28. been introduced in the Senate here and if they're not  
29. they certainly will be by the time they reach 3rd

15. chance to...to review them in committee and I think  
16. our staff ought to review them also.

21. are the results of the condominium study committee

28. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR KENNETH HALL)

29. For what purpose...

30. SECRETARY:

31. 2nd reading of the bill. Wait a minute. We have a  
32. request for a fiscal note on this bill.

33. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR KENNETH HALL)

11. SENATOR EGAN:

12. Yes, he...he moved Do Pass in committee but, I...

33. Senator Lane.

1. SENATOR LANE:  
2. Mr. President, I'd now like to Table Committee Amend-  
3. ment No. 1.  
4. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR KENNETH HALL)  
5. Just withdraw that, Senator.  
6. SENATOR LANE:  
7. Pardon.  
8. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR KENNETH HALL)  
9. Just withdraw that one. You move to withdraw the  
10. amendment.  
11. SENATOR LANE:  
12. Yes.  
13. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR KENNETH HALL)  
14. Wait...hold it just a moment...let's see. For what  
15. purpose does Senator Rock arise?  
16. SENATOR ROCK:  
17. I think procedurally, Mr. President, if we could  
18. move to reconsider the vote by which Amendment No. 1  
19. was adopted and once having reconsidered, then Table  
20. it, then we can effect Senator Lane's desire without

25. Any further discussion? Senator Lane moves for  
26. the adoption of Amendment No. 2. All in favor say  
27. Aye. Opposed. The Ayes have it and so ordered. Any  
28. further amendments?  
29. SECRETARY:  
30. No further amendments.  
31. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR KENNETH HALL)  
32. 3rd reading. Senate Bill 1364, Senator Walsh.  
33. Do you wish that called, Senator Walsh? Read the bill.

1. SECRETARY:
2. Senate Bill 1364.
3. (Secretary reads title of bill)
4. 2nd reading of the bill. No committee amendments.
5. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR KENNETH HALL)
6. Are there any amendments from the Floor? 3rd reading
7. Senate Bill 1365, Senator Walsh. Read the bill.
8. SECRETARY:
9. Senate Bill 1365.
10. (Secretary reads title of bill)
11. 2nd reading of the bill. No committee amendments.
12. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR KENNETH HALL)
13. Any amendments from the Floor? 3rd reading. Senate
14. Bill 1373, Senator Shapiro. We're going to start from
15. the front on page 2, Senate Bill 2nd reading, Senate Bill 14.
16. Senator Davidson. Hold. Senate Bill 19, Senator Wooten.
17. Read the bill.
18. SECRETARY:
19. Senate Bill 19.
20. (Secretary reads title of bill)
21. 2nd reading of the bill. The Committee on Public Health,
22. Welfare and Corrections offers three amendments.
23. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR KENNETH HALL)
24. We'd like to have a little order in the back there,
25. please. Committee Amendment No. 1, will you explain
26. that Senator Wooten.
27. SENATOR WOOTEN:
28. Yes, Mr. President. Committee Amendment No. 1 is
29. a reordering of the entire bill to put the sections
30. in a somewhat more coherent shape. I move the adoption
31. of the amendment.
32. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR KENNETH HALL)
33. Senator Wooten moves the adoption of Committee



1. Amendment No. 1. Any discussion? All in favor, Aye.

2. Opposed. Committee Amendment No. 1 is adopted.

3. Senator Wooten.

4. SENATOR WOOTEN:

5. Mr. President, Committee Amendment No. 2 removes

6. the City of Chicago from the provisions of this bill

7. as agreed to in committee and I move the adoption of

8. the amendment.

9. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR KENNETH HALL)

10. Senator Wooten moves the adoption of Committee

11. Amendment No. 2. Any discussion? All in favor, Aye.

12. Opposed. Committee Amendment No. 2 is adopted.

13. Senator Wooten.

14. SENATOR WOOTEN:

15. Committee Amendment No. 3 clarifies that the

16. corporation counsel or the legal representative of

17. the local unit which administers this Act shall have

18. the sole responsibility for bringing action against

19. those who break the Act or violate the Act. I move

20. the adoption of the amendment.

21. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR KENNETH HALL)

22. Senator Wooten moves for the adoption of Com-

23. mittee Amendment No. 3. Any discussion? Senator

24. Weaver.

25. SENATOR WEAVER:

26. A question here. This doesn't apply only to Cook

27. County, does it, Senator Wooten? On No. 2, Amendment

28. No. 2.

29. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR KENNETH HALL)

30. Senator Wooten.

31. SENATOR WOOTEN:

32. We've already adopted that amendment. That is

33. language that was suggested by the Corporation Counsel

34. of Chicago and we checked it out. It only applies to

1. Chicago. And it applies to Cook County and the City of  
2. Chicago, but municipalities within Cook County may opt  
3. back in to the Act as indeed all have indicated they  
4. wish to do.

5. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR KENNETH HALL)

6. Senator Weaver.

7. SENATOR WEAVER:

8. Well, wouldn't this apply to St. Clair County also?

9. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR KENNETH HALL)

10. Senator Wooten.

11. SENATOR WOOTEN:

12. No, we checked with that and it does not apply  
13. to St. Clair County.

14. SENATOR WEAVER:

15. You looked that over very carefully have you?

16. SENATOR WOOTEN:

17. Yes sir.

18. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR KENNETH HALL)

19. Senator Weaver.

20. SENATOR WEAVER:

21. We can check it out, but it says that any county  
22. that has a chief executive officer elected by the  
23. electorate of such county. And I think that would  
24. apply to St. Clair County.

25. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR KENNETH HALL)

26. Senator Wooten.

27. SENATOR WOOTEN:

28. Senator Weaver, I must confess. I'm depending on  
29. the legal departments, the Department of Public Health and  
30. the Attorney General, they tell me this only applies to  
31. Cook County. If it does not, why then I'll be glad  
32. to move later on to Table that amendment and get the  
33. proper language in cause that certainly is the intent

1. of the amendment and I'm just following legal counsel on  
2. that.

3. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR KENNETH HALL)

4. For what purpose does Senator Netsch arise?

5. SENATOR NETSCH:

6. I...I wanted to comment on this discussion if I might.

7. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR KENNETH HALL)

8. Go ahead, Senator Netsch.

9. SENATOR NETSCH:

10. Thank you. I...Senator Weaver, I think...this  
11. came up in committee when that amendment was offered  
12. also and while it may be that there has to be something  
13. eventually put in the amendment to make it clear. I  
14. think the word chief executive officer was being used  
15. as a term of art in the same way in which it is used  
16. to indicate those counties that are home rule counties.  
17. In the...that's the language which determines whether  
18. or not a county is a home rule county. There is only  
19. one home rule county and that is Cook County. So that  
20. even the other two counties which elect their County  
21. Board chairmen or county wide are not, they are not  
22. chief executive officers in the literal term of our  
23. sense of that word and I think that was why we felt  
24. satisfied or Senator Wooten felt satisfied about that  
25. terminology.

26. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR KENNETH HALL)

27. Senator Weaver.

28. SENATOR WEAVER:

29. Well, I was just wondering Senator Wooten, why should  
30. Cook County be exempt anyway?

31. SENATOR WOOTEN:

32. Well, this is all after the fact, since the amendment  
33. has been adopted, but simply because Cook...the City of

1. Chicago, not Cook County. We had to do it this way to  
2. make sure it was absolutely constitutional. We've left  
3. the option from municipalities in Cook County to opt  
4. back in as indeed all of them have indicated they will.  
5. This is to exempt the City of Chicago, which did not  
6. wish to be included and would not support the bill if  
7. it were. And since it was somewhat critical to the  
8. bill's chances of passage and since we need this  
9. legislation state-wide, I acceded to the committee's  
10. request.

11. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR KENNETH HALL)

12. For what purpose does Senator Rhoads arise?

13. SENATOR RHOADS:

14. Just...just trying to find out. This was the...  
15. Senator Wooten...

16. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR KENNETH HALL)

17. Senator Wooten.

18. SENATOR RHOADS:

19. Over here. This was the agreed upon committee  
20. amendment? It was. All right. Well I'm...I'm  
21. supporting the amendment and my district is in  
22. suburban Cook and and all of Cook County is excluded,  
23. right?

24. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR KENNETH HALL)

25. Senator Wooten.

26. SENATOR WOOTEN:

27. Yes, but they have the option of opting back in  
28. and most of them have indicated that they, in fact, will,  
29. but I may point out all of this is moot, since the  
30. amendment has already been adopted and we are now in  
31. amendment 3.

32. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR KENNETH HALL)

33. Is there any further discussion on Amendment No. 2  
34. which we have adopted? We're in the process now of

1. Amendment No. 3. Senator Wooten. Hold it just a moment.  
2. We would like to have your undivided attention. There's  
3. some discussion on this and I think you need to be apprised  
4. of what's going on. Would you continue Senator Wooten.

5. SENATOR WOOTEN:

6. Yes, I think we've done with Amendment No. 2 which  
7. has been adopted. Committee Amendment No. 3 clarifies  
8. that the corporation counsel or the legal agent for  
9. the local unit of government actually administering  
10. this bill will have the responsibility to bring  
11. action against those who violate the bill. And I  
12. move the adoption of Committee Amendment No. 3.

13. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR KENNETH HALL)

14. Senator Wooten moves for the adoption of Senate...Senate  
15. Committee No. 3. Senator Graham. For what purpose  
16. does Senator Graham arise?

17. SENATOR GRAHAM:

18. If you have any control over you side of the  
19. aisle, I wish you'd exercise it so we can hear what's  
20. going on.

21. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR KENNETH HALL)

22. Thank you, Senator Graham. You're...gentlemen  
23. and...could we please have your attention for just  
24. a moment. Both sides of the aisle. We need some  
25. order here or else no one is going to understand what  
26. these amendments do. For what purpose does Senator  
27. Berman arise?

28. SENATOR BERMAN:

29. Point of order, Mr...Mr. President.

30. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR KENNETH HALL)

31. State your point of order.

32. SENATOR BERMAN:

33. I just noticed two House Members that come strolling  
34. in to the Senate without wearing ties. I wish that they

1. would recognize our dress code over here.

2. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR KENNETH HALL)

3. Sergeant-at-Arms would you please enforce the  
4. rules of the Senate. Senator Rhoads.

5. SENATOR RHOADS:

6. Mr. President, on the amendment, and I think Senator  
7. Berman brought up this point in committee, so I hope  
8. he's listening.

9. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR KENNETH HALL)

10. Senator...Senator Berman, would you listen to  
11. Senator Rhoads comment please.

12. SENATOR RHOADS:

13. The discussion in committee, Senator Wooten, was  
14. that the bill as originally drafted was empowering local  
15. corporate...corporation councils to bring action in the  
16. name of the people of the State of Illinois. Now, how  
17. does this amendment, this was a committee amendment,  
18. how does this amendment correct that?

19. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR KENNETH HALL)

20. Senator Wooten.

21. SENATOR WOOTEN:

22. The concern expressed in the committee was that  
23. the Attorney General would bring actions for local violations  
24. and this makes clear that it's the local legal agent that  
25. can bring action for a violation, not the Attorney General.  
26. That was the concern expressed by Senator Berman and that  
27. is what Senate...that's what Committee Amendment No. 3  
28. makes clear, that's it a corporate council, the unit of  
29. local government or the State's Attorney of the county  
30. in which the violation occurred shall bring such actions.

31. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR KENNETH HALL)

32. Senator Rhoads.

33. SENATOR RHOADS:

34. If that satisfies Senator Berman, I guess it satisfies

1. me. The...the concern was that the...they are not acting  
2. in the name of the people of the state, but in...just in the  
3. name of their local municipality, or whatever the governmental  
4. unit is.

5. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR KENNETH HALL)

6. Senator Berman.

7. SENATOR BERMAN:

8. Thank you, Mr. President. I've looked at this  
9. language and I believe it does satisfy the objections  
10. that were raised. The previous language was in the...  
11. in the alternative which seemed to imply that even  
12. though the local community had the responsibility of  
13. enforcing it, if the...their corporation council  
14. decided not to enforce a particular alledged violation,  
15. that the AG or somebody up that line, the State's Attorney,  
16. could enforce it. That I believe has been corrected,  
17. where the sole discretion and responsibility for the  
18. enforcement will lie with the legal officer of the entity,  
19. which is enforcing the statute.

20. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR KENNETH HALL)

21. Senator Lane, did you desire recognition? Senator  
22. Wooten moves for the adoption of Amendment No. 3. Any  
23. discussion? All in favor, Aye. Opposed. The Amendment  
24. No. 3 is adopted. Are there any further amendments?

25. SECRETARY:

26. No further committee amendments.

27. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR KENNETH HALL)

28. Are there any amendments from the Floor? 3rd  
29. reading. Senate Bill 35, Senator Johns. Read it.

30. SECRETARY:

31. Senate Bill 35.

32. (Secretary reads title of bill)

33. 2nd reading of the bill. No committee amendments.

1. PRESIDENT:
2. Any amendments from the Floor? 3rd reading. Senate
3. Bill 36, Senator Johns. Read the bill.
4. SECRETARY:
5. Senate Bill 36.
6. (Secretary reads title of bill)
7. 2nd reading of the bill. No committee amendments.
8. PRESIDENT:
9. Any amendments from the Floor? 3rd reading.
10. Senate Bill 51, Senator Merlo. Read the bill.
11. SECRETARY:
12. Senate Bill 51.
13. (Secretary reads title of bill)
14. 2nd reading of the bill. No committee amendments.
15. PRESIDENT:
16. Any amendments from the Floor? 3rd reading.
17. Senate Bill 168, Senator Nimrod. Read the bill.
18. SECRETARY:
19. Senate Bill 168.
20. (Secretary reads title of bill)
21. 2nd reading of the bill. The Committee on Elections and
22. Reapportionment offers one amendment.
23. PRESIDENT:
24. Senator Nimrod.
25. SENATOR NIMROD:
26. Yes, Mr. President and fellow Senators. What this
27. amendment did was to make two particular changes I had
28. asked to have done in the Reference Bureau and they a
29. copy of an old bill in order to prepare it and what it
30. did was to change the date to twenty-eight days requiring
31. registration for an indication of party preference. The
32. same as the registration dates and it made the same
33. provisions as they did for registration in all areas and



1. it eliminated any notice provisions as the bill had  
2. required.

3. PRESIDENT:  
4. Senator Rhoads.

5. SENATOR RHOADS:  
6. Well, Senator Nimrod, I'm trying to get Senator  
7. Kosinski's attention and some other members of the  
8. Elections Committee. We just had some other bills  
9. pass out of there and wer're trying to make all these  
10. things uniform at thirty-five days. Senator Kosinski,  
11. is that your understanding?

12. PRESIDENT:  
13. Senator Kosinski.

14. SENATOR KOSINSKI:  
15. I...I was distracted by some fine gentlemen here.

16. PRESIDENT:  
17. Senator Rhoads.

18. SENATOR KOSINSKI:  
19. Would you repeat...

20. SENATOR RHOADS:  
21. Senator Nimrod is trying to offer a committee  
22. amendment dealing with registration cut off at twenty-  
23. eight days prior to an election. Now, we passed out  
24. another bill making it uniform at thirty-five days.  
25. So could we now talk about changing that amendment,  
26. Senator Nimrod, or do you have objections to that?

