- 10. Well, you're...you're moving to resolve into Executive
- 11. Session...
- 12. SENATOR VADALABENE:
- 13. Yes.
- 14. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR VADALABENE)
- 15. You're heard the motion. Those in favor indicate by saying
- 16. Aye. Those opposed. The Ayes have it. We are now in Executive
- 17. Session. Senator Vadalabene.
- 18. SENATOR VADALABENE:
- 19. Yes, thank you, Mr. President and members of the Senate.
- 20. To be a member of the Guardianship and Mental Health Advocacy

- 8. error in the terms of expiration Mr. Bernardi's and Miss Reed's
- 9. terms should expire June 30th, 1981 instead of June 30, 1979 and
- 10. I want the record to show that this correction was made.

- 31. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)
- 32. Senator Rock.
- 33. SENATOR ROCK:

l. Thank you, Mr. President and Ladies and Gentlemen of the 2. I rise up...I rise in support of the motion to adopt the report of the Senate Rules Committee which is embodied, 3. 4. essentially, in the copy of the Senate Rules, which each 5. member has received and has had a couple of weeks to digest and discuss. The rules have been consolidated. Some that were 6. obsolete have been eliminated. So instead of...as last Session 7. having seventy-four in number we now are down to fifty-seven 8. in number and we have attempted, I think, to reflect the current 9. practice of the Senate with respect to the electronic voting 10. and some of the other nuances that have occurred since...since 11. the rules were first adopted many years ago. Unless there's 12. any discussion, I am proposing that we adopt these rules as 13. distributed for the permanent Senate Rules for the 81st General 14. Assembly and I recognize that some of the members have, in fact, 15. amendments they wish to propose and I think they deserve the 16. kind of discussion and frankly the kind of time to digest as 17. was given the substantive Body Rules themselves. So I would 18. propose to the membership and I've discussed it with the Minority 19. Leader that we discuss the proposed amendments to the Permanent 20. Rules at the earliestpossible time, yet allowing enough time for 21. a...some thoughtful consideration by the membership. So I would 22. propose that on Wednesday, March the 7th, when we return into 23. Session after the Joint Session with the House for the purpose 24. of receiving the Governor's budget recommendation that when we 25. come back on the afternoon of the 7th into Session we, at that 26. time, will consider the amendments. Senator Netsch has indicated 27. she has distributed some thirteen proposed amendments. 28. suggest that if any other member has amendments he wishes to 29. propose that they be distributed, hopefully, today certainly no 30. later than tomorrow so that the membership can have a chance to 31. read them and discuss them and digest them and be prepared to 32. argue and vote one way or the other next...next Wednesday. 33.

- 1. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)
- Senator Netsch.
- 3. SENATOR NETSCH:
- 4. Thank you, Mr. President. I...this procedure had been
- 5. suggested and I have probably, the largest number of amendments
- 6. pending. I think it is quite acceptable. I think it will give
- 7. the members a somewhat longer time to read and digest the various
- 8. proposed amendments. I would like to call and, as I understand
- 9. it then, Senator Rock, it...the agreed date for the consideration
- 10. of the amendments is March 7 following the Budget Message. Is
- 11. that correct?
- 12. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)
- 13. Senator Rock.
- 14. SENATOR ROCK:
- 15. That is correct and while we have the attention of the
- 16. membership, I might indicate that the Speaker and I received
- 17. this morning a request from the Governor's Office to have a
- 18. Joint Session of the General Assembly convene on Wednesday,
- 19. March 7 at the hour of noon. At the noon hour was the
- 20. Governor's request. The Speaker and I have acceded to that
- 21. as we always will and so I am proposing and when the Adjourn-
- 22. ment Resolution is offered, it will propose that when we leave
- 23. tomorrow we will return to Springfield on Wednesday, March the
- 24. 7th at the hour of eleven forty-five, which will give us time
- 25. to convene here and march upon the House as a Body.
- 26. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)
- 27. Senator Netsch.
- 28. SENATOR NETSCH:
- 29. Thank you. I would just add then, I would like to call
- 30. attention of the Senate members to the fact that among other
- 31. things a packet of some, I think it is ten to thirteen amend-
- 32. ments, has been distributed to your desks today. Those are
- 33. proposed amendments to the rules...to the Temporary Rules as

