33. All those opposed say Nay. The amendment is adopted.

27. Thank you, Mr. President. Committee Amendment  
28. No. 1 would add an effective date and change the  
29. method of appropriations from directly to Cook County  
30. to an appropriation to the Comptroller to pay to  
31. Cook County. I would move adoption of Committee  
32. Amendment No. 1.

33. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR JOHNS)

1. Senator Carroll moves the adoption of  
2. Committee Amendment No. 1. All those...to House Bill  
3. 705. All those in favor say Aye. All those opposed  
4. say Nay. The amendment is adopted. Any further  
5. amendments, Mr. Secretary?

7. No further Committee amendments.

8. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR JOHNS)

9. Any amendments from the Floor? 3rd reading,  
10. Mr....Mr. Secretary. Now, are there any Senators  
11. who wish to call their bills on 2nd reading?  
12. Senator Hickey is not present. We'll go to House  
13. Bills on 3rd reading. The first bill will be for  
14. Senator Rock. House Bill 162. 182. Mr.  
15. Secretary, read the bill, please.

16. SECRETARY:

17. House Bill 182.

18. (Secretary reads title of bill)

19. 3rd reading of the bill.

20. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR JOHNS)

21. Any amendments from the Floor? No wait. I'm  
22. sorry. Recognize Senator Rock, please.

23. SENATOR ROCK:

24. Thank you, Mr. President, ladies and gentlemen of  
25. the Senate. House Bill 182, as I'm sure everyone is  
26. aware, is an act to create the Secretary of State  
27. Merit Employment Code. This was a bill that we discussed  
28. last Session in the closing moments and yesterday,  
29. we added seven amendments at the request of both  
30. the Governor's office and our friends on the other  
31. side of the aisle. I think the Code is in as good a  
32. shape as it can be. The Secretary's office is, of  
33. course, a constitutional office. He has pledged...he

1. did pledge during the campaign that once elected, he  
2. would introduce a merit system of employment for  
3. his office. This is the result of that pledge. It  
4. is a good bill and I ask your affirmative support.

5. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR JOHNS)

6. Thank you, Senator. Senator Davidson is recognized.

7. SENATOR DAVIDSON:

8. Mr. President and members of the Senate,  
9. I'd like to rise in support of this bill for half  
10. the amendments which were on yesterday  
11. which corrected the objections which I and other  
12. members of this side of the aisle had to it in its  
13. previous form. This is an excellent bill which I  
14. think does a great job of giving the employees under  
15. the Secretary of State the best possible protection  
16. under a personnel code, if there is such a thing.  
17. I urge all of us to vote for this bill.

18. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR JOHNS)

19. Any further discussion from the Floor? Roll  
20. call. All those in favor of House Bill 182  
21. vote Aye. All those opposed vote Nay. The  
22. voting is open. Have all voted who wish? I'll  
23. take a break here. Take your time. I'll wait.  
24. These bills are on 3rd reading. And let's be in  
25. our seats. Have all voted who wish? Mr. Secretary,  
26. take the record. House Bill 182, having received  
27. the constitutional majority of... On that question  
28. the Ayes are 49, the Nays are none. House Bill  
29. 182, having received a constitutional majority,  
30. is declared passed. We now will go to House  
31. Bill 237, Senator Davidson. You're recognized,  
32. Sir.

33. SECRETARY:

1. House Bill 237.

2. (Secretary reads title of bill)

3. 3rd reading of the bill.

4. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR JOHNS)

5. Senator Davidson.

6. SENATOR DAVIDSON:

7. Mr. President, members of the Senate. House  
8. Bill 237 does exactly what it says on the face.  
9. This is a State Treasurer's bill so we can have the  
10. authorization for the bond payment money which is  
11. due May 1st. I'd appreciate a Yes vote. Answer  
12. any questions.

13. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR JOHNS)

14. Any discussion from the Floor? Call the roll,  
15. Mr. Secretary. The question is shall House Bill  
16. 237 pass. All those in favor vote Aye. All those  
17. opposed vote Nay. The voting is open. Yes,  
18. Sir, Senator Smith. Senator Newhouse, please.  
19. Vote Aye for me. Have all voted who wish?  
20. Take the record, Mr. Secretary. On that question,  
21. the Ayes are 47, the Nays are none. No Present.  
22. The bill, having received the constitutional  
23. majority is declared passed. Bear with us a moment.  
24. We're checking a machine here. The reason for the  
25. delay is in the equipment. We'll be right back  
26. with you. ...recognizes Senator Grothberg. What's your  
27. purpose, Sir? Okay now? He's not okay. It's not  
28. recording for you? The sound man isn't here right  
29. now, Senator. He'll be right back. He's checking  
30. the equipment. You're still not satisfied.  
31. Come on down to the Chair. Ladies and Gentlemen  
32. of the Senate, there's a malfunction in the  
33. machine. It looks as if we might have to go to the



