22. James, and the twins, Joseph and Ann Thelma. And last
23. but not least, Mary. His parents, Doctor and Mrs. J. P.

25. And a close friend of the family, Patrick Morris. I would
26. now ask Justice Thomas J. Moran to administer the

27. Congratulations.

28. SENATOR LEONARD:

29. Thank you very much.

30. PRESIDENT:

31. I'd like to introduce you to Senator Leonard. Senator

32. Leonard.

33. SENATOR LEONARD:

1. Thank you, Senator. I have been in this Chamber before
2. and I was trying to think today whether it was six or seven
3. years. Tuesday, when I walked in the door, was the last
4. time in between and the previous time I was here. We...I came
5. as a journalist, as a newsman, and we covered the final
6. two weeks of that particular Session of the Illinois
7. General Assembly. We had permission to broadcast from this
8. Chamber. We broadcasted from the House, and we approached
9. it pretty much as a basketball tournament, as to what
10. the strategy was, and we tried to give our listeners
11. an overall view as to what was going on in the House.
12. I did not think at that time that I'd ever be down here
13. at this point. But I...why I mentioned this, I want to
14. share...about the last night that we were here, the
15. House had finished up first. We came over and we had a
16. fellow that was covering the Senate and I sat up there
17. with the other two members of my team. The fellow that
18. was covering the House was sitting up there and this is
19. about the last thing I remembered, being in this Senate
20. Chamber, and as he watched you down here, he said, you
21. know it would be fun to be a Senator. I'd...we were...
22. watching, there was a little rhubarb about whether you
23. had a coat and a tie on. That had developed. And...the
24. last, and he said you know it would be fun to be a
25. Senator. I'd like to do it just so I could show up one
26. day barefoot. The newsman's name was Bill Morris and I
27. don't think he ever came barefoot to your Chamber. But,
28. I do not intend to come barefoot either, but I am very
29. privileged to be here and I will do the best that I can
30. to live up to the responsibilities and the trust that
31. has been put upon me and I'll be looking for your help.
32. Thank you very much.

33. PRESIDENT:

34. Congratulations, Larry, and welcome to the Illinois

1. State Senate. I would also like to introduce and acknowledge
2. the presence of Representative John Matijevich, who is here
3. with us today. For what purpose does Senator Berning arise?

4. SENATOR BERNING:

5. On a point of personal privilege, Mr. President. To
6. personally welcome to the Body a fellow Lake Countian. As
7. I observed his fine family over there, I have a little
8. better understanding of why Larry Leonard has always
9. been such an outstanding gentleman in his conduct of the
10. affairs of the broadcast of news at Radio Station WKRS.
11. I submit to the members of the Body that Larry Leonard
12. is a very articulate, intelligent man of great integrity.
13. You will find his incisiveness a bit disturbing at times
14. and so I warn you, Ladies and gentlemen of the Senate,
15. that his questioning at times may be a bit disconcerting.
16. He has a quick, intelligent mind and I know that he is
17. going to enjoy his experience here in the Illinois Senate.
18. So, I would like to personally welcome him as a member
19. of this Body.

20. PRESIDENT:

23. Yes, just in the form of an announcement. Now, the
24. Appropriations II is still in session downstairs and I'm
25. going back down and...you can...no? I'm not the
26. Chairman.

32. Mr. President - The Governor directs me to
33. lay before the Senate the following message:

7. SECRETARY:

8. A Message from the House by Mr. O'Brien, Clerk.

9. Mr. President - I am directed to inform the
10. Senate that the House of Representatives has passed
11. bills with the following titles in the passage of
12. which I am instructed to ask concurrence of the Senate,
13. to-wit: House Bills 14, 15, 16, 42, 65, 212, 230, 302,
14. 314, 318, 322, 333, 338, 341, 343, 345, 358, 396, 397,
15. 406, 428, 444, 449, 480, 490, 493, 543, 589, 595, 624,
16. 625, 627, 629, 647, 675, 677, 691 and 707.

17. PRESIDENT:

18. We have a request to go to the Order of House
19. Bills 3rd reading for the purpose of passage of a
20. piece of emergency legislation by Senator Rhoads. Is
21. leave granted? Leave is granted. Senator Rhoads.

22. SENATOR RHOADS:

23. Mr. President, on page 26 of the Calendar, House
24. Bill 51 as sponsored by Representative Winchester over
25. in the House. This authorizes the Department of General
26. Services to make purchases and enter into contracts...