27. PRESIDENT:  
28. Senator Nimrod.

29. SENATOR NIMROD:  
30. Yes, Mr. President. Senator Rhoads, I have no  
31. objections, but I think this makes it uniform with  
32. the existing Act and why don't we just move it up  
33. and I will be glad to look at the bills that you're

1. talking about and if any amendment is I'll be glad to  
2. bring it back to adapt to it, but that's not law as yet  
3. and I'll be glad to discuss it with you. But, this is  
4. adopting the amendment which changes other things rather  
5. than the item you're referring to. And I would like to  
6. get this bill in the shape that I would like it.

7. PRESIDENT:

8. Senator Rhoads.

9. SENATOR RHOADS:

10. I'll yield to those more senior than I in...in  
11. how that...that is supposed to work. The Chairman  
12. of the Minority Spokesman of the committee could give  
13. us some guidance on that.

14. PRESIDENT:

15. Senator Nimrod, do you wish to proceed, or do  
16. you want to take this out of the record...

17. SENATOR NIMROD:

18. No...I...I...I would like to proceed and then  
19. whatever...whatever their concerns are, I'll be glad  
20. to take care of.

21. PRESIDENT:

22. All right. Is there further discussion? Senator  
23. D'Arco.

24. SENATOR D'ARCO:

25. I think that, John, if you proceeded now and the  
26. thirty-five day uniform registration bill passed, then  
27. you can bring it back. Isn't that the understanding,  
28. then change it to thirty-five days? That's okay with  
29. me.

30. PRESIDENT:

31. Senator Nimrod has moved for the adoption of  
32. Amendment No. 1. All those in favor...Senator Demuzio.

33. SENATOR DEMUZIO:

1. Will the sponsor yield for a question?

2. PRESIDENT:

3. He indicates he will yield.

4. SENATOR DEMUZIO:

5. Senator Nimrod, you indicated that members that

6. had objections, you would take care of it. Do you

7. mean by that, that if we're opposed to the bill that

8. you'll in fact take our request and Table it?

9. PRESIDENT:

10. Senator Nimrod nods his head.

11. SENATOR NIMROD:

12. That's correct. Thank you, Mr. President.

13. PRESIDENT:

14. All right. Senator Nimrod moves the adoption of

15. Amendment No. 1. All those in favor signify by saying

16. Aye. Opposed. The Ayes have it. The amendment is

17. adopted. Any further amendments?

18. SECRETARY:

19. No further committee amendments.

20. PRESIDENT:

21. Any amendments from the Floor? 3rd reading.

22.

31. All those in favor signify by saying Aye. Opposed.

32. The Ayes have it. The amendment is Tabled. Senator

33. Netsch now offers Amendment No. 2. Would you explain

1. the amendment, Senator.

2. SENATOR NETSCH:

3. Thank you. Amendment No. 2...will it be now designated  
4. Amendment No. 2? All right. Amendment No. 2 makes the  
5. same fairly technical corrective additions that the  
6. committee amendment made. It emphasizes or makes  
7. clear that the Office of Education would be the  
8. administrator of the junior college part of the  
9. General Assembly Scholarship Program. It also changes  
10. references which we did not discover until later, to the  
11. Superintendent of Public Instruction to the Superintendent  
12. of Education, which is the correct title at the present  
13. time. It is just corrective in nature and I would move  
14. adoption of Amendment No. 2 to Senate Bill 221.

30. (Secretary reads title of bill)

31. 2nd reading of the bill. The Committee on Public  
32. Health, Welfare and Corrections offers two amendments.