1. paper type roll call, calling the roll and recording  
2. same. House Bill 237. House Bill 237 now will be  
3. recorded from the board and placed on the paper  
4. record by the Secretary. Okay, now, due to the  
5. malfunction of the machine, we're not going to take  
6. any more bills, House Bills on 3rd reading. We're  
7. merely going to go back to 2nd reading of the House  
8. Bills and then the 1st reading of the House Bills  
9. because we...we cannot afford to waste this time.  
10. Senator Newhouse, you're recognized. You're okay?  
11. All right. All right. House Bills, 2nd reading.  
12. Okay, now, Ken. I'll give you a little time here.  
13. With your permission, we may go back to House  
14. Bills on 3rd reading. No. Okay. 2nd reading.  
15. House Bills 2nd...House Bill 40, Senator Davidson.  
16. Senator Davidson. Now, there's been a little  
17. turmoil here. Here he comes. Okay, Senator.  
18. Read the bill, Mr. Secretary.

21. (Secretary reads title of bill)

22. 2nd reading of the bill. No committee amendments.

23. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR JOHNS)

24. Any amendments from the Floor? 3rd reading.

25. House Bill 269. Demuzio. Senator Demuzio.

26. Read it, Mr. Secretary.

5. And to be State Sanitary District Observer  
6. for a term expiring January 15th, 1979, Louise

20 SENATOR JOYCE:

21 Yes, Mr. President, I would like to...leave  
22 to waive the Six Day Rule so that the following Senate  
23 Bills could be heard next Wednesday, Senate  
24 Bills 789, Senate Bill 894, Senate Bil...

25 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR JOHNS)

26 Senator Hynes.

27 SENATOR HYNES:

28 Mr. President, if I would just interrupt Senator  
29 Joyce for a moment. I was going to have an announcement on  
30 that subject in just a few moments and I think we can handle  
31 all of those motions expeditiously. So,  
32 if you'll just withdraw that for  
33 a moment.

1. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR JOHNS)

2. Senator Joyce would like to have that taken  
3. from the record. Thank you, Senator. Resolutions.

4. SECRETARY:

5. Senate Joint Resolution No. 38, offered  
6. by Senators Rock, Davidson and others.

7. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR JOHNS)

8. Executive. We can go now to the Consent Calendar.  
9. Mr....Senator Hynes.

10. SENATOR HYNES:

11. Mr. President and members of the Senate.  
12. I have an announcement that I think is of some  
13. importance to all the members relating to the  
14. posting requirements. We have been besieged  
15. by a number of requests for waiver of the Six  
16. Day Notice Requirement in order to have bills  
17. heard in committee next week. And we have  
18. determined to set up the following policy  
19. namely, that any motions to waive the Six Day Notice  
20. requirement for committee hearings scheduled  
21. next week will be made on Monday and they will be  
22. approved in the following manner, any Senator  
23. having a bill and wishing to have that bill heard  
24. next week, if the bill has not been posted as  
25. yet, should contact the Chairman of the committee  
26. involved and if the Chairman feels that the work  
27. load of the committee is such that the bill can  
28. be handled next week, and approves the waiver,  
29. then on Monday we will, by one motion, waive the  
30. Six Day Notice for those bills that are so  
31. approved and supplemental notices will be distributed  
32. on Monday for the committees involved. So, if you  
33. have a bill that you wish to have heard next week



1. and want waiver of the Six Day Notice, contact  
2. the Chairman of the committee involved. He will  
3. then approve it and they will all be put together  
4. in one motion so that we can avoid this situation  
5. of multiple motions on every day of the Session.  
6. So, Monday is the day. After Monday, we'll not  
7. be involved in waiving the Six Day Notice  
8. Requirement for the balance of the week.  
9. One other point that I would mention, the schedule  
10. that was distributed yesterday left open, Friday,  
11. the...as to which committees were going to be  
12. scheduled and based upon our evaluation of the  
13. work load, the schedule for Friday, April 29th  
14. will be as follows: 9:00 o'clock, Executive  
15. will meet in 212. And Elementary and Secondary  
16. Education will meet in Room 400. The Session  
17. will convene at noon and run until 1:00 p.m.  
18. At 1:00 p.m., the Committee ...  
19. on Insurance will meet in Room 212. The Committee  
20. on Revenue will meet in Room 400.