27. PRESIDENT:

28. Excuse me, excuse me, Senator Rhoads. May I interrupt
29. you. Mr. Secretary, would you read the bill.

30. SECRETARY:

31. House Bill 51.

32. (Secretary reads title of bill)

33. 3rd reading of the bill.

1. PRESIDENT:

2. Senator Rhoads.

3. SENATOR RHOADS:

4. Mr. President, and members of the Senate. This bill
5. was requested by the Auditor General's office and it is
6. supported by the Comptroller as well. It is designed
7. to enable the Department of General Services to make...
8. enter into contracts for emergency medical supplies and
9. other perishable food commodities. It must be delivered
10. on July 1 and those contracts must be entered into in
11. the next few weeks after the Governor signs this bill, and
12. therefore, the emergency nature, and I would appreciate
13. favorable consideration.

14. PRESIDENT:

15. Is there any discussion? Senator Grotberg. Is
16. there any discussion? If not, the question is, shall
17. House Bill 51 pass. Those in favor will vote Aye.
18. Those opposed will vote Nay. The voting is open. Have
19. all voted who wish? Have all voted who wish? Take the
20. record. On that question, the Ayes are 54, the Nays
21. are none, none Voting Present. House Bill 51 having
22. received a constitutional majority is declared passed.
23. For what purpose does Senator Maragos arise?

24. SENATOR MARAGOS:

25. Parliamentary inquiry, Whether this is the first
26. successful bill that...Senator Rhoads had passed.

27. PRESIDENT:

28. Senator Rhoads.

29. SENATOR RHOADS:

30. It's the first one on its way to the Governor. I
31. did have a Senate Bill that passed, Senator Maragos.

32. PRESIDENT:

33. Well, perhaps we ought to congratulate Senator

1. Rhoads and Senator Leonard who also cast his first vote.

2. PRESIDENT:

3. The record, the official record will reflect that
4. the vote was cast by Senator Leonard even though the
5. board has not been changed as yet. It indicates Senator
6. Morris.

7. PRESIDENT:

8. (Machine cut-off) purpose does Senator Rhoads
9. arise?

10. SENATOR RHOADS:

11. I'm happy to have that bill be the first one
12. that Senator Leonard could cast a vote on. I also
13. appreciate the calling of this bill today. Not only
14. because it's an emergency, but this is my first
15. opportunity to fracture the rules because I have a
16. group visiting from my district in the gallery who
17. are entertaining the people in the rotunda today
18. with the music of America. They are from the Conrady
19. Junior High School in Hickory Hills, Illinois, and
20. they're here today with their music director, Geno
21. Pasetti. And I'd like them to stand and be recog-
22. nized by the Senate.

23. PRESIDENT:

24. For what purpose does Senator Grotberg arise?
25. Senator Grotberg.

26. SENATOR GROTBURG:

27. Thank you, Mr. President. I rise on a point of
28. personal privilege.

29. PRESIDENT:

30. State your point, Senator.

31. SENATOR GROTBURG:

32. My point is, Mr. President and members of this
33. august Body, I believe we have for the first time in the

1. President's Gallery on my right, the Executive Director of
2. the Chicago Community Fund, Mr. Solon Cousins, Mr. Preston
3. Kavanaugh, the Purchasing Director of Commonwealth Edison
4. Company and a member of that Board and one of the largest
5. private agency directors in the City of Chicago, Mr. Ken
6. Honderich. And I am pleased that they are here to spend
7. the day with us and some of you will be hearing from them
8. later. May we stand up gentlemen and be introduced to the
9. Senate of the State of Illinois.

10. PRESIDENT:

11. For what purpose does Senator Nimrod arise?

12. SENATOR NIMROD:

13. Mr. President, I might ask that the record show that
14. on that Senate Bill 51, I did push the button. My key was
15. turned to a locked position and I didn't realize till
16. later and the second item that I would like to address
17. myself is ask leave to have Senator Collins be shown as
18. ...Senate Bill 1143, that the bill we shown, Nimrod dash
19. Collins.

20. PRESIDENT:

21. The record will reflect your first request, Senator
22. and is leave granted to...? Leave is granted. Senate
23. Bill 1143 will...Senate Bill 1143 will show Nimrod dash
24. Collins as principal sponsors.