33. PRESIDENT:

1. Senator Wooten.

2. SENATOR WOOTEN:

3. Yes, Mr. President. The Committee Amendment No. 1  
4. adds language which makes the bill satisfactory to  
5. the psychiatrists and Medical Society. It includes the  
6. word "client, a patient with client" rather, which they  
7. are more comfortable with. Leaves some options for  
8. disclosure of materials through judicial process  
9. and protects work notes on the part of service  
10. providers. I move the adoption of Amendment No. 1.

11. PRESIDENT:

12. Is there any discussion? If not, Senator Wooten  
13. moves the adoption of Amendment No. 1. All those  
14. in favor signify by saying Aye. Opposed. The Ayes  
15. have it. The amendment is adopted. Amendment No. 2,  
16. Senator Wooten.

17. SENATOR WOOTEN:

18. Amendment No. 2 picks up a patient-client reference  
19. that was omitted in the first amendment so I move  
20. its adoption.

24. in favor signify by saying Aye. Opposed. The Ayes

32. I am afraid I remiss. I thought I placed some

2. fine. All right. There is a third amendment.

4. Senator Wooten asks leave to bring Senate Bill  
5. 289 back to the Order of 2nd reading for the purpose  
6. of offering an additional amendment. Is leave granted?  
7. Leave is granted. Senator Wooten on Amendment No. 3.

8. SENATOR WOOTEN:

9. Amendment No. 3 is offered at the request of the  
10. Hospital Association to exempt hospital records from  
11. the application of the act. These records  
12. are secondary in nature and those putting together  
13. the bill agreed that indeed, is a proper exemption.  
14. Also, it makes provisions for microfilm records  
15. and for researchers having access to information

31. 2nd reading of the bill. No committee amendments. One  
32. Floor amendment offered by Senator Philip.

33. PRESIDENT:

1. Senator Philip.

2. SENATOR PHILIP:

3. Thank you, Mr. President. Senate Bill 295 as it  
4. got out of the Transportation Committee, would allow  
5. senior citizens over sixty-five to only pay for half  
6. of their State license plates. Talked to Senator  
7. Chew. He has seen the amendment. We agreed on the  
8. amendment is committee and what it does is define  
9. qualified owner, which means a person over sixty-five  
10. years of age whose income is less than ten thousand  
11. dollars and is defined in the senior citizens disabled  
12. personal property tax relief. So, I move the adoption  
13. of Amendment No. 1 to Senate Bill 295.

14. PRESIDENT:

15. Is there any discussion? Senator Rock.

16. SENATOR ROCK:

17. Thank you, Mr. President, Ladies and Gentlemen  
18. of the Senate. I rise in opposition to Amendment  
19. No. 1 to Senate Bill 295. This, it seems to me,  
20. is a perfect example of what should be done in the  
21. committee. This bill came out of committee seven  
22. to nothing as originally introduced and now by  
23. virtue of Amendment No. 1, we are effectively re-writing  
24. the entire bill so it is, in fact, a different bill  
25. and I would point out to you that under the amendment  
26. as introduced, there would be created a distinction  
27. within a class that is, those over sixty-five who earn  
28. ten thousand less or more. There's two classes of people.  
29. And that separation within that class, it seems to me,  
30. raises some serious constitutional questions with  
31. respect to this amendment. Secondly, it would appear,  
32. although the amendment doesn't say so, it would appear  
33. that there would have to be accompanying the license  
34. plate application, some form of proof as to both age and



1. income bracket and it seems to me that that places some  
2. kind of a burden on the senior citizens or those over  
3. sixty-five that they would have to come in with  
4. additional documentation, although the bill doesn't  
5. specifically say that. Thirdly, it seems to me that  
6. we are engaged in a large scale program of allowing  
7. financial institutions across this State, banks in  
8. particular, to act as agents for the Secretary of  
9. State in that they can sell license plates over  
10. the counter. Again, how does a bank know or how will  
11. a bank know who qualifies under this proposed amendment  
12. and who does not qualify. And finally, it seems  
13. to say that a senior citizen over sixty-five earning  
14. less than ten thousand dollars, if he owns two  
15. cars, it only applies to one car. And yet there is no  
16. penalty provision. What if, in fact, some devious  
17. senior attempts to...to license all four of his  
18. automobiles under this provision? Just seems to me  
19. that this amendment is ill-conceived and I would  
20. urge its defeat.