21. PRESIDENT:

22. For what purpose does Senator Carroll arise?

23. SENATOR CARROLL:

24. Thank you, Mr. President. While you are waiting  
25. I would move you, Mr. President, that on the  
26. supplemental resolutions Calendar due to a policy  
27. of this Body that the agreed resolutions be  
28. congratulatory or death type resolutions only and  
29. Senator Nimrod and my resolution is clearly not  
30. congratulatory. I would move that it be removed from  
31. the supplemental Calendar and I would thereby ask  
32. at the same time that the rules be suspended  
33. so that the Senate may immediately consider and  
34. adopt Senate Resolution No. 97.

1. PRESIDENT:

2. Senator Carroll, if you would hold that motion  
3. for just a moment, please... Leave to go to the Order  
4. of Resolutions Consent Calendar. Leave is granted.  
5. Are there any objections, Mr. Secretary, to the  
6. resolutions consent...listed on the Consent  
7. Calendar and Supplemental Calendar as distributed.

8. SECRETARY:

9. I have a...I have a Motion in Writing  
10. pursuant to temporary Senate Rule 6-A. "We object  
11. to the following resolutions on the Consent Calendar:  
12. Senate Resolution 91, Senate Resolution 95,  
13. Senate Resolution 97." Dated April 27th, 1977,  
14. signed by Senators Buzbee, Rock and Donnewald.

15. PRESIDENT:

16. Objection having been filed in writing by  
17. three Senators, resolutions 91, 95 and 97 will be  
18. removed from the Resolutions Consent Calendar  
19. and placed on the Order of Resolutions. For  
20. what purpose does Senator Buzbee arise?

21. SENATOR BUZBEE:

22. Thank you, Mr. President. I would just  
23. like to explain the reason for this motion as I  
24. explained to Senator Shapiro and Senator Weaver yesterday.  
25. It's not that I am objecting to the content of  
26. their resolutions. I also added on the resolution  
27. by Senator Carroll. It's...it's my understanding...  
28. my feeling that we ought to keep this...rather  
29. Resolutions Consent Calendar restricted strictly to  
30. congratulatory and death resolutions and let everything  
31. else go up or down on it's...on it's face and so that's  
32. why I file the objections and somebody pointed out  
33. to me that a couple of weeks ago there had been  
34. another resolution on the Consent Calendar by another

1. Senator which was not congratulatory. I happened to  
2. miss that or I would have filed an objection to that  
3. one. So that's my whole reason, just strictly a  
4. matter of precedent, I think.

5. PRESIDENT:

6. Your point is well taken, Senator. With  
7. respect to the...those resolutions on the Consent  
8. Calendar as now amended, all those in favor of the  
9. adoption of those resolutions signify by saying Aye.  
10. Opposed. The Ayes have it. The resolutions are  
11. adopted. Order of Resolutions. Senate Resolution  
12. 91, Senator Weaver.

13. SENATOR WEAVER:

14. Mr. President, I'd like to ask leave to suspend  
15. the rules for immediate consideration of Senate  
16. Resolution 91.

17. PRESIDENT:

18. Senator Weaver moves to suspend the rules for  
19. the purpose of immediate consideration of  
20. Senate Resolution 91. All those in favor signify  
21. by saying Aye. Opposed. The Ayes have it.  
22. The rules are suspended. Senator Weaver on the  
23. resolution.

24. SENATOR WEAVER:

25. This resolution does just as it states here on  
26. the previous Consent Calendar, Mr. President. It would  
27. ask the Secretary of the Department of Agriculture  
28. and the Secretary of the Department of Transportation  
29. to look into the feasibility of possibly putting  
30. state right of ways into what I had in mind, was  
31. hay production, but would not preclude other cash  
32. crops in any feasible manner. That's merely what it  
33. does. Ask these two gentlemen to look into the

1. feasibility.

2. PRESIDENT:

3. Is there any discussion? If not, all those  
4. in favor of the adoption of the resolution signify  
5. by saying Aye. Opposed. The resolution is adopted.  
6. Senate Resolution, 95, Senator Shapiro.

7. SENATOR SHAPIRO:

8. Mr. President, I would like to ask leave of the  
9. Senate for the suspension of the rules for the  
10. immediate consideration and adoption of Senate  
11. Resolution 95.

12. PRESIDENT:

13. Senator Shapiro has moved for the suspension  
14. of the rules for the purpose of the immediate  
15. consideration and adoption of Senate Resolution 95.  
16. All those in favor signify by saying Aye.  
17. Opposed. The Ayes have it. The rules are  
18. suspended. Senator Shapiro, on the resolution.

