21. Health, Welfare and Corrections offers three amendments.
22. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)
23. Senator Regner to explain the amendment.
24. SENATOR REGNER:
25. Yes, Mr. President and members of the Senate.
26. This is a bill providing for Department of Mental
27. Health funding of local mental health centers, if their
28. population rises due to their program of putting
29. patients out in the field and the first amendment
30. changes the one percent increase to three percent.
31. And it puts an effective date of 1977 in and I move
32. for its adoption.
33. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

26. On a point of personal privilege, Mr. President.  
27. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)  
28. State your point.  
29. SENATOR MOORE:  
30. Thank you, Mr. President. I know that many  
31. members of the Senate knew the gentleman that is  
32. standing behind me. He started off as an intern  
33. in the General Assembly. After that tour, he was a

1. member of Senator Arrington's staff. He later became  
2. the Legislative Liaison with the Department of Mental  
3. Health, then left the State of Illinois, went to the  
4. State of West Virginia as the Director of Hospitals  
5. for the State of West Virginia and is now back in  
6. Illinois as the Assistant to the Director of the  
7. Illinois Department of Public Aid. It's my privilege  
8. to introduce or reintroduce Mr. Dick Buckley. Let's  
9. give him a hand.

11. Thank you, Mr. Buckley. Senator Glass on Senate  
12. Bill 161. The bill has been read and there are four  
13. committee amendments. Taken out of the record.

24. corrects the designation of the State Superintendent  
25. of Education and deletes the reference to the Superintendent  
26. of Public Instruction. I would move the adoption  
27. of Committee Amendment No. 1.

28. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

29. Is there discussion? All in favor say Aye.  
30. Opposed Nay. The Ayes have it. The amendment is adopted.  
31. Amendment No. 2, Senator Glass.

33. Amendment No. 2 makes it clear that the continuation  
34. of the Special Education Tax Rate is not to be included in the

1. Operating Tax Rate. I would move the adoption of

5. say Aye. Opposed Nay. The Ayes have it. The amendment

9. that all bonds that are issued for construction of  
10. Special Ed facilities must be amortized over  
11. eight years. I move the adoption of Amendment No. 3.

14. in favor say Aye. Opposed Nay. The Ayes have it.

19. if there is to be State reimbursement for Special  
20. Education building purposes or all of the tax  
21. used...all the tax rate, must in fact, be used for

3. Take it out of the record. Senate Bill 245,
4. Senator Maragos. Senate Bill 281, Senator Donnewald.
5. Read the bill, Mr. Secretary.

7. Senate Bill 281.
8. (Secretary reads title of bill)
9. 2nd reading of the bill. The Committee on Agriculture,
10. Conservation and Energy offers one amendment.
11. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)
12. Senator Donnewald to explain the amendment.
13. SENATOR DONNEWALD:
14. Yes, Mr. President, members of the Senate.
15. There are some technical changes. It changes the word
16. guidelines to regulations and achieve to attain. The
17. principal part of the amendment is...excludes from the
18. requirement that the Pollution Control Board adopts
19. new sulfur dioxide emissions by January 31, '78 in
20. the...and in the Chicago, St. Louis, and Peoria area
21. by June 30 of '78. I would move its adoption.

28. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)
29. Any amendments from the Floor? 3rd reading. For
30. what purpose does Senator Shapiro arise?
31. SENATOR SHAPIRO:
32. Well, Mr. President, it's my understanding that there
33. are subcommittees of the Appropriations Committee meeting

1. while we are in Floor Session. Now, if we're going  
2. to honor these subcommittees as being legitimate  
3. extensions of our standing committees, it appears to me  
4. that they should not be meeting while we're in Session  
5. on the Floor. I thought we had the point cleared up  
6. the other day. Senator Hynes agreed with me and I  
7. would appreciate it if these subcommittees could be  
8. informed that we are in Floor Session.

9. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

10. Senator Shapiro, where are...where is the subcommittee  
11. meeting?

12. SENATOR SHAPIRO:

13. In C-3. They're subcommittees of the Appropriations  
14. Committee.

15. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

16. We will send a Sergeant-at-Arms to inform them  
17. that we are in Floor Session. For what purpose does  
18. Senator Rock arise?

