driving with their stereo or tape recorder on having a headset
2. and they obviously couldn't hear the siren of either a police
3. car, fire department or ambulance and the police have requested
4. this as an added offense so that they can stop this bad practice
5. and I would ask for a favorable roll call.

6. PRESIDENT:

7. Is there further discussion? Senator Knuppel. (machine
8. cut-off) Senator Regner.

9. SENATOR REGNER:

10. I didn't hear the question.

11. PRESIDENT:

12. The question...Senator Knuppel, would you repeat the
13. question. Senator Knuppel would you use the microphone immedi-
14. ately to your right. I know you don't need it, but why don't
15. you try.

16. SENATOR KNUPPTEL:

17. Who is it that wants the bill?

18. SENATOR REGNER:

19. The policemen. The idea came from an officer in the
20. City Des Plaines when he had an instance a year ago and pulled
21. someone over with a headset receiver on when they didn't yield
22. a right of way to an ambulance and he requested this as an
23. idea and as I said it is supported by the Department of Trans-
24. portation and several of the local police organizations.

25. PRESIDENT:

26. Senator Knuppel. Just...just a moment, Senator. For
27. the purpose of the record would you go to the desk immediately
28. in front of you.

29. SENATOR KNUPPTEL:

30. Well, I think the next thing they'll be doing if that's
31. the reason, they'll be having us roll our windows down so our
32. air conditioning doesn't work because you can't hear anything
33. when you got the radio going anyway and the car with the

1. windows up and this just seems to me and no reflection Senator,
2. but it seems to me like we're getting into something that's
3. so really detailed and our statute books contain four volumes
4. now and that when we start legislating whether you are going
5. to wear a headset or not, I can understand not having a tele-
6. vision set in the car, in the front seat at least, but I...I
7. just think this is...is is really and I'm serious, like the
8. blue light or the red light. We're getting into things that
9. as a legislature is an imposition on some personal freedoms
10. and it's something that's totally unnecessary and I...I'd
11. like to vote for your bills, but I don't think I'm going to
12. vote for this one.

13. PRESIDENT:

14. Is there further discussion? Senator Rock.

15. SENATOR ROCK:

16. Thank you Mr. President, if the sponsor will yield...if
17. the sponsor will yield, Mr. President.

18. PRESIDENT:

19. He indicates he will yield.

20. SENATOR ROCK:

21. Thank you, Mr. President. Senator what is the sanction?
22. We are saying that no person shall do this but what in fact
23. if they do, what's the sanction.

24. PRESIDENT:

25. Senator Regner.

26. SENATOR REGNER:

27. It would be under the Section 12-100 of Chapter 95½ where
28. they have the same violation that would be that Senator Knuppel
29. mentioned before television sets. They already are prohibit...

30. PRESIDENT:

31. Just...just a moment Senator. Let me interrupt. Would the
32. members please be in their seats. Could we have some quiet. Not
33. a little, but a lot. Now we're not going to proceed until we have

1. some order. We're not going to proceed until we have some
2. order. State your point. Senator Buzbee.

3. SENATOR BUZBEE:

4. I believe the board is wrong, Mr. President. This bill
5. is on 2nd reading. At least according to my Calendar it is.

6. PRESIDENT:

7. Did you look at the date of your Calendar? Senator Regner.

8. SENATOR REGNER:

9. I...Senator Buzbee don't feel too bad, I did the same
10. thing and asked the same dumb question last week on a bill.

11. PRESIDENT:

12. You may proceed, Senator Regner.

13. SENATOR REGNER:

14. Yes, in response to Senator Rock's question, it's under
15. Section 12-100 of Chapter 95½ and it would have the same
16. sanctions as I think Senator Knuppel questioned legislating
17. against having television sets and that already is in the...in
18. the statutes that you are not allowed to have a television set
19. in the driver's area of a vehicle.

20. PRESIDENT:

21. Is there further debate? Senator Rock.

22. SENATOR ROCK:

23. You have now stated that it is the same sanction as that
24. for having a television set in your front seat. What is that
25. sanction, Senator?

26. PRESIDENT:

27. Senator Regner.

28. SENATOR REGNER:

29. Senator Rock, I don't have the specific citation here in
30. front of me, but it does apply to the same area and I'm sorry
31. I can't answer that question.

32. PRESIDENT:

33. Is there further debate? The question is shall Senate
34. Bill 166 pass. Those in favor vote Aye. Those opposed Nay.

1. The voting is open. (machine cut-off) those voted who wish?
2. Have all those voted who wish? Have all those voted who wish?

4. 10, 1 Voting Present. Senate Bill 166 having received a consti-