19. SENATOR SHAPIRO:

20. Mr. President and Ladies and Gentlemen of the  
21. Senate. Senate Resolution 95 asks Congress to hold  
22. hearings throughout the Country on the determination  
23. of the future telecommunications policy of this Country.  
24. At the present time, the FCC is making a lot of  
25. arbitrary decisions on their own, are contemplating getting  
26. into the electronic banking system, setting up other  
27. types of telecommunications methods throughout the  
28. Country by rules and regulation. I think Congress  
29. should look into the matter. Congress has not  
30. addressed itself to this problem since 1960.  
31. I think they are the proper Body to determine our  
32. future policy so that the FCC can act within the  
33. limitations of the law determined by Congress.  
34. I would urge its adoption.

1. PRESIDENT:

2. Is there any discussion? If not, Senator  
3. Shapiro moves the adoption of Senate Resolution 91...  
4. 95. All those in favor signify by saying Aye.  
5. Opposed. The Ayes have it. The resolution is  
6. adopted. Senate Resolution 97, Senator Nimrod.  
7. Senator...Senator Nimrod.

8. SENATOR NIMROD:

9. Yes, Mr. President and fellow Senators.  
10. I move for the suspension of the rules and the  
11. immediate adoption of the Senate...Senate Resolution 97.

12. PRESIDENT:

13. Senator Nimrod moves to suspend the rules  
14. for the purpose of the immediate consideration  
15. and adoption of Senate Resolution 97.  
16. All those in favor signify by saying Aye. Opposed.  
17. The Ayes have it. The...the rules are suspended.  
18. Senator Nimrod now moves for the adoption of the  
19. resolution. Is there any discussion? Senator  
20. Nimrod.

21. SENATOR NIMROD:

22. Yes, Mr. President and fellow Senators. This  
23. resolution was requested...I mean the request  
24. was made by those survivors of the holocaust to live  
25. in Germany in...during part of World War II and  
26. during that time and they have requested that we  
27. present this resolution and ask that this Senate  
28. might join the House which has already passed the  
29. resolution, in asking the Village of Skokie to  
30. deny a permit for a march of the Nazi's in and  
31. among those particular survivors who were there.  
32. And it just seems to me that this whole purpose of  
33. this demonstration and marches is certainly to cause

1. bodily harm and to certainly bring up many of the other  
2. hatreds and things that we all deplore. And I would  
3. certainly ask for your favorable consideration in  
4. this particular resolution. The reason I ask for it  
5. now is that we would have to have it by Monday  
6. in order to have it presented to the local village.

7. PRESIDENT:

8. Is there any discussion? If not, Senator Nimrod  
9. moves the adoption of the resolution. All those  
10. in favor signify by saying Aye. Opposed. The  
11. Ayes have it. The resolution is adopted.

12. SECRETARY:

13. Senate Resolution 99 offered by Senators Rock,  
14. Donnewald and all members.

15. PRESIDENT:

16. Senator Rock.

17. SENATOR ROCK:

18. Thank you, Mr. President, Ladies and Gentlemen  
19. of the Senate. In direct defiance of the President's  
20. rule, I am going to move to suspend that rule and  
21. ask for the immediate consideration and adoption  
22. of this Senate Resolution 99. It's a congratulatory  
23. resolution congratulating Mr. and Mrs. William Hynes  
24. on their fortieth wedding anniversary which is  
25. Sunday. And I would move you, Mr. President, that the  
26. rules be suspended.

27. PRESIDENT:

28. There is a direct conflict of interest involved  
29. here, but Senator Rock has moved to suspend the rules  
30. for the purpose of the immediate consideration of the  
31. resolution. All those in favor signify by saying Aye.  
32. Opposed. The Ayes have it. The rules are suspended.  
33. Senator Rock now moves for the adoption of the resolution.

1. All those in favor signify by saying Aye. Opposed.  
2. The Ayes have it. The resolution is adopted.  
3. Senator Rock.

4. SENATOR ROCK:

5. Yes, for the record, I don't think it's necessary,  
6. but I would ask leave that all members be shown  
7. as cosponsors of the resolution.

8. PRESIDENT:

9. Leave is granted. On the Secretary's Desk,  
10. Senate Joint Resolution 18. Senator Berning.  
11. Senator Berning.

12. SENATOR BERNING:

13. Thank you, Mr. President and members of the  
14. Senate. Senate Joint Resolution 18 memorializes  
15. Congress to review the provisions of the Social  
16. Security Act and offers an alternative or suggests  
17. an alternative to the provisions of the Act which  
18. restricts the amount of income which persons over  
19. sixty-five are allowed to earn. It's an effort to  
20. induce Congress to make provisions for additional  
21. earnings for those persons over sixty-five without  
22. impinging on their social security payments. If  
23. there's any questions, I'll attempt to answer them.  
24. Again, I recognize it is only a resolution, a  
25. request to Congress to review the provisions  
26. of the Social Security Administration.

