18. Executive. All right, turn to page two on the Calendar.  
19. With leave of the Body we will go to the Order of Senate Bills on  
20. 2nd reading. On the Order of Senate Bills 2nd reading, Senate  
21. Bill 1484, read the bill, Mr. Secretary.  
22. ACTING SECRETARY: (MR. FERNANDES)  
23. Senate Bill 1484.  
24. (Secretary reads title of the bill)  
25. 2nd reading of the bill. The Committee on Appropriations offers  
26. one amendment.  
27. PRESIDENT:  
28. Senator Buzbee. If I can have the attention of the membership,  
29. we are dealing with Committee Amendment No. 1 offered to Senate  
30. Bill 1484, Senator Buzbee.  
31. SENATOR BUZBEE:  
32. Thank you, Mr. President. This amendment increases the transfer  
33. from contractual services to minor capital improvement projects in  
34. the Division of Administration from thirty-five thousand six hundred

1. to seventy-five thousand five hundred, that's no net increase...it  
2. adds 1.3 million to the Operation of Auto Line Item in the Division  
3. of State Police to cover a projected deficiency created by unparallel  
4. increase in the cost of gasoline. And it transfers sixty-five  
5. thousand dollars from civilian to sworn part of the Personal Services  
6. Line in the Division of Criminal Investigation with no net increase.  
7. I would, at this time,...move the amendment, but with the understand-  
8. ing that...the bill will go on to 3rd. Senator Regner...has agreed  
9. to bring it back tomorrow to reduce that gasoline cost. We are in  
10. our annual...contest with Dr. Mandeville...everybody knows the  
11. department needs 1.3 million dollars in additional funds to cover  
12. the increased cost of their gasoline to keep the State Troopers on  
13. the highway. But Dr. Mandeville is in a snit, and he refuses to  
14. sign the letter saying that "yes, we do need the 1.3 million."  
15. So, I guess we are going to have to let him snit awhile. We can  
16. hold his budget up and just refuse to pass it or something at some  
17. point in the future...He may, Senator Regner informs me, he may sign  
18. a letter agreeing to nine hundred thousand, but not to 1.3 million.  
19. I hope at some point or another that Governor Thompson indicates to  
20. Dr. Mandeville that he, one James Thompson is, in fact, the Governor  
21. of this State, and not one Bob Mandeville. At that point, maybe we  
22. can get some things straightened out and go on with the operation  
23. of the people's business. But as long as we have the surrogate  
24. Governor...in the form of Dr. Mandeville, we are going to continue  
25. to have these problems. So...the way things stand right now, it is  
26. my intention to cut that four hundred thousand dollars tomorrow, if  
27. he will not sign the letter, and...we'll see what happens then with  
28. the State Troopers...so I would move the adoption of this amend-  
29. ment, Mr. President.

30. PRESIDENT:

31. All right, Senator Buzbee has moved the adoption of Committee  
32. Amendment No. 1 to Senate Bill 1484. Is there any discussion?  
33. Senator Regner.

1. SENATOR REGNER:

2. Yes, Mr. President and members. I would just like to reiterate  
3. what Senator Buzbee said. We met just before the...Session started  
4. and discussed this whole matter; and as most of the members here  
5. know, last year when we talked about...at this time of year what  
6. would happen to the price of gasoline and what monies would be  
7. generated on sales tax, we were proven at the end of the Session  
8. that we were right; Mr. Mandeville was wrong, as he has been many  
9. many times in the past, and I would concur with what Senator Buzbee  
10. says. We will adopt this amendment, move the bill on to 3rd  
11. reading, and discuss it further with Mr. Mandeville and his brain  
12. trusts.

14. All right. Senator Buzbee has move for the adoption of  
15. amendment...Committee Amendment No. 1 to Senate Bill 1484. Any  
16. further discussion? If not, all in favor signify by saying Aye.

1. SENATOR BUZBEE:

2. Thank you, Mr. President. This is a Department Amendment. It  
3. reduces the FY-80 supplemental request for the Division of Meat,  
4. Poultry and Livestock Inspection. The department originally expected  
5. to need additional funds to absorb the Chicago Meat Inspection  
6. Program; however, the department finds it no longer requires additional  
7. Personal Services dollar, and other associated costs still remain.  
8. It is a reduction of two hundred fifty-two thousand dollars from  
9. their supplemental appropriation, and I would move its adoption.

10. PRESIDENT:

11. Senator Buzbee has moved the adoption of Committee Amendment  
12. No. 1 to Senate Bill 1498. Any discussion? If not, all in favor  
13. signify by saying Aye. All opposed. The Ayes have it. The  
14. amendment is adopted. Further amendments?

32. city...and the interment will be after at the Jacksonville Cemetery.  
33. Now, Mr. President, I would...if there are no other announcements...

34. PRESIDENT:

1. Senator Mitchler has a constituent that he wishes us to meet,  
2. and then we will adjourn summarily until noon tomorrow. Senator  
3. Mitchler, for what purpose do you arise?

4. SENATOR MITCHLER:

5. Mr. President and Members of the Senate, Senate Joint  
6. Resolution 91 was introduced today and has been referred to the  
7. Executive Committee. Actually, this resolution replaces Senate...  
8. Joint Resolution 52, which is now in the Executive Committee set  
9. for a hearing tomorrow morning at nine-thirty. So, I would like  
10. to, at this time, make a motion to discharge the Senate Executive  
11. Committee from hearing Senate Joint Resolution 52 for the purpose  
12. of Tabling Senate Joint Resolution 52, after which I will make a  
13. motion that Senate Joint Resolution 91 resting in the Executive  
14. Committee be set for a hearing tomorrow morning at nine-thirty and  
15. have the Six-Day-Rule waived. They both relate to the same specific  
16. subject. The language has been brought up to date.

17. PRESIDENT:

18. All right, the motion is to waive the Six-Day-posting require-  
19. ment with respect to Senate Joint Resolution 91, so that it can be  
20. heard in Executive tomorrow at nine-thirty. Is leave granted?