19. SENATOR ROCK:

20. Well, just on...on a point of inquiry, Mr. President.

21. I can understand the Senator's concern and our own  
22. concern with respect to full committee meetings. But,  
23. I think when we start talking about subcommittees,  
24. or later, in fact, when we get into the realm of  
25. Conference Committees, it's going to be awfully  
26. difficult to operate around here if we can't have  
27. subcommittees and Conference Committee meetings  
28. when, in fact, the opportunity arises.

29. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

30. Senator Shapiro.

31. SENATOR SHAPIRO:

32. If we're going to recognize the legitimacy of a  
33. subcommittee, they should be treated the same as  
34. a committee. We recognize Conference Committees in our

1. rules. And it appears to me that when we are in  
2. Floor Session, subcommittees should not be meeting.  
3. The point was made the other day and the President  
4. concurred.  
5. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)  
6. Senator Carroll, for what purpose do you arise?  
7. SENATOR CARROLL:  
8. I just wanted Senator...to ask Senator Shapiro.  
9. I know of no subcommittee of my Appropriations Committee  
10. meeting. In fact, our committee adjourned at 3:00 o'clock  
11. so we could be in Session.  
12. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)  
13. Senate Bill 287, Senator Berning. Read the bill,  
14. Mr. Secretary.

16. Senate Bill 287.  
17. (Secretary reads title of bill)  
18. 2nd reading of the bill. The Committee on Pensions,  
19. Personnel and Veterans Affairs offers one amendment.

23. Thank you, Mr. President, members of the Senate.  
24. Amendment No. 1 to...  
25. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)  
26. Can we have some order, gentlemen? Senator Berning.  
27. Senator Berning.  
28. SENATOR BERNING:  
29. Amendment No. 1 to Senate Bill 287 for all intents  
30. and purposes, is a brand new bill. The entire bill  
31. after the enacting clause has been stricken so that  
32. we have before us not the bill as originally intended,  
33. but a bill to accommodate a small change in the Department

1. of Personnel Code to provide additional prerogatives  
2. for the Civil Service Commission. It is a  
3. change which has been sought by the administration  
4. and the Department of Personnel. I would move for the  
5. adoption, Mr. President and ask that the bill be moved  
6. onto 3rd reading where I will hold it in the event  
7. that there are any additional questions about the  
8. amendment.

9. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

10. Is there discussion? On the motion to adopt,  
11. Committee Amendment No. 1, all in favor say Aye.  
12. Opposed Nay. The Ayes have it. Amendment is adopted.

28. Secondary Education offers one amendment.

29. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

30. Senator Glass to explain the amendment.

31. SENATOR GLASS:

32. Amendment changes the title of the program to  
33. Family Life Education and I would move its adoption.



1. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)
2. Is there discussion? On the motion to adopt,
3. all in favor say Aye. Opposed Nay. The Ayes have it.
4. The amendment is adopted. Senate Bill...are there
5. further amendments?
6. SECRETARY:
7. No further committee amendments.
8. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)
9. Any amendments from the Floor? 3rd reading.
10. Senate Bill 304, Senator Graham. Read the bill,
11. Mr. Secretary.
12. SECRETARY:
13. Senate Bill 304.
14. (Secretary reads title of bill)
15. 2nd reading of the bill. No committee amendments.
16. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)
17. Senator Graham.
18. SENATOR GRAHAM:
19. Mr. President, I had a discussion with Senator
20. Rock some time ago and of course, this bill will be
21. subject to be called back for amendment and I have no
22. opposition to that. And we'll see what happens. We are
23. in negotiation on those bills.
24. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)
25. Are there any amendments from the Floor? 3rd reading.
26. Senate Bill 312, Senator Joyce. Senate Bill
27. 313, Senator Merlo. Senator Merlo. Senate Bill 312,
28. Hospital Governing Commission.
29. SECRETARY:
30. Senate Bill 313.
31. (Secretary reads title of bill)
32. 2nd reading of the bill. The Committee on Local Government
33. offers one amendment.

1. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

2. Senator Merlo, I have it marked here that there's  
3. also to be a Floor amendment offered by Senator Daley.  
4. I see that he's not on the Floor. Do you wish to proceed  
5. and come back to that or do you wish to take it out  
6. of the record? Senator Merlo.

7. SENATOR MERLO:

8. Mr. President, we can wait until Senator Daley  
9. returns.

10. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

11. All right. Senate Bill 339, Senator Berning.  
12. Senate Bill 350, Senator Berning. Read the bill,  
13. Mr. Secretary.