- 1. amended. I assume that the amendments that are being offered
- 2. now would be adopted and I've tried to take that into consider-
- 3. ation in drawing my proposed amendments. I would hope that you
- 4. would make sure that you find your copy of them and have a chance
- 5. to read them and I would, of course, be happy to answer any
- 6. questions before next Wednesday when we do, in fact, vote on
- 7. them. Thank you.
- 8. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)
- 9. Is there further discussion? The question is, shall the
- 10. Motion in Writing as put by Senator Rock...just a moment,
- 11. Senator Rock.
- 12. SENATOR ROCK:
- 13. I think a roll call is in order, Mr. President and I
- 14. would so request.
- 15. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)
- 16. The Chair was going to do that. Just a moment. Senator
- 17. Rhoads, for what purpose do you arise?
- 18. SENATOR RHOADS:
- 19. Thank you, Mr. President. A question on page 13 of the
- 20. book if Senator Rock can answer it?
- 21. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)
- 22. Senator Rock.
- 23. SENATOR RHOADS:
- 24. I haven't asked the question yet. Senator Rock, what is
- 25. your interpretation of the first paragraph under D?
- 26. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)
- 27. Senator Rock.
- 28. SENATOR ROCK:
- 29. Well, my understanding...when we met in the Rules Committee,
- 30. it...it was, frankly, kind of gone over in a cursory manner but
- 31. my understanding was that this was the old language and that there
- 32. was no...there was no substantive change.
- 33. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

- Senator Rhoads.
- 2. SENATOR RHOADS:
- 3. This simply doesn't comply with the...with the State
- 4. Constitution. I...I...we had three hours of Committee of the
- 5. Whole and debate on this subject. We had a...a record vote on it...
- 6. on the proposed change by Senator Netsch and yet here it...it
- 7. turns up in this report. I...I just like to know what...what
- 8. that vote meant?
- 9. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)
- 10. Senator Rock.
- 11. SENATOR ROCK:
- 12. Yes, Senator Netsch, I know also wishes to speak to it.
- 13. I will suggest to you that there does appear this is the old
- 14. language but there does appear and I think you are correct,
- 15. there does appear to be an inconsistency and I, along with
- 16. yourself will offer an amendment to that on March the 7th.
- 17. We had just in the Rules Committee considered leaving the old
- 18. language in once the formal vote on the question of ratification
- 19. ...once the will of the Body was submitted on the question of
- 20. ratification. There does appear to be an inconsistency with respect
- 21. to the vote requirement for the calling of a Constitutional
- 22. Convention.
- 23. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)
- 24. Senator Rhoads.
- 25. SENATOR RHOADS:
- 26. Well, I think the safest procedure if...if Senator Rock
- 27. would be agreeable, would be simply to divide the question and
- 28. remove Rule 6 at this time adopt the rest of the report and then
- 29. we can put Rule 6 in proper shape. So I would move to divide
- 30. the question, Mr. President.
- 31. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)
- 32. You've heard the question. Senator Shapiro, did you wish
- 33. the Floor? Senator Shapiro.

## l. SENATOR SHAPIRO:

2. Mr. President and Ladies and Gentlemen of the Senate. Even though it appears as though there may be a conflict between the 3. 4. two paragraphs, I think if you read the first paragraph very carefully you'll say...you'll notice that the word propose is 5. used. In the second paragraph it...the word...the important 6. word is ratify. So it would appear to me that the second 7. paragraph would hold precedence over the third in that an 8. actual ratification takes a three-fifths vote. Now I think 9. it's up to the Body to decide what the differences are between 10. proposing and ratifying and I think that's the only question. 11. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

Senator Netsch. 13.