25. SENATOR NIMROD:

26. Thank you.

27. PRESIDENT:

28. For what purpose does Senator Davidson arise?

29. SENATOR DAVIDSON:

30. Ask leave to take over the chief sponsorship of
31. a bill. I've talked to Senator Graham. I need leave
32. of the Body to be chief sponsor of Senate Bill 551
33. which was killed in committee this morning, but I got

1. to be responsible for it.
2. PRESIDENT:
3. Senator Davidson has requested leave to be shown
4. as principal sponsor of Senate Bill 551. Is leave granted?
5. Leave is granted. So ordered. Resolutions.
6. SECRETARY:
7. Senate Resolution 118 offered by Senator Grotberg.
8. It's congratulatory.
9. PRESIDENT:
10. This is a congratulatory resolution.. Is leave
11. granted to add it to the Consent Calendar? Leave is
12. granted. For what purpose does Senator Donnewald arise?
13. SENATOR DONNEWALD:
14. Yes, Mr. President, I would ask that the Senate
15. Bill 1263 which now reposes in Public Health and Welfare,
16. be re-referred to Committee on Insurance and that the
17. Six Day Notice be waived. Do I have leave?
18. PRESIDENT:
19. Senator Donnewald has moved to discharge the
20. Committee on Public Health from further consideration
21. of Senate Bill 1263. All those in favor signify by
22. saying Aye. Opposed. The Ayes have it.
23. SENATOR DONNEWALD:
24. As to Senate Bill 9...
25. PRESIDENT:
26. Senator Donnewald asks that the bill be re-referred
27. to the Senate Committee on Insurance and asks that the
28. Six Day Notice requirement be waived so that the bill
29. can be heard tomorrow in Insurance. All those in favor
30. of the motion of Senator Donnewald signify by saying
31. Aye. Opposed. The Ayes have it. The motion carries.
32. Senator Donnewald.
33. SENATOR DONNEWALD:

1. Yes, Mr. President, as to Senate Bill 975, I would
2. ask leave to have that re-referred from the Committee
3. on Executive to Judiciary I and waive the Six Day
4. Notice.

5. PRESIDENT:

6. Senator Donnewald moves to discharge the Committee
7. on Executive from further consideration of Senate Bill
8. 19...970, Senate Bill 975 and that the bill be re-
9. referred to Judiciary I. All those in favor signify
10. by saying Aye. Opposed. The Ayes have it. Senator
11. Donnewald moves to suspend the rules for purpose of
12. waiving the Six Day Notice requirement so that Senate
13. Bill 975 can be heard in Judiciary I today. All those
14. in favor signify by saying Aye. Opposed. The Ayes
15. have it. So ordered. For what purpose does Senator
16. Harber Hall arise?

17. SENATOR HARBER HALL:

18. Mr. President, I'd like leave of the Body to add
19. some names to Senate Bill 1155. They are Senator Glass,
20. Senator McMillan, Senator Moore, Senator Ozinga, Senator
21. Sommer, Senator Soper and Senator Walsh.

22. PRESIDENT:

23. Is leave granted to add the named Senators as co-
24. sponsors of Senate Bill 1155? Leave is granted. Would
25. you please supply the Secretary with the list of names.
26. For what purpose does Senator D'Arco arise?

27. SENATOR D'ARCO:

28. Mr. President, I would move to Table Senate Bill
29. 976, which is presently in Judiciary II Committee.

30. PRESIDENT:

31. Senator D'Arco moves to discharge Senate Committee
32. of Judiciary II from further consideration of Senate
33. Bill 976. All those in favor signify by saying Aye.

1. Opposed. The Ayes have it. The committee is discharged.
2. Senator D'Arco now moves to Table Senate Bill 976. All
3. those in favor signify by saying Aye. Opposed. The Ayes
4. have it. The bill is Tabled. For what purpose does
5. Senator Bruce arise?

6. SENATOR BRUCE:

7. Thank you, Mr. President and members of the Senate.
8. House Bill 717 came to the Senate yesterday and was
9. referred to the Appropriations I Committee. I would
10. like to move to discharge that committee from further
11. consideration of House Bill 717, have it placed on
12. the Order of 2nd reading. I have spoken to the sponsor,
13. or to the chairman of the committee and to the minority
14. spokesman. It relates to the Appellate Court House
15. in Mt. Vernon. The roof has caved in and the Appellate
16. Court is presently holding hearings in the conference
17. room. And it is of an emergency nature.