21. PRESIDENT:

22.         Senator Philip.

23. SENATOR PHILIP:

24.         Thank you, Mr. President. You know, I hope that  
25. my memory is better than yours, Senator Rock, but if  
26. I remember right, you were the sponsor of the so called  
27. circuit breaker, which gave the sixty-five year  
28. old people who made under ten thousand dollars a year,  
29. a tax break on the real estate property, and if I  
30. remember right, that set up the classification in  
31. the first place. Secondly, the committee suggested  
32. this amendment. Senator Chew, who is the Chairman of that  
33. committee, suggested this amendment. I have shown him the

1. amendment. He is for the amendment. And we worked it  
2. out with the committee and the only reason I got it  
3. out of committee, was with Senator Chew's approval  
4. of the amendment. This is the amendment. So, I would  
5. say to you, Senator Rock, this is a good amendment.  
6. It would seem to me that people who make over ten  
7. thousand dollars a year, perhaps aren't...not  
8. entitled to half of one license plate at half cost  
9. and I think it's a fair amendment. It's drawn well.  
10. We left the discretion up to the Secretary of State.  
11. The Secretary...by his order, could order them to file  
12. a copy of their senior citizens disabled personal  
13. property tax relief act. They can present that to the  
14. bank. They can present that with their application  
15. but I wanted to leave that flexibility in the Secretary  
16. of State's office. I didn't want to put it in the  
17. Statute and I think they agree to that.

18. PRESIDENT:

19. Is there any further discussion? Senator Wooten.

20. SENATOR WOOTEN:

21. Just a question of the sponsor. Senator Philip,  
22. I know this is perhaps not the proper time to ask this,  
23. but would you consider a further amendment to include  
24. the disabled under this...under the provisions of this?  
25. It has been brought to my attention by several people  
26. who are disabled and under some financial d'ress  
27. that we don't often enough pay attention to their  
28. difficulties and I wondered if you would amenable to  
29. an amendment addressing that problem.

30. PRESIDENT:

31. Senator Philip.

32. SENATOR PHILIP:

33. Thank you, Mr. President. Senator Wooten, I would

1. have no problem with that at all. I would humbly  
2. suggest this, that perhaps we could pass it with  
3. this amendment over in the House, put the amendment  
4. on in the House and I would have no problem with that  
5. at all. And I apologize for overlooking the disabled.

6. PRESIDENT:

7. Any further discussion? If not, Senator Philip  
8. has moved the adoption of Amendment No. 1. All  
9. those in favor signify by saying Aye. Opposed.  
10. The Nays have it. The amendment is defeated.  
11. For what purpose does Senator Philip arise?

13. I would respectfully ask for a roll call. If we're  
14. going to take those kind of readings up there at the

17. As long...as long as your request is respectful,

28. SENATOR GRAHAM:

29. Mr. President and members of the Senate. Before  
30. I call this bill, I'd like to advise the Senate, this is  
31. not my first bill. Hopefully, not the last. The title  
32. on the bill is a little bit misleading, Ladies and  
33. Gentlemen. However, this bill really is a bill that

1. authorizes the Department of Illinois Law Enforcement  
2. Commission rather, to expend in the area of grants  
3. that they have made and some that have been promised  
4. to the ten million dollars of Federal funds. Also  
5. says that ten thousand dollars are from GRF  
6. funds and that in committee, the...the commission  
7. agreed that they would be...there would be enough grant  
8. lapse in other programs to take care of the ten  
9. thousand dollars in GRF funds, so, in fact, we are