14. SECRETARY:

15. Senate Bill 350.

16. (Secretary reads title of bill)

17. 2nd reading of the bill. The Committee on Public  
18. Health, Welfare and Corrections offers one amendment.

19. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

20. Senator Berning to explain the amendment.

21. SENATOR BERNING:

22. Thank you, Mr. President. The amendment is the  
23. result of the negotiations between all of us who have  
24. been working on this particular bill to upgrade the  
25. requirements for physicians'assistants. Senator  
26. Smith and I and others are completely satisfied that  
27. we have the bugs worked out. Senator Collins was the  
28. chairman of the subcommittee before whom the witnesses  
29. appeared. Mr. President, before I move to adopt  
30. the committee amendment, I must explain that in spite  
31. of all of our best efforts and the efforts of the  
32. Legislative Reference Bureau, there are three small  
33. technical errors. So, I would like to move to adopt  
34. the committee amendment and then I immediately would like

1. to be recognized to Table that and adopt Amendment which
2. would be No. 3 which corrects those three small errors.
3. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)
4. Yes, Senator Berning, the appropriate procedure
5. might be just to move to Table Committee Amendment No. 1
6. given your explanation that there are technical
7. errors within it. Senator Berning.
8. SENATOR BERNING:
9. I was told that that was not the procedure. If
10. that is possible, I move to Table Committee Amendment
11. No. 2, then.
12. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)
13. Heard the motion to Table. All in favor
14. say Aye. All opposed Nay. The Ayes have it. Amendment
15. No. 1 is Tabled. Amendment No. 2, Senator Berning.
16. SENATOR BERNING:
17. Amendment No. 2, then Mr. President, is entirely
18. the Amendment No. 1 which we just Tabled with the
19. addition of three small corrections which were overlooked
20. in the original amendment. I therefore, move for the
21. adoption of Amendment No. 2.
22. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)
23. Heard the motion to adopt. Is there discussion?
24. All in favor say Aye. All opposed Nay. The Ayes have it.
25. Amendment is adopted. Are there further amendments?
26. SECRETARY:
27. No further amendments.
28. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)
29. Amendments from the Floor? 3rd reading.
30. Senate Bill 351, Harber Hall. Senator Harber Hall.
31. Read the bill, Mr. Secretary.
32. SECRETARY:
33. Senate Bill 351.

1. (Secretary reads title of bill)

2. 2nd reading of the bill. The Committee on Appropriations

3. I offers two amendments.

4. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

5. Senator Carroll.

6. SENATOR CARROLL:

7. Thank you, Mr. President. Committee Amendment No.

8. 1 deletes half of the amount that was appropriated

9. for Hazardous Materials Program inasmuch as the department

10. had misused that appropriation last year. I would

11. move the adoption of...

12. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

13. Senator Carroll.

14. SENATOR CARROLL:

15. ...I'm sorry. I'm on the wrong one. Arts Council.

16. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

17. I think so.

18. SENATOR CARROLL:

19. Excuse me.

20. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

21. Arts Council has dealt with some hazardous materials...

22. SENATOR CARROLL:

23. Yes, it has, and we have amended that all...

24. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

25. And I don't think this Session...Senate Bill 351.

26. Senator Carroll.

27. SENATOR CARROLL:

28. Senator Regner offered to explain. Amendment No.

29. 1 reduces the pay plan from six percent to two and a half

30. percent. Increases the grant appropriation seventy-five

31. thousand for ethnic art, increases the bottom line for

32. seventy-five thousand in addition thereto, to create a hundred

33. and seventy-five thousand in the Ethnic Art Program. I

1. would move adoption of Amendment No. 1 to Senate Bill 351.

2. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

3. Senator Carroll moves the adoption of

4. Committee Amendment No. 1. Is there discussion?

5. Senator Sommer.

6. SENATOR SOMMER:

7. This amendment adds seventy-five thousand dollars

8. of General Revenue money...

9. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

10. Can we have some order, please, gentlemen?

11. Senator Sommer.

12. SENATOR SOMMER:

13. This amendment adds seventy-five thousand dollars

14. of General Revenue money over and above the Governor's

15. request and the purpose of this is for ethnic art.