18. PRESIDENT:

19. Senator Bruce moves to discharge Senate Committee
20. on Appropriations I from further consideration of
21. House Bill...717. All those in favor signify by saying
22. Aye. Opposed. The Ayes have it. The committee is
23. discharged. The bill is on the Order of 2nd reading.
24. (Machine cut-off) does Senator Glass arise?

25. SENATOR GLASS:

26. Mr. President, to request that I be shown as chief
27. sponsor of House Bill 609, replacing Senator, excuse me,
28. Senate Bill, House Bill 509. In place of Senator Knuppel.
29. It is my understanding that he is in agreement with this
30. substitution.

31. PRESIDENT:

32. Senator Glass has asked to be shown as principal
33. sponsor of House Bill 509 in place of Senator Knuppel.

1. Is leave granted? Leave is granted. So ordered. For
2. what purpose does Senator Buzbee arise?

3. SENATOR BUZBEE:

4. Thank you, Mr. President. Mr. President, this
5. morning in the Appropriations II Committee, I neglected
6. to name the members of the Higher Education Subcommittee,
7. that will be meeting all day on Tuesday and those members
8. are myself, Senator Hickey, Senator Rock, Senator Weaver
9. and Senator McMillan. We will be meeting all day on
10. Tuesday and I think you already have the schedule. Thank
11. you.

12. PRESIDENT:

13. For what purpose does Senator Mitchler arise?

14. SENATOR MITCHLER:

15. Mr. President, I would like to move that Senate Bill
16. 681 be taken from the Table and referred to the committee
17. on Agriculture, Conservation and Energy. I cleared this
18. with Senator Knuppel, the chairman of the committee, and
19. I would also like to then move that the Six Day Notice
20. be waived for the...

21. PRESIDENT:

22. Senator, have you discussed this with...

23. SENATOR MITCHLER:

24. ...bill to be heard in committee this evening.

25. PRESIDENT:

26. ...have you discussed this with the chairman of
27. the Committee on Assignment of Bills? And if you have
28. not, I wish you would withhold the motion until you do
29. it.

30. SENATOR MITCHLER:

31. All right. Okay.

32. PRESIDENT:

33. (Machine cut-off) purpose does Senator Kosinski arise?

1. SENATOR KOSINSKI:

2. Personal privilege, Mr. President and members of the
3. Senate. It's a great honor for me to introduce a class
4. out of Senator Bowers' district and I'm going to yield to
5. him in a second. I have a real precious individual there,
6. my granddaughter, Terry Vlasak , and I'd like to now yield
7. to Senator Bowers on the introduction of the school.

8. PRESIDENT:

9. Senator Bowers will complete the double violation.
10. Senator Bowers.

11. SENATOR BOWERS:

12. Thank you, Mr. President. It certainly is a
13. pleasure for me to introduce the students from the
14. Hinsdale Junior High School, which of course, is located
15. in beautiful DuPage County. And while I'm at it, I
16. would also like to introduce the teachers that are
17. down here with the students, Mrs. Micki Jasker and
18. Mrs. Marilyn Kennedy and I would ask that they stand
19. and be recognized by the Senate. Thank you, Mr. President.

20. PRESIDENT:

21. For what purpose does Senator Johns arise?

22. SENATOR JOHNS:

23. Mr. President, I talked to the Chairman of the
24. Local Government Affairs Committee and the Minority
25. Spokesman. Both have agreed for me to ask leave to
26. bring Senate Bill 648 bypassing committee to the Floor
27. for 2nd reading. I ask leave of the Body. Senate
28. Bill 648. I talked to both leadership and chairman-
29. ship.

30. PRESIDENT:

31. You have heard the motion by Senator Johns to
32. discharge Senate Committee on Local Government from
33. further consideration of Senate Bill 648. Is there

1. any discussion? All those in favor of the motion signify
2. by saying Aye. Opposed. The Ayes have it. The committee

6. SENATOR MITCHLER:

7. Mr. President, I have now spoken to Senator Donnewald
8. and also it has been cleared with Senator Knuppel on the...
9. Chairman of the Agriculture, Conservation and Energy Com-
10. mittee. I move that Senate Bill 681 be taken from the
11. Table and referred to the Committee on Agriculture, Con-
12. servation and Energy and that the Six Day Rule be waived
13. so that the bill can be heard in committee this evening.

14. PRESIDENT:

15. Senator Donnewald.

16. SENATOR DONNEWALD:

17. Yes, yes, Mr. President. I've discussed this
18. with the Chairman on the Committee on Agriculture and
19. I understand that the Senator is submitting an...or an