Thank you. I wonder, Senator Rhoads, I had already caught 15. that and had called it to the attention of Dick Durbin and while I 16. am on a different side with respect to what the vote ought to 17. be, I think that first paragraph is superfuse and I would...I 18. would suggest, Senator Shapiro, that I think it really is mis-19. leading because this Body does not really have any legal authority 20. to propose an amendment to the United States Constitution. And 21. we could pass a resolution doing it but it's of absolutely no 22. use to anyone because it is not authorized by the United States 23. Constitution. The only thing the U.S. Constitution authorizes 24. this Body as a State Legislature to do is A, to ratify one 25. proposed by Congress or B, to pass a resolution calling on 26. Congress to call a Constitutional Convention for the purpose 27. of proposing one, both of which are covered in the second 28. paragraph. So that I think the first one doesn't really...it 29. theoretically could stand and be consistent with the second one, 30. but I think it tends to be confusing and misleading and it is my 31. own view that it ought to be removed and I will, if no one else 32. does it, Senator Rhoads, I will offer the amendment to do that

- and I guarantee that. I would ask you not to take Rule 6 out
- 2. right now because some of the amendments are based on the
- 3. amended Rule 6 and it would just mess the whole procedure up
- 4. a bit. Would you agree to that on that understanding?
- 5. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)
- Senator Rhoads.
- 7. SENATOR RHOADS:
- 8. Well, Senator Netsch, there were two resolutions before
- 9. the Senate last Session, one of which has been reintroduced by
- 10. Senator Lemke, which is a resolution under the terms of the
- 11. first paragraph of...of paragraph D here on page 13, which
- 12. requests Congress to convene a Constitutional Convention. Now
- 13. as I read that first paragraph I admit there is conflicting
- 14. language in the second paragraph but that would call for a
- 15. simple majority and on the same basis that I opposed your
- 16. motion, I would have to oppose this one because it is in
- 17. violation of the State Constitution. Now I don't see why we
- 18. couldn't divide the question and get Rule 6 redrafted in proper
- 19. form and then vote on it later. Maybe later today...I...so I
- 20. would have to renew my motion to divide the question.
- 21. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)
- 22. Senator Geo-Karis.
- 23. SENATOR GEO-KARIS:
- 24. Point of information, if I may direct it, please. If I
- 25. understand page 13 of Rule 6, D, Section D, actually I agree
- 26. with Senator Netsch, the first paragraph is ambiguous and
- 27. probably shouldn't be in there. I think if that paragraph
- 28. were stricken out and the second paragraph were in I think
- 29. we got all bases covered. I don't...I'm not opposing a
- 30. division so much to the question but I think we're taking time
- 31. that we can ill afford and all we need to do is strike out the
- 32. first paragraph under 6 D and then we will have the second
- 33. paragraph in, in line with what you passed last week.

- 1. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)
- Is there further discussion? Senator Rhoads.
- 3. SENATOR RHOADS:
- Would Senator Rock be acceptable to a motion to strike
- 5. merely paragraph D in Rule 6 and then we can get it redrafted
- 6. later? Then I would withdraw my motion to divide the question
- 7. and move to strike on the face...All right. Okay. Strike
- 8. the first paragraph under D on page 13 of Rule 6.
- 9. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)
- 10. I'm informed by the Parlimentarian that in order to do
- 11. what you request you would have to be...stick with the motion
- 12. that you had to divide the question and...and strike paragraph...
- 13. after...after the motion to divde the question is...is ruled
- 14. upon and...and probably given, then you would make the appropri-
- 15. ate motion to strike paragraph 1 of...paragraph D of Rule 6.
- 16. Senator Rhoads.
- 17. SENATOR RHOADS:
- 18. With that understanding that would be my procedure then if
- 19. it's acceptable to the President of the Senate.
- 20. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)
- 21. All right. Is there further dicussion? The question is,
- 22. shall the question be divided? Those in favor indicate by saying
- 23. Aye. Those opposed. The Ayes have it. The question will be
- 24. divided. Now the question is, shall the rules...shall the
- 25. report of the Rules Committee as presented by Senator Rock,
- 26. particularly paragraph D of Rule 6 be stricken? The question
- 27. will be restated. It should be the first paragraph of sub-
- 28. paragraph D of Rule 6. Those in...those in favor indicate by
- 29. saying Aye. Those opposed. The Ayes have it. Paragraph...
- 30. the first paragraph of subparagraph D of Rule 6 is hereby
- 31. stricken. Now to the main question, shall the...shall the
- 32. Senate adopt the report as amended for the rules of the Senate...