16. I'd like to have a roll call on this amendment, Mr.

17. Chairman.

18. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

19. Is there further discussion of the amendment?

20. There has been a request for a roll call on the

21. adoption of Committee Amendment No. 1. Those in favor

22. will vote Aye. Senator Demuzio.

23. SENATOR DEMUZIO:

24. Well, Senator Sommer, if you would yield, I would

25. like to know what the amendment does before I'm in

26. a posture to...to vote.

27. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

28. It is not Senator Sommer's amendment. It's

29. Senator Carroll, but he indicates he will yield to

30. your question. Senator Carroll.

31. SENATOR CARROLL:

32. Thank you, Mr. President. This was Committee

33. Amendment No. 1 and amongst the things it does, one is

1. to reduce the pay plan from a six percent increase  
2. to a two and a half percent increase. The other  
3. was to earmark an additional seventy-five thousand  
4. dollars for the Ethnic Art Program. This would make  
5. it one hundred and seventy-five thousand total out  
6. of approximately a million one hundred thousand,  
7. that would be earmarked for Ethnic Art. After  
8. substantial lobbying by the Arts Council, various  
9. members of the Appropriations Committee, both  
10. upstate and downstate, each being told that that  
11. seventy-five additional earmarking was coming from  
12. their district, all fifty-nine districts, apparently  
13. each losing seventy-five thousand dollars, it was  
14. decided to appropriate an additional seventy-  
15. five thousand total to the total appropriation  
16. of the Ethnic Arts Program and the total appropriation  
17. of the Arts Council. So, we did increase by seventy-  
18. five thousand dollars by this amendment, the  
19. appropriation of General Revenue Funds to the Arts  
20. Council and those are earmarked for the Ethnic Act  
21. Program. I might add that in a future amendment  
22. we saved some of that money back by eliminating some  
23. of the employees of the Council.

24. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

25. Further discussion? Senator Donnewald.

26. SENATOR DONNEWALD:

27. Yes, question of the sponsor.

28. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

29. Indicates that he will yield. Senator Donnewald.

30. SENATOR DONNEWALD:

31. I...Senator, the seventy-five...we're sure that  
32. when we add the additional seventy-five thousand that the  
33. Governor will sign it?

1. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)  
2. Senator Carroll.  
3. SENATOR CARROLL:  
4. ... I have never been one to presume the reactions  
5. of any of the Governors of the State of Illinois.  
6. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)  
7. Senator Donnewald.  
8. SENATOR DONNEWALD:  
9. Question No. 2, have we really determined what  
10. ethnic groups really consist of? What is an ethnic  
11. group?  
12. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)  
13. Senator Carroll.  
14. SENATOR CARROLL:  
15. Depends on whose definition you use. I could  
16. yield to Senator Lemke on that question, but  
17. if you refer to Webster's, the first definition says,  
18. non-Christian and non-Jewish. I don't use that  
19. definition. Some people might. But, apparently  
20. is also any identifiable minority group according to  
21. Webster's in their second definition. The first  
22. one, I've already quoted. And they have  
23. specific people out in the field who seek ethnic  
24. cultural groups of all ethnicities...how's that?  
25. How's that? And that's how they make the allocations  
26. amongst the monies.  
27. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)  
28. Senator Donnewald.  
29. SENATOR DONNEWALD:  
30. All right. Now, I think that probably we're all  
31. of some ethnic group or other, are we not? But, going  
32. on with assuming that you say yes, then...then it would  
33. leave, as I understand it... lead to the discretion  
34. of the Arts Council to disseminate the monies that we're

1. adding, the hundred and seventy-five thousand dollars  
2. to whatever ethnic groups that they may so choose.

3. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

4. Senator Carroll.

5. SENATOR CARROLL:

6. Senator Donnewald, I happen to agree with you.

7. I think what we are doing is adding seventy-five  
8. thousand to the concept of the Arts Council asking  
9. them to use it for ethnic type programs. I happen  
10. to think that many of the programs they are now  
11. using it for, could fall within that category. It  
12. is my understanding that last year, out of the  
13. hundred thousand we had earmarked for that purpose,  
14. something like ninety-five to ninety-eight  
15. percent of that monies were in fact, spent on items  
16. that were deemed to be ethnic art and the Auditor  
17. General apparently had also found no problem with  
18. those allocations. I would assume, therefore, that  
19. there are substantial additional cultural programs  
20. by various ethnic groups that would fall within this  
21. category and give them access to this monies.

22. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

23. Further discussion? Senator Lemke.

24. SENATOR LEMKE:

25. Just to note that last year they spent a little  
26. under a hundred thousand dollars and they picked up  
27. in matching funds eighty-five thousand...eighty  
28. five thousand dollars, so what we're doing here is  
29. to help to get more money for this program which is  
30. furthered and being studied in the State of Illinois.

31. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

32. Senator Regner.

33. SENATOR REGNER:



1. Yes, Mr. President, members of the Senate. I have  
2. no argument at all with mandating the Art Council to  
3. spend certain amounts of money on ethnic art. However,  
4. there's more than ample monies of wasted spending  
5. in this budget that this could be taken or transferred  
6. from and we certainly don't have to appropriate  
7. another seventy-five thousand dollars over and above  
8. the budget of General Revenue monies when the treasury  
9. is strapped as it is and I would urge the defeat  
10. of this amendment and if somebody believes that we should  
11. have a line item for ethnic art, well and good.  
12. But, take it away from somewhere else, and this very  
13. wasteful piece of legislation.

14. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

15. Further discussion? Senator Soper.

16. SENATOR SOPER:

17. Thank you, Mr. President. Now, the description  
18. that Senator Carroll gave to ethnic art covers all  
19. art according to Senator Donnewald. Now, I want  
20. to ask Senator Lemke a question. When I...when  
21. he put this amendment, I think it was his amendment,  
22. what...didn't you have something about the Poles  
23. and the Bohemians and so forth, calling them  
24. an ethnic group? You know, you talk about minorities,  
25. the Bohemians don't have enough people to be a  
26. minority as yet. I'd like to know if we're in this  
27. thing or do we get tossed in with...with all the  
28. larger ethnic groups? We wouldn't get two dollars  
29. and seventy-five cents worth.

30. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

31. Senator Carroll.

32. SENATOR SOPER:

33. Lemke, please.

1. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)
2. The sponsor of the amendment is Senator Carroll.
3. SENATOR SOPER:
4. He is?
5. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)
6. Yes.
7. SENATOR SOPER:
8. Well, Lemke is his cosponsor, I think.
9. He's his aid.
10. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)
11. The question is are Bohemians covered by your
12. Ethnic Arts Amendment? Senator Carroll.
13. SENATOR CARROLL:
14. Thank you, Mr. President. I am sponsor because it
15. is a committee amendment. I definitely had great
16. input from Senator Lemke. As to the content of this
17. amendment, it would be my impression, Senator Soper,
18. that the Bohemians would, in fact, be a ethnic
19. group. I think the distinction would be if the
20. town of Cicero were to have an art fair, that would
21. not be an ethnic cultural event. However, if the
22. Bohemian community were to have it, it would then
23. be a cultural event. It depends on where you want the
24. money from.
25. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)
26. Senator Soper.
27. SENATOR SOPER:
28. Well, his explanation is totally confusing.
29. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)
30. Is there further discussion? Senator Lemke.
31. SENATOR LEMKE:
32. In answer to Senator Soper, the Council is presently
33. working with the Czechoslovakian Society of America

1. on their art program and museum program. They're  
2. putting together a program for them.

3. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

4. Further discussion? Senator Carroll has moved  
5. the adoption of Committee Amendment No. 1 and there's  
6. been a request for a roll call. All in favor of the  
7. adoption of the amendment will vote Aye. Those  
8. opposed will vote Nay. The voting is open.

9. Have all voted who wish? Have all voted who wish?

10. Take the record. On that question, the Ayes are  
11. 26, the Nays are 24, none Voting Present. Majority  
12. having voted in favor of the amendment, the amendment  
13. is declared adopted. Senator Clewis, for what  
14. purpose do you arise?

15. SENATOR LEWIS:

16. Mr. President, I rise to be recorded as a Yes  
17. vote, which would have been on the board had my  
18. key been on.

19. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

20. Electronic record will so show. Further  
21. amendments?

22. SECRETARY:

23. Amendment No. 2...Committee Amendment No. 2.

24. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

25. Senator Carroll.

26. SENATOR CARROLL:

27. In an effort of fiscal responsibility, in attempt  
28. to lower the budget, and thereby reduce approximately  
29. twenty-one thousand five hundred dollars by removing  
30. the equivalent of one and a half persons who  
31. had originally been on a Federal payroll, the Federal  
32. funds have dried up and the State does not feel that it  
33. should pick up the burden of those people when the

1. Federal monies have no longer made themselves available  
2. to us. I would move the adoption of Committee  
3. Amendment No. 2 which is a reduction of twenty-one  
4. thousand five hundred dollars.

5. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

6. Is there discussion? Senator Harber Hall.

7. SENATOR HALL:

8. I support this amendment.

9. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

10. Further discussion? Senator Nimrod.

11. SENATOR NIMROD:

12. Yeah, one thing I would like to call attention  
13. pertaining to this amendment. This particular  
14. amendment...this does not provide for any new  
15. positions and what has happened is this program is  
16. that these people were on before and they're still  
17. on and all they want to do is use these...this  
18. personnel within their own funds. They're not  
19. asking for any increase and so I don't see why we  
20. should be taking away these particular positions  
21. as the result of that, whether it was Federal  
22. funds or not. The fact is that they're not asking  
23. for any additional money to do the same work and I think  
24. they ought to be able to maintain this and this  
25. would certainly create a hardship. I've had some  
26. extensive conversation with them pertaining to this  
27. subject and I would think that this amendment would  
28. do them a disservice if we were to take it away.

29. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

30. Senator Lemke.

31. SENATOR LEMKE:

32. This is an amendment to cut out one and a half  
33. employees. Apparently they have nothing else to do

1. just to call around the State and work against the  
2. Ethnic Art Program and they have nothing else...that  
3. they're on their Federal payroll, why should we continue  
4. a Federal program? That's a problem in the State.  
5. We continue Federal programs when we can't afford  
6. them. You either take the Federal money and when  
7. the Federal money dries up, the program  
8. should end. And this is what we're trying to do here.  
9. We're ending these one and a half employees who are  
10. Federally paid. We don't have the money and apparently,  
11. they don't have enough time to do work and they've  
12. got time to be making phone calls all over the State,  
13. on our expenses to work against the aims of the committee.

14. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

15. Any further discussion? On the motion to adopt,  
16. all in favor say Aye. Opposed Nay. The Ayes have it,  
17. the amendment is adopted. Are there further amendments?

18. SECRETARY:

19. No further committee amendments.

20. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

21. Any amendments from the Floor? 3rd reading.  
22. Senate Bill 353, Senator Lane. Senate Bill 364, Senator  
23. Berning. Read the bill, Mr. Secretary. For what purpose  
24. does Senator Carroll arise?

25. SENATOR CARROLL:

26. If the Senator would hold that, I think he had  
27. some amendments that he has just given to us. We  
28. have an additional amendment being prepared as well.  
29. If he could hold that, we can get the amendment to you.  
30. Thank you.

31. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

32. The bill will be held. Take it out of the record.  
33. Senate Bill 371, Senator Maragos. Senate Bill 375,  
34. Senator Chew. Read the bill, Mr. Secretary.

1. SECRETARY:  
2. Senate Bill 375.  
3. (Secretary reads title of bill)  
4. 2nd reading of the bill. The Committee on Finance  
5. and Credit Regulations offers one amendment.  
6. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)  
7. Senator Chew, to explain the amendment.  
8. You asked that your bills be read. There's a committee  
9. amendment. Further discussion? On the motion to  
10. adopt. All in favor say Aye. Opposed Nay. The  
11. Ayes have it. The amendment is adopted. Are there  
12. further amendments?  
13. SECRETARY:  
14. No further committee amendments.  
15. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)  
16. Amendments from the Floor? 3rd reading.  
17. For what purpose does Senator Rock arise?  
18. SENATOR ROCK:  
19. Thank you, Mr. President, Ladies and Gentlemen  
20. of the Senate. That was the one and only experience  
21. I had with the Committee on Finance being  
22. ...having been just appointed a member and I now  
23. understand I have been unappointed. But the discussion  
24. in the committee that I heard was that Amendment No.  
25. 1 was to have been Tabled and Amendment No. 2 was,  
26. in fact, adopted in the committee to replace  
27. Amendment No. 1. Is there a second amendment on that  
28. bill, Mr. Secretary?  
29. SECRETARY:  
30. If...if an amendment was Tabled in committee, we...  
31. SENATOR ROCK:  
32. Well, no. The discussion was that...we were not able  
33. to Table that one in committee. But, that a second

1. amendment would, in fact, be offered to take its  
2. place.

3. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

4. Senator Rock, the Secretary has only one amendment.  
5. Our notes show two committee amendments with Amendment  
6. No. 1 being Tabled on the Floor.

7. SENATOR ROCK:

8. That is...that is what is reflected in the notes  
9. in the files, Mr. President.

10. PRESIDING OFFICER:(SENATOR BRUCE)

11. But, what I'm saying is the Secretary has only  
12. one amendment. Evidently, there is some confusion.  
13. Perhaps we could take it out of the record. Senator  
14. Chew, for what purpose do you arise?

15. SENATOR CHEW:

16. I wanted to understand Senator Rock as to what  
17. he said. I didn't get full extent of that.

18. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

19. Senator Rock, would you repeat your comments  
20. and would Senator Carroll and Senator Rhoads...  
21. perhaps the two gentlemen. You're in their line of  
22. vision.

23. SENATOR ROCK:

24. Thank you, Mr. President. Senator Chew, I'd  
25. be happy to. It was my understanding was when I  
26. became a member of the Finance and Credit Regulations  
27. Committee on that afternoon, that your bill had, in fact,  
28. been presented in the morning and an amendment had  
29. been offered and adopted. Later that afternoon, the  
30. bill was again presented and a second amendment  
31. was to be offered by you and committee...committee  
32. amendment...the previously adopted amendment was to have  
33. been Tabled and the second amendment was an agreed

1. amendment which superseded Amendment No. 1 and made it  
2. unnecessary.

3. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

4. Senator Chew.

5. SENATOR CHEW:

6. Mr. President. Yes, Senator Rock, you are absolutely  
7. correct. I was under the impression that that was  
8. corrected in committee at the time we offered the second  
9. amendment which was, in fact, the following week.  
10. If the...if the first amendment has not been Tabled,  
11. I would move to Table that amendment now.

12. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

13. Senator Rock.

14. SENATOR ROCK:

15. Well, before we rush off into anything peremptorily  
16. here, the Secretary advises me that there is but one  
17. amendment attached to the bill. Perhaps we...let's  
18. take it out of the record and we can retrace our steps  
19. and find out which amendment is which. If that's  
20. all right with you.

21. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

22. Take it from the record. Senator Grotberg.

23. SENATOR GROTBORG:

24. On a point of personal privilege, Mr. President.

25. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

26. State your point.

27. SENATOR GROTBORG:

28. I thought maybe this Body would be interested  
29. in knowing, particularly those interested in the Energy  
30. Program, I just got a call from Washington that St.  
31. Charles School District 303 in St. Charles, Illinois,  
32. was just awarded nearly a half million dollar grant  
33. by ERDA, the Energy Research Division of the Federal



1. Government for a solar energy roof for heating and for heating  
2. water and the Museum of Science and Industry in  
3. Chicago got three hundred and sixty-four thousand  
4. for a heating and cooling plant. The only  
5. two grants awarded in Illinois, were awarded  
6. today and only eighty were granted in the whole  
7. United States. And I think we should be proud  
8. of what happened in the State of Illinois today.  
9. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

10. For what purpose does Senator Buzbee arise?  
11. SENATOR BUZBEE:

12. On a point of personal privilege, Mr. President.

14. Are we ready for announcements? I'd like to  
15. make an announcement.

16. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ROCK)

17. Yes, we are on the Order of Motions and Announcements.  
18. We are not on that order of business. Now, you know,  
19. if you want leave to go to that order of business,  
20. we can be here for a week.

