29. to switch lead sponsors on Senate Bill 788. Is leave granted?

32. SENATOR GEO-KARIS:
33. I have cleared it with the sponsor of Senate Bills 206

1. and 208 and if I may have the leave of this Senate, Mr. President,
2. I would like to be added as a cosponsor to Senate Bills 206 and
3. 208.

6. is granted. So ordered. Senator Knuppel, for what purpose

8. SENATOR KNUPPEL:

9. I'd like to make a motion to discharge the committee

11. and 535. They're different committees, so that I may Table the

24. 535, for the purpose of Tabling. All those in favor signify
25. by saying Aye. All those opposed. The Ayes have it. The bill

28. Ayes have it. The bill is Tabled. What's the other one, Senator?

1. of Senate Bill 928 for the purpose of Tabling. All those in
2. favor signify by saying Aye. All those opposed. The Ayes
3. have it. Senate Bill 928 is discharged. Senator Knuppel now
4. moves to Table Senate Bill 928. All those in favor signify
5. by saying Aye. All opposed. The Ayes have it. The bill is
6. Tabled. Senator Regner, for what purpose do you arise?

8. Mr. President and members of the Senate. I'd like leave
9. to be added as a cosponsor of Senate Bill 73. I have discussed
10. it with the chief sponsor.
