25. and No. 5 calls for Journals to be printed reflecting
26. the actions of the Second Special Session. I would
27. move, Mr. President, that these five Senate Resolutions,
28. 1 through 5 of the Second Special Session, I would
29. move for their immediate consideration and adoption by
30. this Body.