21. SENATOR HALL:

22. Okay. Thank you, Mr. President, fellow members  
23. of the Senate. I would like to announce tomorrow night  
24. is the Soul Food Soiree and it's going to be at Forum  
25. 30. It's a dinner dance and the menu is, sliced  
26. tomatoes and onions, cole slaw, potato salad, tossed  
27. greens, red beans and rice, mustard greens, collard  
28. greens, country fried chicken, hamhocks, chitterlings,

3. SENATOR JOHNS:
4. I talked to a great friend of this Senate, Senator
5. Partee today, and he said he was coming also. I think
6. a lot of us are very pleased about that, also, Mr.
7. President.
8. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ROCK)
9. Senator Netsch.
10. SENATOR NETSCH:
11. Thank you, Mr. President. On a more frivolous
12. order of business, I wanted to alert the members of the
13. Committee on Judiciary II that there will be a special
14. meeting of Judiciary II on Friday, at 10:30 a.m.
15. in Room 400 to consider the legislation that was already
16. on the Calendar on 2nd reading.
17. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ROCK)
18. Further discussion? Further announcements?
19. Senator D'Arco.
20. SENATOR D'ARCO:
21. I...I think therefore, I am...no I think that this...
22. You like that one? Did you like that one?
23. No, we had a motion before this Body some time ago
24. to have these bills sent back to Judiciary II
25. for reconsideration. That motion failed on the Floor.
26. Now, I've done my research on these bills and I've
27. had staff prepare an analysis of these bills and we're
28. talking about Thompson's criminal law package of bills
29. that provide for mandatory sentencing and I've done
30. my homework on these bills and I'm ready to hear these
31. bills on the Floor and I'm prepared to argue these
32. bills on this Floor and I don't want to go back to
33. committee to reconsider these bills in lieu of a motion

1. that failed on this Floor.

2. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ROCK)

3. Senator Netsch.

4. SENATOR NETSCH:

5. I don't think it's technically a reconsideration  
6. of the bills, Senator D'Arco, but at the time that the  
7. committee voted all of these bills out, they requested  
8. the members who voted in favor of that motion, which  
9. I did not, requested that there be additional meetings  
10. of the committee so that the whole subject matter  
11. could be considered and attempts made to see whether  
12. there was any area of agreement that could then take  
13. the form of amendments on the Floor. And so, in respect  
14. to the members of the committee who had asked me to  
15. call this meeting, I have acceded in doing so.

16. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ROCK)

17. Senator D'Arco.

18. SENATOR D'ARCO:

19. Well, I would...I'll go along with Senator Netsch.

20. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ROCK)

21. Senator Bloom, for what purpose do you arise? Senator Bloom.

22. SENATOR BLOOM:

23. Thank you. Thank you, Mr. President. Now, that  
24. we're done with the ghost of Christmas Past, I'd like  
25. leave of the Body to have my name taken off as a  
26. cosponsor of Senate 245.

27. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ROCK)

28. You've heard Senator Bloom's request. Is leave  
29. granted? So ordered. Further business to come before  
30. the Senate? Senator Hynes. Gentlemen, if you'll  
31. pay attention, it could save a lot of problems.

32. SENATOR HYNES:

33. Two items, Mr. President. First, I would move

1. that the Executive Orders of the Governor dealing with  
2. General Services and Law Enforcement be discharged from  
3. the Committee on Executive and re-referred to the  
4. Special Committee on Government Reorganization, which  
5. has scheduled a hearing for them on Thursday morning.  
6. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ROCK)

7. Senator Hynes has moved to discharge the Committee  
8. on Executive Appointments and Administration from  
9. further consideration of those two Executive orders  
10. for the purpose of re-referral to the Committee  
11. on Executive Reorganization. All those in favor  
12. signify by saying Aye. All those opposed. The Ayes  
13. have it. So ordered. Senator Hynes.

14. SENATOR HYNES:

15. The second announcement respects the schedule  
16. for the Senate for the next two weeks. A copy of  
17. that schedule has been distributed and I would ask  
18. that the members take a careful look at it. It  
19. calls for five days each week and it is the hope...  
20. the hope of some that if we are all good boys  
21. and girls, we might be able to cut that down a little  
22. bit so that we would have some time back in the district,  
23. but at the present moment, it's five days each of the  
24. next two weeks and it calls for a substantial amount  
25. of Floor time. We have in excess of six hundred bills  
26. on the Calendar and it's going to take a substantial  
27. amount of Floor time to...to move these bills. There  
28. will be evening Sessions both weeks as needed. So,  
29. to the extent that we can move the bills as we have today,  
30. we can avoid evening Sessions and perhaps even open  
31. up a day in those next two weeks.

32. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ROCK)

33. Any further business to come before the Senate?

1. If not, Senator Hynes moves that the Senate stand
2. adjourned until Wednesday, May 11 at the hour of
3. 9:00 a.m. The Senate stands adjourned.
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
