

Amendment No. 2 6. is added to this bill in the same Section of rate making to 7. clarify for the Commerce Commission a practice which basically 8. is taking place today. This amendment is on advertising, and it 9. has been distributed to the membership. I would urge you to 10. note that this amendment takes due note of the fact that there 11. are legitimate advertising purposes, it confers upon the Commerce 12. Commission statutory authority to verify, oftentimes what they 13. do today. It has one additional feature, which I think is 14. quite important. It would allow as part of the rate making 15. process, certain kinds of public interest advertising. Specifically, 16. in the area of energy conservation. I think that this is a 17. worthy amendment. I think that it is carefully drawn, and it 18. would resolve some of the problems and conflicts that the Commerce 19. Commission Chairman last year in the Agriculture, Energy, and 20. Conservation Committee indicated when they had their own bill 21. in, which in part dealt with this. I'm referring to a bill that 22. was originally offered by Senator Bloom. 23.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

SENATOR NIMROD: 26.

Mr. President, I have just had a chance now to look this amendment. I had not seen it before and I don't take any issue with what is attempting to be done. I think that, however, that it ought to be done in a separate bill, because it certainly is independent of what the intent of Senate Bill 1813 is. Senate Bill 1813 is intended to promote the use of Illinois coal, and all it does, is it urges the Commerce Commission itself to take into consideration those considerations on emission control equipment

that they, in fact, are adding, they ought to include into the 1. 2. cost. I think to add this particular amendment would introduce a whole new factor and in effect the very cause of what we are trying 3. to do, and that is promote the use of Illinois coal. So, I would 4. certainly have to at this time, take opposition to this amendment 5. and say it ought to be done at a separate time, with a separate 6. bill. I'm sorry that the sponsor didn't discuss this with me 7. ahead of time, I would have conveyed that to him, but I just think 8. that it's... it does not help the bill in any way. This is an idea that the Agriculture, Conservation, and Energy Committee has wrestled with for quite some time, but, in fact, it was not even brought to the Argiculture, Conservation, and Energy Committee this year. It's something that we ought to have a chance to look at. It's certainly...

1. it does not fall into the category of emergency things which 2. we ought to consider this year. The bill that was drawn, and introduced by Senator Nimrod has a specific purpose. We did 3. hear the arguments related to that, and they did come out of the 4. committee unanimously. I think it would be unwise to mar this 5. piece of legislation with what is really an additional issue, 6. and I would urge a negative vote on this amendment. 7. Well, Mr. President, and members of the Senate. This issue 11. did come before the Agriculture, Energy, and Conservation Committee 12. and it was tied in committee, and it seems kind of peculiar 13. that every time there is any kind of legislation there, that 14. is trying to protect the consumers'interest a little bit, that 15. legislation meets with a rather painful death, immediately. Now, 16. there are a lot of issues to be discussed in construction rates 17. and progress in that allowance, but if we're going to do this 18. for pollution control equipment, and if we're going to allow 19. all these guidelines for pollution control equipment, and I think that 20. that's a legitimate cause, then we ought to be able to put 21. in the statutory authority which would also make some sense 22. in terms of advertising. I'm sure that there are very few 23. people in this Body who have not turned on the television set 24. and seen a nice television spot by Commonwealth Edison. Now, 25. I don't begrudge them that, but if they want to advertise on 26. that basis, not relating to energy conservation, then they 27. ought to do that at the shareholders' expense and not the rate 28. payer. Now, I find it kind of ironic that we are amending the 29. very section on the rate making procedures. This is not a different 30. section within the Commerce Commission Act, it's the very same 31. section, and you know, and I know what's going to happen if this 32. amendment is defeated, than you'll go back and pat yourselves on 33. the back, the bill will go through, we'll do something for coal

1. allegedly, for the pollution control devices, we still won't have statutory authority there to deal with advertising when 2. it's challenged. It's the identical section, it's a smoke 3. screen. I think this amendment is a worthy amendment, it should 4. be added, because I think it's important we also do something 5. for the rate payer, the consumer. You know, Commonwealth Edison 6. got an eighteen percent rate hike in Northern Illinois to finance 7. nuclear facilities, which... are probably going to have when they're 8. finished, fifty percent excess capacity. They advertise at the ۹. same time that they don't have enough money then, and they're 10. back in for another increase. Well, let's look at how some 11. of that money is spent, and let's make sure that we have some 12. reasonable guidelines. This is not barndoor legislation, that 13. opens the vat, it's very carefully drawn, they have the latitude 14. to set reasonable quidelines. I can't think of a more reasonable 15. away to approach this than the way this has been drawn. I urge 16. an Ave vote. 17.


