30. And the concept of multi-year license plates is  
31. not new, it's been done in several other states  
32. and rather successfully. The advantages, well,  
33. as I said, would...would save the taxpayers upwards of

1. twenty million dollars. And I would certainly solicit  
2. a favorable vote.

3. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

4. Is there discussion? Senator Chew.

5. SENATOR CHEW:

6. Mr. President and Gentlemen, Ladies. I will  
7. just echo Senator Donnewald's statement, but I'd  
8. like to add that this concept has been in the  
9. Legislature for a number of years. We finally reached  
10. a conclusion in my committee, the Secretary of State  
11. was there, his presentation was satisfactory to  
12. the members of the committee. It's a terrific  
13. savings. He went through all of the aspects of  
14. the issuing of these plates. The kind of material  
15. that they will be manufactured with, and we found  
16. no fault of anything. And I, too, would ask a  
17. favorable roll call on this bill.

18. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

19. Any further discussion? Senator Glass.

20. SENATOR GLASS:

21. Thank you, Mr. President, Ladies and Gentlemen.  
22. I rise in support of this excellent concept and in  
23. support of this bill. I think it will save Illinois  
24. a good deal of money. I would point out to the  
25. sponsor in the membership that I'm not entirely sure  
26. that it's free from all flaws. It's a complex bill  
27. and one possible concern, I think, that may have to  
28. be addressed later, is that of second division vehicles.  
29. That is trucks. They are included in this bill and they  
30. produce a great deal of revenue for the State. And  
31. I hope that there is not an opportunity with the  
32. inclusion of them for cheating and avoiding of regis-  
33. tration fees. And I...I just raise this, because I

1. think if that does develop, we may have to consider later,  
2. removing trucks from his multi-year system. But, in any  
3. event, I congratulate the sponsor and certainly stand in  
4. support of the bill.

5. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

6. Further discussion? Senator Graham.

7. SENATOR GRAHAM:

8. Senator Glass spoke to a couple of points that  
9. I had in mind and certainly I think most of the  
10. people subscribe to the philosophy...philosophy that this will save  
11. some money. The only thing I'm concerned about  
12. Senator Donnewald and we'll have to address that  
13. later, if we don't do a considerable better job of  
14. getting some material, better than what we have now  
15. for our license plates, a two year thing won't mean  
16. any thing at all, because the one year plates don't  
17. hold together for a whole year.

18. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

19. Senator Philip.

20. SENATOR PHILIP:

21. Will the sponsor yield for a question?

22. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

23. Indicates he will yield. Senator Donnewald.

24. SENATOR PHILIP:

25. I'm wondering, Senator Donnewald, the...I understand  
26. now, that they're going to be increasing the weight of  
27. these plates. What effect is that going to have on  
28. the cost of postage for mailing of the plates?

29. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

30. Senator Donnewald.

31. SENATOR DONNEWALD:

32. Well, in...in view of what will, in fact, be  
33. saved, it'll be minimal. But, that does in part respond

1. to Senator Graham's comment. The Secretary's office is  
2. now in the process, or has been and...and still is in the  
3. process of investigating, as to what type of material  
4. should be used for these plates, so that two years  
5. they will not deteriorate or three years or so. But  
6. the cost in additional postage would be minimal compared to  
7. what money we would, in fact, save.

8. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

9. Senator Philip.

10. SENATOR PHILIP:

11. Yeah, thank you. I understand that the past  
12. two or three Secretary of States have also done...  
13. did a study on multi-year plates and why haven't  
14. any of the previous Secretary of States decided to  
15. bring this before the General Assembly.

16. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

17. Senator Donnewald.

18. SENATOR DONNEWALD:

19. Well, of course, you'll have to ask those  
20. previous Secretary of States.

21. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

22. Senator Philip.

23. SENATOR PHILIP:

24. Thank you, Mr. President. I...I'd just like  
25. to make a few comments, and...and I know this is  
26. a very popular issue. But if you look at the  
27. State of New York, which has multiple systems,  
28. which has been losing money, losing money. And  
29. this, I don't think is the answer of the panacea.  
30. The other problem, I think you have with it, is  
31. the...the problem of law enforcement. Determining  
32. the tag. If it's the correct tag, the right tag,  
33. the right sticker, whatever it might be. And, I'm

1. going to predict that if Illinois goes into this program,  
2. that we're going to lose money on this.

3. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

4. Is there further discussion? Senator Demuzio.

5. SENATOR DEMUZIO:

6. Will the sponsor yield?

7. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

8. Indicates that he will yield. Senator Demuzio.

9. SENATOR DEMUZIO:

10. Senator Donnewald, you indicated that it would  
11. save twenty million dollars. Over what period of  
12. time, sir?

13. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

14. Senator Donnewald.

15. SENATOR DONNEWALD:

16. Over a period of five years.

17. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

18. Senator Demuzio.

19. SENATOR DEMUZIO:

20. Any provisions in the bill that change the date  
21. to a date in the summertime when the numbness of your  
22. fingers, your frozen fingers doesn't get too cold in  
23. the winter, when you have to secure these plates?

24. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

25. Senator Donnewald.

26. SENATOR DONNEWALD:

27. Senator Chew want...I would defer to Senator  
28. Chew. He indicates he wants to respond to that.

29. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

30. Senator Chew.

31. SENATOR CHEW:

32. The Secretary asks, insomuch that it was  
33. not in the bill, and the dates are arbitrary, that he

1. would, in fact, set the dates where we would not freeze  
2. during the winter. So that is also agreed upon, Senator.

3. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

4. Senator Demuzio.

5. SENATOR DEMUZIO:

6. Well, thank you, Mr. President. I just want to  
7. rise in support of the bill and to say to Senator  
8. Philip, who indicated just a few minutes ago about  
9. the...about the tags. Illinois and several other  
10. states have had prorated tags for numerous years  
11. on second division vehicles and we have not had  
12. any problem in reference to law enforcement officials  
13. being able to identify the proper...the proper  
14. registration. I think it's a good bill. I think  
15. it's one that I'd have the support of all the  
16. members here. Particularly when we're talking  
17. about saving money to the taxpayers of Illinois.  
18. This is one way in which we can do it and do it  
19. very easily. We talk about money for the school  
20. aid formula and for other branches of government.  
21. And certainly the savings in this particular  
22. area alone will allow the General Assembly over  
23. the next few years to free up some additional  
24. dollars to those areas that probably needed  
25. a heck of a lot more than license plates. I think  
26. it's a good idea. It's a good concept and ought  
27. to be supported.

28. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

29. Is there further discussion? Senator Shapiro.

30. SENATOR SHAPIRO:

31. Mr. President, would the sponsor yield for a  
32. question?

33. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

1. Indicates that he will yield. Senator Shapiro.

2. SENATOR SHAPIRO:

3. Senator Donnewald, does this provide for one

4. or two...re-registration stickers?

5. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

6. Senator Donnewald.

7. SENATOR DONNEWALD:

8. Provides for one.

9. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

10. Senator Shapiro.

11. SENATOR SHAPIRO:

12. That...you know that bothers me a little

13. bit, because I think most of us are...are receiving

14. mail from the law enforcement people throughout

15. the State concerning a bill that just provides for

16. a rear license plate, as far as law enforcement is

17. concerned. Hopefully, when this bill gets down to

18. the Governor, I intend to support it, but, hopefully,

19. when it gets down to the Governor that provision

20. could be changed to provide for two stickers. One

21. on the rear plate, one on the front plate.

22. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

23. Senator Donnewald.

24. SENATOR DONNEWALD:

25. Excuse me, go ahead. Senator Chew.

26. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

27. Senator Chew.

28. SENATOR CHEW:

29. Senator Shapiro, it does provide for two. One

30. for the front and one for the rear. So, you won't have

31. to worry about that. It does provide that.

32. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

33. Senator Shapiro. Senator Donnewald.

1. SENATOR DONNEWALD:

2. Well, to really...Senator Glass said that there  
3. are some problems and I...I certainly recognize that  
4. there are some problems and there will be with legisla-  
5. tion of this particular character. And the Secretary  
6. has indicated to me and to members of both sides of the  
7. aisle that he certainly is willing to meet and solve  
8. those problems with whatever means is...is at hand,  
9. or maybe necessary in the fall or the following  
10. Session.

11. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

12. Is there further discussion? Senator Donnewald,  
13. do you wish to close? The question is shall House  
14. Bill 381 pass. Those in favor vote Aye. Those opposed  
15. vote Nay. The voting is open. Have all voted who  
16. wish? Take the record. On that question the Ayes  
17. are 55, the Nays are 1, none Voting Present. House  
18. Bill 381 having received a constitutional majority  
19. is declared passed. House Bill 343, Senator Chew.

20. SECRETARY:

21. House Bill 343.

22. (Secretary reads title of bill)

23. 3rd reading of the bill.

24. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

25. Senator Chew.

26. SENATOR CHEW:

27. Yes, Mr. President. This bill was heard in  
28. committee and it came out with the recommendation Do  
29. Pass. I would ask for a favorable roll call. What  
30. it does, it gives the Department of Public Aid the  
31. authority for management of funds where you have  
32. Aid to Dependent Children being received and the  
33. lack of the ability of the guardian or parents to



1. pay the rent. And it also allows the department to  
2. come in with that authority after two months expired  
3. where the rents have not been paid and yet the depart-  
4. ment has provided for it. So, it's a good bill and  
5. I'd ask for a favorable roll call.

6. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

7. Is there further discussion? The question is...  
8. Demuzio, Senator Demuzio.

9. SENATOR DEMUZIO:

10. Senator Chew, is the...I haven't had a chance  
11. to really read the bill in...in its entirety. But  
12. how much is this going to cost? Is this going to  
13. be an additional expense being provided by the  
14. Department of Public Aid to provide this counseling?

15. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

16. Senator Chew.

17. SENATOR CHEW:

18. No, Senator. The...the counselors are presently  
19. employed with the department, so it's not any additional  
20. cost at all to the State. It's just that the management  
21. sometimes would find it necessary, but these people  
22. are already with the department. It doesn't have any  
23. cost involved at all.

24. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

25. Senator Demuzio.

26. SENATOR DEMUZIO:

27. My next question is then, why aren't they doing  
28. it now?

29. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

30. Senator Chew.

31. SENATOR CHEW:

32. Senator, you have to have a Statute to give them  
33. the authority. You see, they can't pay the money and  
34. then in turn manage...manage it on their own. They're

1. authorized to pay it, so they have to be authorized to  
2. management if this arises. That's why it's not being  
3. done now.

4. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

5. Senator Demuzio.

6. SENATOR DEMUZIO:

7. Is this a department bill?

8. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

9. Senator Chew.

10. SENATOR CHEW:

11. It's a bill that the department is not opposed  
12. to and it's a bill that the department is eager to  
13. work with. You see what we have, Senator, certain  
14. sections of this State, we have people that are receiving  
15. these checks for the children and instead of paying the  
16. obligations that the checks are sent for, they find  
17. themselves using it for other things that are not  
18. included in the payment, so the department will work  
19. with it, yes.

20. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

21. Senator Demuzio.

22. SENATOR DEMUZIO:

23. Just a statement to Senator Chew. I didn't know  
24. of any bills that you ever had that you had opposition  
25. from any group. Thank you.

26. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

27. Is there further debate? The question is shall  
28. House Bill 343 pass. Those in favor vote Aye. Those  
29. opposed vote Nay. The voting is open. (Machine cut-off)  
30. voted who wish? Have all voted who wish? Take the record.  
31. On that question the Ayes are 47, the Nays are none, 3  
32. Voting Present. House Bill 343 having received a consti-

3. (Secretary reads title of bill)

4. 3rd...1st reading of the bill.

5. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

6. Further business to come before the Senate? Point  
7. out...point out to the members of the Senate on the  
8. Calendar that the committee hearings, that the Committee  
9. Appropriations is to meet at 1:30, that is Appropria-  
10. tions II. For what purpose does Senator Chew arise?

11. SENATOR CHEW:

12. We will go right into the Committee on Transportation

14. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)