27. PRESIDENT:

28. Is there any discussion of the resolution?  
29. If not, Senator Berning moves the adoption of  
30. Senate Joint Resolution 18. All those in favor  
31. signify by saying Aye. Opposed. The Ayes have it.  
32. The resolution is adopted. Senate Joint Resolution  
33. 19, Senator Mitchler. Senator Mitchler.

1. SENATOR MITCHLER:

2. Mr. President and members of the Senate, Senate  
3. Joint Resolution 19 which is heard in the Senate  
4. Executive Committee directs the Department of  
5. Transportation, Division of Water Resources,  
6. to prepare the necessary construction plans  
7. for the North Batavia Dam on the Fox River at  
8. Batavia, Illinois. This dam is in need of repair.  
9. They have temporary repairs made to the dam and what  
10. this would ask for the Division of Waterways  
11. to do the engineering so that if the dam should  
12. rupture and go out, that there wouldn't be any  
13. delay in the repair. This has no objection from the  
14. Division of Waterways of the Department of Transportation.  
15. I'd ask for a favorable vote.

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21. End of reel.  
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1. PRESIDENT:

2. All right, you have heard the explanation. Is there  
3. any further discussion? If not, Senator Mitchler moves the  
4. adoption of Senate Joint Resolution 19. All those in favor  
5. signify by saying Aye. Opposed. The Ayes have it. The  
6. resolution is adopted. House Joint Resolution 21, Senator  
7. Philip. Senate Resolution 44, Senator Lemke. Senator Lemke.

8. SENATOR LEMKE:

9. This is Senate Resolution 44 which directs the Senate  
10. Judiciary I to conduct an investigation into the emission  
11. policies of practice of...of law, medical and other professional  
12. schools in the State of Illinois.

13. PRESIDENT:

14. All right, is there any discussion of the resolution?  
15. If...if not, all those in favor signify by...in favor of the  
16. motion to adopt the resolution, signify by saying Aye.  
17. Opposed. The Ayes have it. The resolution is adopted.  
18. Senator Rock, did you have a motion with respect to House  
19. Joint Resolution No. 4?

20. SENATOR ROCK:

21. Well, as...as I understand it, there is no Senate sponsor,  
22. but I...there is no Senate sponsor. Well, it just sits on the  
23. Calendar until a sponsor picks it up, and then it should go  
24. to Executive. I would move that it be referred to the  
25. Committee on Executive.

26. PRESIDENT:

27. Senator Rock moves that House Joint Resolution 4 be  
28. referred to the Committee on Executive. All those in favor  
29. signify by saying Aye. Opposed. The Ayes have it. So ordered.  
30. For what purpose does Senator Carroll arise?

31. SENATOR CARROLL:

32. Thank you, Mr. President. Purpose of announcement since  
33. we're on the Order of Resolutions. The particular event that I

1 want to make note of, I don't personally think was worthy of  
2 a resolution, but on Sunday it happens to be Senator Daley's  
3 birthday and I thought maybe we wanted to make that announcement,  
4 but not give it the status of a resolution.

5 PRESIDENT:

6 Senator Daley.

7 SENATOR DALEY:

8 Mr. President and fellow Senators, the Judiciary I Committee  
9 will be meeting immediately after the Senate adjourns on the  
10 Senate Floor for two bills. Also, Judiciary I will be meeting  
11 in Chicago tomorrow at the State of Illinois Building at 160  
12 N. LaSalle, Room...1818, is it? 1818 at 9:30.

13 PRESIDENT:

14 Are there any other announcements? Senator Bruce.

15 SENATOR BRUCE:

16 I'd like...yes, Mr. President, I'd like the Journal to  
17 reflect that Senator Sangmeister is absent due to illness.

18 PRESIDENT:

19 The Journal will...will reflect Senator Sangmeister's  
20 absence. The Chair would remind all of the members with  
21 respect to the announcement made just awhile ago, any bills not  
22 posted that you wish heard next week, contact the chairman  
23 of the committee involved, and those bills will be handled on  
24 Monday on one motion. Further business to come before the  
25 Senate? If not, Senator Rock moves that the Senate stand  
26 adjourned until Monday, April 25th, at 1:00 p.m. All those  
27 in favor signify by saying Aye. Opposed. The Ayes have it.  
28 The Senate stands adjourned.

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
